The vote of thanks ceremony of the 69th Republic Day celebrations was held at the parade ground of 1st Battalion Manipur Rifles. Chief Minister Shri N. Biren Singh in his address said that the new Government will maintain and continue the hard earned tranquillity in the State. To promote equal development in all parts of the State, the Government has directed all the DCs, SDOs, BDOs and SDCs to station and function at their respective place of the posting, he added.

At places lacking suitable Government quarters and vehicles, the officials may opt for alternative arrangement and stay at rented houses and vehicles. Government will reimburse all the expenses incurred. Shri N. Biren also asked the concerned authority to repair the dilapidated office buildings as well. The Chief Minister also cautioned that officials failing to comply with the Government directive will face action as per the Government Rules.

Appealing to the armed groups to shun violence and come to the negotiating table for a political solution, the Chief Minister said all differences misunderstandings can be resolved amicably through talks.

Expressing serious concern over widespread poppy and cannabis plantation at different parts of the State, the Chief Minister asked the DCs, SPs and SDOs concerned to destroy all these plants within the month of March with the help of NAB, police and paramilitary forces. Imphal, Jan. 27: On the occasion of 69th Republic Day celebration, Chief Minister N. Biren Singh hoisted a monumental National flag measuring 30 ft by 20 ft on a 100-ft mast at Imphal Airport complex on the nation's Republic Day. The mast has operational

lights on the top and the flag would be illuminated with flood lights so that it is clearly visible at night.

Speaking at the occasion, the Chief Minister announced that a flag of similar size and height would also be installed at Civil Secretariat Complex, Mantripukhri after its

inauguration.

1 the 26 Kanglapat, Minister Shyamkumar lauded the 26 Assam Rifles stationed at Thoubal for seizing 16 trucks loaded with timbers and said due to shortage of staff especially the frontline staff, the Forest Department is seeking help from the security forces. He said the department on 18th May, 2017 had written a letter to all the security forces including Army and Paramilitary in the State to help

the department. Security forces were requested to detain trucks carrying timbers without transit pass or watermark which are machine numbered by the department. The security forces were asked to hand over the seized trucks



to the nearest Forest office, he said. He stated that most of the forest products are smuggled during the night time without the permission of

Forest Management Committee taking advantage of the hilly terrain with porous border in the interior areas of the State

He stated that the committed Forest Department officials are working hard to save the forest and wildlife products of the State. He further said as a commitment to save the environment, he along with the Forest officials have been conducting forest inspection

tour in districts like the recently concluded tour of Henglep sub-division in Churachandpur district and Indo-Myanmar border in

Welcoming the report published in a local daily, Th.
Shyamkumar opined that more thorough research would have highlighted important facts. He said the seizure of 16 truckloads of illegal timbers was carried out after all the security forces in the State were intimated by the Forest Department in May last year to seize trucks carrying timbers without transit pass. department will send a proposal to the Centre for establishing a Forest Protection Force to combat illegal smuggling of forest and wildlife products. Stating that the Chief Minister will be discussed over the matter, he hoped that the establishment of Forest Protection Force will enable the department to curb the menace. Appealing to the general public including media to help in combating the problem, he said the Forest department is also checking areas where poppy and other illegal plants are planted after clearing the forest land.

He said that Forest Department is planting saplings, harvesting and granting legal permission to cut trees following the guidelines. He said as part of saving the environment, the Horticulture Department will plant fruit bearing trees in the areas where the forest lands have been cleared.
