The dream of 'New India' will be realised with the vision of a 'New North East': HM

The Union Home Minister Shri Rajnath Singh has said the road to 'New India' will go through a developed and peaceful 'New North East'. Addressing the concluding session during the 67th Plenary Session of the NEC in Shillong yesterday, he said the Prime Minister Narendra Modi has a dream of New India by 2022. The dream of 'New India' will be realised with the vision of a 'New North East', he added. The Home Minister said the 'New North East' will emerge with better Road Connectivity and Information Technology. "The North East needs better Road Connectivity and it has recently made some progress in this area. The economic potential of the region will be realised with better connectivity," said Shri Rajnath Singh. "If we can provide quality broadband services in the region the youth of the North East will find the employment opportunities closer to their home. It would also stop the migration of local youth to distant areas of the country," he added. The Union Home Minister said the ITIs and Polytechnic



Institutes should play a role in Skill Development. "NEC should also consider setting up the Regional Institute for Skill Development," he said. Shri Rajnath Singh said impetus to employment and income generation will help contain the problems like insurgency in the North Eastern Region (NER). "The North-Eastern states need to create a conducive environment for private investments which should make the investors feel safe and their problems are addressed. It will give a big

boost to investments," he said. The Union Home Minister also stressed on accelerating growth of Agriculture to achieve the Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi's dream of doubling the farmers' income by 2022. "We should focus on growing low volume-high value crops for export. Railway Ministry can help in exporting the perishable commodities and horticulture produce like kiwis and flowers through superfast AC wagons." He suggested the revival of

North Eastern Regional Agricultural Marketing Corporation Limited (NERAMAC) for marketing of agriculture produce. "The North Eastern Region Community Resource Management Project (NERCORMP) with the Self Help Groups can extend help in this effort to increase the income and employment generation in the region." Shri Rajnath Singh assured Centre's support to the North Eastern states in improving Police infrastructure. "The North Eastern states should

capitalise on the prevailing peaceful scenario to improve the law and order situation and strengthen policing in the region." The Union Home Minister said each of the North Eastern States is blessed with unique development potential. "We need to identify those specific development areas and chalk out a plan with effective implementation. The implementation should be in a time bound manner," said Shri Rajnath Singh. "We need to prevent leakages in the system and ensure total transparency and accountability. I urge the Chief Ministers of all North Eastern states to work towards this end with missionary zeal," he added. The two-day 67th Plenary of the NEC was attended by the Union Minister of State (Independent Charge) for Development of North Eastern Region (DoNER), MoS PMO, Personnel, Public Grievances & Pensions, Atomic Energy and Space, Dr Jitendra Singh, who is also the Vice-Chairman of the NEC, besides Governors and Chief Ministers and senior officers of the eight North-Eastern states and Union Ministry of DoNER.

Assam Rifles apprehends gangsters

Assam Rifles seizes gold worth Rs 19.92 lakhs

Tengnoupal Battalion of 26 Sector Assam Rifles under the aegis of HQ IGAR (South) apprehended one gold smuggler carrying 04 gold biscuits weighing 664 grams worth approximately Rs 19.92 lakhs from Permanent Vehicle Check Post (PVCP), Khudengthabi. On 10 July 2018, at around 1315 hours, based on specific input received from reliable source, regarding smuggling of gold from Moreh to Imphal, a Silver Colour Maruti Van bearing Regd No MN 06L

9255 was stopped for checking at PVCP, Khudengthabi. While frisking and carrying out thorough checking of the baggage at Ladies Check Point, 04 gold biscuits weighing approximately 664 grams were found inside the purse of one of the women passengers. Tinlam, aged 37 years, w/o S Jankhonjang Haokip, r/o vill Chavanghai Veng, Tuinom Part 2 Moreh, Dist-Tengnoupal was apprehended while smuggling the gold. Recovered gold biscuits alongwith the apprehendee were handed over to Custom Preventive Force, Moreh.

'Khungung Chatse - Go To Village' held with zeal across the state

The 7th phase of 'Khungung Chatse - Go To Village' (GTV) Mission aimed at identifying the eligible and deserving beneficiaries in every corner of the state and delivering government services at their doorstep was held yesterday with maximum participation from the people.

The District Administration Ukhrul organised two GTV Mission camps at Nungshong for 12- Choithar DCC, Ukhrul Sub- Division, and Hoomi village for 12 - Kachai DCC under LM Sub-Division with various line departments present today. At Nungshong Khullen village, Dr. Harmit Singh Pahuja, Deputy Commissioner led the camp with various line department representatives. At Hoomi camp, Hon'ble MLA, Chingai AC Shri Khashim Vashum led the function in the presence of ADC Members Shri Mashungam, Shri Kapangpam Zimik, Shri Thanchipem Jagoi, and Shri Thuingahan Pheirim, DLOs and various village authorities. The villagers were provided monetary benefits, GI sheets, threads for weavers, tarpaulins, LPG connections for the widows. Domicile, Income certificates, forms of pensions for widows and old age, Agro based materials, tree saplings and medicines and medical checkup among other services. All together more than 20 administrative line departments each participated at both the site of the camps.

The District Administration Kamjong organised GTV Mission camp at Lungphu Village, Phungyar Sub-Division. The programme was held with Hon'ble MLA, Shri K. Leishiyi, 43-Phungyar (ST) AC as Chief Guest and Shri Somiyar Awungshi, Member 21-Shingap DCC, ADC, Ukhrul as Guest of

Honour. The Sub-Divisional Officer, Phungyar Shri K.G. Daigong delivered the introductory speech on the importance, significance and the idea behind the mission. The Sub-Deputy Collector, Phungyar Sub-Division Smt. Kasar Chonchui hosted the programme. Each line Department representatives interacted with the public. Hon'ble MLA distributed relief materials and housing Materials to the villagers covered under the DCC. Hon'ble MLA, 43-Phungyar (ST) AC, 18-ADC Member and SDO, Phungyar planted a tree each provided by the Forest Department at the village. 13 neighbouring villages participated with 171 people from these villages attending the programme.

Some of the government departments taking part and explaining the benefits of government schemes and projects to the people were DSWO, MSPDCL, CAF&PD,

Forest, Horticulture, PHED, Ujala, Bank, Aadhar, Labour, CSC, Biometric, Fishery, DIC, Handloom, Veterinary, Medical, PWD and SDO/BDO/PO. More than 500 people attended the program today.
