Revisiting Emergency of 1975, Yes today is the 43rd anniversary

Today is the 43rd anniversary of the Emergency, The then Prime Minister Indira Gandhi imposed Emergency on the midnight of June 25th, 1975. Civil liberties were suspended and lakhs of people were put behind the bar across the country. Media was also censored. In her address to the nation, Mrs.

Gandhi said the president has proclaimed national emergency. The days before the imposition of emergency, Mrs Gandhi's election was declared null and void by Allahabad High Court on a petition by socialist leader Raj Narain and she was unseated from her Lok Sabha seat. The court also banned her from contesting in any election for next six years.

Mr Narain who was defeated by Indira Gandhi in the Rae Bareilly

parliamentary constituency of Uttar Pradesh had challenged her election on charges of corruption in the election

Socialist Jayaprakash Narayan had been organizing campaign in Bihar to oust Indira Gandhi and her Congress party from

On the evening of June 25th 1975, Jay Prakash Narayan called for a civil disobedience campaign to force the resignation of Mrs Gandhi.

In response, the authority of the maintenance of Internal Security Act was used in the early hours of 26th June and an era of repression of political opponents began which continued till early part of 1977 when the fresh elections for Lok

Government proposes to set up 3000 Van Dhan Kendras involving 30,000 SHGs across the country



New Delhi, June 25.

The Government proposes to set up 3000 Van Dhan Kendras involving 30,000 SHGs across the country under the Van Dhan Scheme of the Ministry of Tribal Affairs. In a new game changing initiative, the Prime Minister launched the Van Dhan Scheme of Mir of Tribal Affairs and TRIFED on 14th April, 2018 during the celebrations of Ambedkar Jayanti at Bijapur Chattisgarh. Emphasizing the important role of value addition in increasing tribal incomes, the Prime Minister stated that Van Dhan, Jandhan and Goverdhan Schemes had the potential to change the tribalrural economic system. All these three schemes in tandem need to be promoted for this purpose by the State

Under Van Dhan Scheme, 10 Self Help Groups of 30 Tribal gatherers each have been constituted at Bijapur, Chhattisgarh. They are then trained and provided with working capital to add value to the products, which they collect from the Jungle Working under th

leadership of Collector, these groups can then market their products not only within the States but also outside the States. Training and technical support is provided by TRIFED.

Van Dhan Mission is an initiative for targeting livelihood generation for tribals by harnessing non-timber forest produces, the true wealth of forest i.e. Van Dhan with an estimated value: Rs.2 Lakh Cr. per year. It shall promote and leverage the collective strength of tribals (through SHGs) to achieve scale. It also aims at build upon the traditional knowledge & skill sets of tribals by adding technology & IT for value addition. Further it is to set-up tribal community owned Van Dhan Vikas Kendras (the Kendra) in predominantly forested tribal districts. A Kendra shall constitute of 10 tribal SHGs, each comprising of upto 30 tribal NTFP gatherers or artisans i.e. about 300 beneficiaries per Kendra.

Value addition assumes ensuring remunerative prices to the tribals in this approach. Three stage value addition

would be the corner stone for enhancing incomes of the tribals under the scheme. The grass root level procurement is proposed to be undertaken through SHGs associated with Implementing Agencies.

Convergence and Networking with other Govt. departments/scheme shall be undertaken to utilise the services of existing SHGs like Aieevika, etc. These SHGs shall be appropriately trained on sustainable harvesting/ collection, primary processing & value addition and be formed into clusters so as to aggregate their stock in tradable quantity and linking them with facility of primary processing in a Van Dhan Vikas Kendra. Talking about the new

nitiative, the Union Minister for Tribal Affairs, Shri JualOram said that the scheme has a huge potential to empower the tribals. The Minister said that

SC to hear disqualified AIADMK MLAs' plea seeking transfer of case from Madras HC

The Supreme Court has agreed to hear on Wednesday a plea filed by 18 disqualified MLAs of Tamil Nadu's ruling party, the All India Anna Dravida Munnetra Kazhagam, PTI reported on Monday. The MLAs sought to transfer their case from the Madras High Court to the Supreme Court after the lower court delivered a split verdict.

A vacation bench of Justices Arun Mishra and S K Kaul will hear the plea on Wednesday. Senior advocate Vikas Singh appearing for the 18 MLAs, said it was a serious matter that needs an urgent hearing as a judge of the Madras High Court is scheduled to hear the matter afresh.

The Madras High Court on June 18 appointed Justice S Vimala to hear the pleas against the disqualification of the rebel MLAs after two judges gave a split verdict on June 14. Chief Justice Indira

Banerjee had upheld the disqualification, while Justice M Sundar disagreed. In September 2017, Tamil Nadu

Assembly Speaker P Dhanapal disqualified 18 MLAs of the AIADMK after they supported ousted party leader TTV Dinakaran. Their disqualification brought the Assembly's effective strength down to 215 and the half-way mark to 108. If the MLAs are mark to 108. If the MLAs are reinstated, the AIADMK government headed by Chief Minister Edappadi K Palaniswami could collapse. The 18 MLAs are now supporting TTV Dinakaran, who has formed his own political outfit, the Amma Makkal Munnetra Kazhagam. He had won the RK Nagar bye-

Supreme Court notifies new roster for judges

The Supreme Court has notified a new roster for the allocation of cases to the judges, which will come into effect from July 2 when the top court reopens after summer vacation.

The new roster which was released vesterday said that the bench headed Chief Justice of India Dipak Misra will hear all public interest litigations, besides pleas relating to social justice, elections, habeas corpus and

contempt of court.

Justice Ranjan Gogoi, who is the senior-most judge after the Chief Justice following the retirement of Justice Chelameswar on June 22, will deal with labour laws, indirect taxes, personal law and

company law cases.
The roster was put in the public domain for the first time on February 1.
The notification lists the

matters that will be heard by benches headed by the chief justice and 10 other judges.
