

## AR personnel injured in twin blasts in Nagaland

Kohima, June 29,

An Assam Rifles jawan was injured in twin IED blasts triggered by NSCN (K) insurgents in Phek district of Nagaland, an officer of the paramilitary force said. The blasts took place near Akhegwo village when a road opening party of the paramilitary force was providing security for the passage of an Assam Rifles convoy at 3 pm yesterday, he said.

The Assam Rifles jawan suffered splinter injuries on his chest and leg in the blasts, which took place within a gap of some time, he said. He was immediately evacuated to the Army Hospital in Jorhat, where his condition is stated to be stable, he said. The Assam Rifles convoy was coming from Kiphire district. The NSCN(K), in a statement, has claimed responsibility for the blasts. Two Assam Rifles personnel were killed and four others suffered injuries in an ambush by insurgents of the same outfit near Aboi in Mon district on June 17.

## Rajnath approves 'Home Minister's Special Operation Medal' for police

Union Home Ministry has instituted new medals in the special operations category for meritorious officers in police, security and intelligence services. The medals are meant for special operations, Intelligence category and will be awarded on Independence Day and Republic Day annually.

"Union Home Minister Rajnath Singh has approved the institution of 'Home Minister's Special Operation Medal'. Police Officers of States & Union Territories,

Central Police Organisations (CPOs), Central Armed Police Forces (CAPFs) and Security Organisation involved in Special Operations will be eligible," said the MHA statement.

"The Union Home Minister has also instituted three more Medals, — the Antarik Suraksha Medal, Asadharan Aashuchan Padak, and Utkrishat & Ati-Utkrishat Seva Medal.

The Medals will be awarded annually; while the HM's Special Operation Medal and Asadharan Aashuchan Padak will be awarded on 15th August coinciding with the Independence Day, the

Antarik Suraksha Medal and Utkrishat & Ati-Utkrishat Seva Medal will be announced on 26th January to mark the Republic Day.

The Asadharan Aashuchan Padak will be given to officials of Intelligence organization of Central and State Governments, Assam Rifles and NSG.

The Antarik Suraksha Medal will be bestowed upon Police personnel of States and central police forces engaged in the operation duty rendered by them for a tenure of every two years in Internal Security in Jammu & Kashmir State, Maoist affected areas North Eastern States.

The prime minister, who laid the foundation stone for the National Centre for Ageing at the AIIMS today, said the Centre along with state government is trying to build infrastructure for modern healthcare to benefit the poor and the middle class of the country. and a 'connection motorable tunnel' between AIIMS, Ansari Nagar and the Trauma Centre. Yesterday, PM Modi addressed a gathering at Maghar in Sant Kabir Nagar district in Uttar Pradesh. He also inaugurated a two-day Kabir Mahotsav organised by the Union Ministry of Culture at Maghar. The festival was organised to mark the 500th death anniversary of mystic poet and saint, Kabir Das.

## Inter-Korean ties crucial for nuclear diplomacy, says South Korea

Seoul, June 29,

South Korean President Moon Jae-in has said progress in inter-Korean relations will be crucial because the North won't give up its nuclear program unless it feels its security is assured. (Reuters File photo)

South Korea's point man for inter-Korean affairs on Friday said Seoul will try to facilitate civilian-level exchanges with North Korea in coming months to strengthen the conciliation process between the rivals. Unification Minister Cho Myoung-gyon said strengthened relations between the Koreans will increase the chances of successful nuclear diplomacy between Washington and Pyongyang.

Pompeo says sanctions stay on North Korea for now South Korean President Moon Jae-in, in a meeting with Mike Pompeo, says the world had escaped the threat of war after this week's Singapore summit, echoing U.S. President Donald Trump's upbeat assessment of his meeting with North Korean leader Kim Jong Un.

"(Our) government will closely communicate and cooperate with North Korea and the United States, all our neighboring countries, and the entire international community so that the agreements between North Korea and the United States could be quickly and completely carried out," Cho said at a Seoul forum co-

saying that the progress in inter-Korean projects will depend on whether appropriate "conditions are created."

South Korean President Moon Jae-in has said progress in inter-Korean relations will be crucial because the North won't give up its nuclear program unless it feels its security is assured. Moon met with North Korean leader Kim Jong Un in April and May and their summits have opened various channels of peace talks, including ongoing military talks for reducing border tensions, Red Cross talks that set up temporary reunions between war-separated relatives, and sports talks that led to an agreement to field combined teams at the Asian Games in August.

Kim met with President Donald Trump earlier this month in Singapore where they issued an aspirational goal for a denuclearized Korean Peninsula without describing when and how it would occur. U.S. Secretary of State Mike Pompeo is expected to travel to North Korea soon for follow-up talks.

Cho said upcoming between Pompeo and senior North Korean officials will provide an opportunity to shape detailed plans for the "complete denuclearization of the Korean Peninsula and security guarantee for North Korea," which would help the wartime foes kick off a genuine peace process.
