

## Trucks carrying illegal sand seized at Sekmai

**Imphal, March 27:** Forest and Environment Minister Th. Shyamkumar today seized 9 trucks at Sekmai for illegally transporting sand from Dimapur. The truck drivers had not procured Transit Pass (TP) from the Forest Department, although one of the truck drivers was carrying TP issued from the Tadubi Forest Check Post.

Speaking to media persons, Minister Th. Shyamkumar said that the trucks were detained in the morning at Sekmai with the help of OC, Sekmai Police Station and his staff. He said the truck drivers informed him that they were not issued TP by the department officials at the Mao Forest Check Post citing confusion over the new rate of TP. Issuing TP to only one truck, the officials at Tadubi asked them to get the remaining TP from other check post, the drivers told the Minister.

Stating that the officials at Mao should have contacted the other Forest check post in case of confusion, Th. Shyamkumar said if the allegation is true than appropriate action will be taken against department



officials for neglecting their duty. He appealed to the department officials to conduct their duty sincerely and added that they should issue TP on forest products to collect royalty following the guidelines of the department. Later, the truck drivers were issued TP from the Sekmai Forest Check Post and released.

Forest Minister said that the Forest department is sincerely working to save environment, apart from collecting royalty on forest products. He said he will once again start checking whether the trees planted during the different plantation drives and Vanamahotsava

last year are being nurtured by the concerned officers. Cautioning the concerned officers that they will be held responsible if trees are not nurtured properly, he added that during his inspection so far, he came across that most of the concerned officers were satisfactorily nurturing the trees planted last year.

Visiting the Kanglatongbi Forest Beat Office, he informed the media persons that the department will start plantation drive in the monsoon season in May-June as a part to save the environment and to check global warming. For the purpose, around 20-30 lakh

saplings of different plant species are being developed at nurseries at different Forest offices of the State, he added. He said non-indigenous trees will be gradually replaced by the indigenous trees/plants having nutritional values, including fruit bearing trees, which are suitable to the climatic condition and soil of the State. Stating that the process has already begun, he said the result can be seen in the next 10 years. Forest Minister Th. Shyamkumar further appealed to every section of the society to support in preserving the environment of the State.

## Health Minister launches Ayush Sports medicine

**Imphal, March 27:** Health and Family Welfare Minister L. Jayantakumar Singh along with Youth Affairs & Sports Minister Letpao Haokip launched AYUSH Sports Medicine, today, at Indoor Stadium, Khuman Lampak, Imphal.

Gracing the launching function as the Chief Guest Minister Jayantakumar said that the time has come for integrated effort of selective departments for an augmented and more sophisticated venture. ## NIA raids JNIMS Director's office; check computer use by former director

**Imphal, March 27:** A team of National Investigation Agency (NIA) had raided the office of the JNIMS Director on March 23 afternoon and search the computer set used by former director Mutum Shyam who was under screening by the team in connection with the case of KCP (Poirei Meitei) leaders who were presently in their custody.

Details of what has been collected by the NIA team could not be ascertained but source said the NIA team had collected some data from the computer which might have some connection with the case.

On January 12, last year, Delhi Police Anti Terror Wing Special Cell arrested Khoiram Ranjit, commander in chief of KCP (Poirei) along with his lady associate Irungbam Sanatombi from a house located in East Delhi, Mayur Vihar area. Later, the NIA arrested another accused namely Sanabam Inaobi Singh, S/o Late Sanabam Tomal Singh, R/o Yambem Mathak Leikai, PO Yairipok, PS Andro, Distt Imphal East, Manipur on November 29, 2017 from New Delhi in connection with NIA Case No. RC-5/2017/NIA/DLI (KCP Case) dated 16.03.2017. A press statement by the NIA

had stated that he is a hard core member of KCP, a banned terrorist organization and is found involved in raising terror funds, supply of arms, ammunitions and explosives for KCP cadres.

Earlier on July 10, 2017, the NIA had filed a charge sheet against the commander in chief of KCP (Poirei) Khoiram Ranjit and two other individuals before the Special NIA Court, Patiala House, New Delhi, on July 10, 2017.

Since then the NIA team has been investigating over the case on the involvement of various people including the former Director of JNIMS. Mutum Shamo.

In his speech the Chairman highlighted on how the region has been occupied and suppressed by the colonial force for over 60 years. He said that India is showing its ego in the field of development and science and technology and also for being among the 6 countries which have nuclear science technology.
