Arguably the most powerful man in the country in terms of the executive power he wield is at our doorsteps today, and the public is hustled back indoors both by the uniformed security personnel manning every street, nook and corner of the state on one end and the conglomerate of proscribed armed groups on the other. A visit to the state by the prime minister is not something that happens on a regular basis, especially a long-marginalised region as the north east of India. Incidentally, these are the regions which are grappling with social, communal, ethnic, fiscal and law and order issues the most. However, in what can only be described as an encouraging

turnaround and positive development, the central government has started taking keen interest in the development activities of the state and has shown more than cursory interest in the social situation of the state. It would only be to the interest and benefit of the public of the state to support such an initiative.

But understanding and cooperation comes from a process of discussion and dialogue. "We need to develop new procedures, medicines, and vaccines to get rid of silent killers like Malaria and Japanese Encephalitis", Narendra Modi said. At the beginning of his speech, the Prime Minister paid tributes to three distinguished Indian scientists-Padma Vibhushan Prof Yashpal, Padma Vibhushan Prof UR Rao and Padma Shri DrBaldev Raj as well as renowned Physicist Stephen Hawking who had left for heavenly abode recently.

Loken today met the CEC Om Prakash Rawat at New Delhi. The Congress MLA said that the CEC had assured necessary procedures as per the constitution

of India. On Thursday, the Supreme Court held that the legislature cannot overrule judgments by amending a law retrospectively, saying this will amount to violation of the principle of separation of powers among the three organs of the state, which is impermissible.

Sending out a clear message to law-making bodies — Parliament and assemblies — that judicial

pronouncements must respected, a bench of Justices Madan B Lokur and Deepak Gupta said they were entitled to amend the law to remove defects pointed out in a judicial order but the new law could not be implemented retrospectively as it would amount to nullifying the judgment.

This comes in the aftermath of the passing of the Parliamentary Secretary Repeal Bill. The Bill is yet to be consented by the Governor of Manipur.
