

MeT dept issues warning of dust storm across north India

New Delhi, May 16,

The MeT department has issued a warning of dust storm across large parts of north India, including Delhi for the next 72 hours. The national capital was hit by a dust storm in the early hours today. According to the latest warning, thunderstorm accompanied by gusty winds with speed of 50 to 70 kms is very likely at isolated places over Jammu and Kashmir, Himachal Pradesh, Uttarakhand, Punjab, Haryana, Chandigarh, Delhi and Uttar Pradesh. Similar predictions have been made for tomorrow at isolated places over Punjab, Haryana, Chandigarh, Delhi and Uttar Pradesh. Police said an 18-year-old man was killed and 13 people injured in the dust storm that hit Delhi this morning. The Police Control Room received 78 calls during the storm that started around 3 AM. Meanwhile, the minimum temperature in the morning was recorded at 25 degrees Celsius. Light rain or drizzle is expected towards the evening.

Varanasi flyover collapse kills at least 15, authorities ascertain cause of mishap

A day after at least 15 people were killed as an under-construction flyover collapse in Varanasi on Tuesday, authorities said on Wednesday that an investigation to ascertain the cause of the mishap is underway. Refusing to divulge any details as of now, an official appointed by the Uttar Pradesh government said that any statement on the same would be made only after all records are checked and investigation is complete. Raj Pratap Singh, a member of the committee constituted by Yogi Adityanath government to probe the flyover collapse in the Lok Sabha constituency of Prime Minister Narendra Modi, said, "I can't say anything at this moment. Until we complete the investigation, talk to everyone concerned and check all the records, it won't be right to say anything." Varanasi district magistrate Yogeshwar Mishra said that all compensation will be given to the victims and their relatives



at the earliest. He told news agency ANI, "We are waiting for the findings that will come in investigation. I don't want to comment on anything right now. All compensation will be given to victims soon." Following the incident, Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath had announced ex-gratia for the affected families and met the victims at the Kabir Chaura Hospital late Tuesday night. A portion of the flyover near Varanasi's cantonment area railway station came down on several people - possibly labourers. Several vehicles, including a mini bus, got

crushed under the debris. An eyewitness of the incident said, "I was 50 meters away from where a portion of the flyover came down. Everyone around the area panicked and began screaming." Prime Minister Narendra Modi, during an address on Karnataka Assembly election results at BJP headquarters in New Delhi on Tuesday evening, had expressed grief over the loss of lives in the mishap. The Prime Minister said that he had talked to UP Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath over the issue and offered all help by the central government.

DU Admission 2018: Here's all you need to know about DU online registration

DU Admission 2018: Delhi University will start online registrations for admission to its undergraduate courses from 5 pm on Tuesday. Aspirants will get time to complete their application forms till June 7. This year, DU will announce only five cutoff lists with the last list coming out on July 12. Admissions under it will be completed by July 14. The university will conduct central counselling for remaining seats in the undergraduate courses after the fifth cutoff list.

"The online portal for registration will start from 5pm on Tuesday. Students will get 24 days to complete their application form," a DU official said. The official said students will be able to edit their forms till they make the payment. "The class 12 results for many boards are not yet out. Students can fill their details and upload the marks when the results are announced. They will get a text message confirming their registration. Our system will ensure there are no multiple registrations by the same student," the official said. This year, the university will

provide a single portal for applications for both merit-based and entrance-based admissions to undergraduate courses. Till 2017, the registration for entrance-based admissions was separate. "There will be two tabs on the same portal and a student can register for both or one of them. The student will have to make separate payment for both the forms," another DU official said. The online registration form will allow applicants applying under the sports quota to upload their three best certificates instead of one.

"The three certificates have to be uploaded as three separate documents," the statement said. DU aspirants can visit the university and attend 'Open Days' to get information related to the admission process. The university will hold 'Open Days' from May 21 to May 29 during which officials will address the students. The online registration for postgraduate and research courses will start from May 18 and May 20, respectively. The registration process for all programmes will be completely online for all categories and for all quota.

North Korea is dismantling its nuclear site, but is it abandoning its arsenal or hiding evidence?

Satellite imagery shows North Korea dismantling facilities at its nuclear test site, but experts say the images can't reveal whether it is the first step toward full denuclearisation, or an attempt to cloak nuclear capabilities from outside observers. North Korea's intentions were thrown further into doubt on Wednesday, when it abruptly announced it may "reconsider" meeting with U.S. President Donald Trump in June if the United States continues to insist on unilateral denuclearisation. Commercial satellite imagery - including photos taken by Planet Labs as recently as May 14 - show North Korea removing some structures around its nuclear test site at Punggye-ri, experts say. "So far it looks like the surface-level support structures are being dismantled," said Scott

LaFoy, an open source imagery analyst. "This would be consistent with the site being closed, as you need engineers and working teams on-site to prepare and maintain the site." Among the facilities that appear to have been razed are an engineering office, as well as buildings housing the air compressor used to pump air into the tunnels where the bombs were detonated, said non-proliferation expert Frank Pabian. "This is entirely in keeping with the official North Korean news report that 'technical measures' associated with the shutdown were underway," Pabian said. North Korea has said it plans to use explosives to collapse the tunnels; "completely" block up the tunnel entrances; and remove observation facilities, research institutes and guard structures. A limited number of foreign media have been invited to view the ceremonial closure of the site, but so far no

international inspectors, leading some experts to suspect that North Korea is seeking to hide details of its nuclear capabilities. "North Korea might seem like they're being generous in holding this event, but this is the actual testing ground we're talking about here - The smoking gun," said Suh Kune-yul, professor of nuclear energy system engineering at Seoul National University. "It seems like they're trying to erase any evidence of the nuclear capabilities they have." "SOME RED FLAGS" In a statement on Wednesday, North Korea's first vice minister of foreign affairs Kim Kye Gwan sharply criticized American officials - especially national security adviser John Bolton - for suggesting that Libya could be a template for denuclearising North Korea. Bolton has proposed Trump and North Korean leader Kim Jong Un make a deal similar to the one that led to components

of Libya's nuclear program being shipped to the United States in 2004. In 2011, Libyan leader Muammar Gaddafi was captured and killed by rebel forces backed by a NATO air campaign. While the technical aspects of a North Korea deal could mirror some aspects of the Libya effort, Pyongyang has a much more advanced weapons programme and Gaddafi's fate is not encouraging, Andreas Persbo, the executive director of VERTIC, a London think tank that focuses on disarmament verification and implementation, said in a recent interview. "Libya is a horrible example to make out of that perspective because of course the North Koreans have their own teams advising Kim Jong Un on what this meant, and they will highlight the fact that this is not a good solution for North Korea," he said.
