e-Way Bill system for intra-State movement of goods in the Maharashtra, Manipur and UTs

e-Way Bill system for inter-State movement of goods has been rolled out from April 1, as per decision of the GST Council, a PIB report said. The report further added that e-Way Bill system for intra-State movement of goods has been rolled out in the States of Andhra Pradesh, Arunachal Pradesh, Assam, Bihar, Gujarat, Haryana, Himachal Pradesh, Jharkhand,

Karnataka, Kerala, Madhya

Meghalaya,

Nagaland, Rajasthan, Sikkim, Telangana, Tripura, Uttarakhand, Uttar Pradesh and Union Territory of Puducherry on May 23.

E-Way Bills are getting generated successfully and till May 23 more than five crore and thirty lakh e-Way Bills have been successfully generated which includes more than one crore and sixty lakh e-Way Bills for intra-State movement of goods.

The GST Council has appealed the state of Maharashtra, Manipur, Andaman & Nicobar Islands,

Chandigarh, Dadra & Nagar Haveli, Daman & Diu and Lakshadweep to implement the -Way Bill system for intra-State movement of goods

Twenty seven States / Union Territories would have implemented the e-Way Bill system for intra-State movement of goods with the roll-out of the same on May 25 this year. Registration/enrolment on e-Way Bill portal namely https://www.ewaybillgst.gov.in may be taken at earliest in the remaining States as well since

the same would soon be rolled

out in these States also. The system is working smoothly and without any glitches. On an average twelve lakh e-way bills are being generated every day. Trade and industry may approach their respective tax authority for any guidance in this matter. Further, it is informed that trade should get well versed with respect to the provisions of the e-Way Bill rules in order to avoid any difficulty. The provisions of rule 138D of Central / State GST Rules, 2017 may be referred to for any grievance

Muslim Boy from Angry Mob in Ramnagar

Uttarakhand Cop Protects

A police inspector saved a Muslim boy from the wrath of a mob in Uttarakhand's Ramnagar, after he was allegedly found with a Hindu girl in a temple.

The couple met in a temple in

The couple met in a temple in Girija village, a sparsely populated region, where they were caught by a group of violent men

In a video that has now gone viral on social media, Sub-Inspector Gagandeep Single came to the boy's rescue, fearing the angry mob may lynch him to death. The video shows Gagandeep confronting the group of men all alone, while protecting the boy from those who were baying for his blood. Another

baying for his brood. Another police officer was seen three police officer was the police officer refused to hand over the boy, the group allegedly started chanting anti-police slogans. The group shut the gate of the temple and continuously tried

The protection that Gagandeep provided to the boy didn't go down well with the mob. The Lallantop, quoting witnesses, reported that the boy was sitting on the floor after being thrashed by the angry group of men, and the girl was arguing with them

When the girl asked a man why he had beaten up the boy, the man allegedly responded: "We will chop him to pieces. You are a Hindu and roaming around with a Mulsim man. I will chop

you too."
An officer from Ramnagar police station confirmed to The Quint that the incident had occurred on the said day. "Two boys and a girl were sitting inside the temple. Some of the other attendees and workers at the temple raised an objection. Sub-Inspector Gagandeep Singh happened to be there. He took control of the situation and rescued the boy from the spot," the officer said.

The police also said that they had contacted the families of the boy and the girl. "We called their families and handed them over."

The group had allegedly

roughed up the boy and one of his friends by the time police arrived at the scene.

The group also alleged that the couple was "getting intimate," but the police didn't say anything clearly about this allegation.

stake.

In Tripura, the indigenous population has been already reduced to a minority in its own space with little representation, no economic power and no social/community agency. It is also to be mentioned that the Indian government has come up with a bill (The Citizenship (Amendment) Bill, 2016) in its parliament which will give citizenship rights to all the foreigners from Bangladesh, Afghanistan, Pakistan, etc. who have migrated to the "Northeast" till now.

Truth be told, Manipur does not see the non-locals as merely non-locals, but as colonial settlers carrying out the project of colonizing the historical, geopolitical space of Manipur. It can't be said that Manipur, in years to come, will not be converted into a "Palestine of India," a gift of Indian "democracy".
