## Campaigning for final phase of Assembly elections in Chhattisgarh ends today; picks up momentum in Madhya Pradesh, Rajasthan, Mizoram & Telangana

New Delhi, Nov 18,

Campaigning for the second and final phase of Assembly elections in Chhattisgarh will end this evening. Polling will be held in 72 constituencies spread across 19 districts on Tuesday. Leaders of many political parties have been campaigning to woo the voters in their favours. Prime Minister Narendra Modi is scheduled to address an election rally

at Mahasamund today. BJP President Amit Shah and Congress Chief Rahul Gandhi addressed public meetings in the state yesterday. In the first phase of the Assembly elections, polling was held in 18 Maoist affected constituencies on 12th of this month. In Madhya Pradesh, major parties have stepped up campaigning for the Single phase Assembly elections on 28th of this month to elect 230

memberhouse. Prime Minister Narendra Modi, BJP President Amit Shah, Union Finance Minister Arun Jaitley, Uma Bharti and other senior leaders of the BJP will address election rallies at various places today, with Senior Congress leader Anand Sharma and SP leader Akhilesh Yadav are also scheduled to address rallies in the state. In Mizoram, as electioneering is gaining impetus with the

participation of political leaders, the Chief Electoral office is organising training programs for the polling officers as well as Block level staff. Our correspondent reports that the state is going to poll on 28th of this month to elect 40-member the Assembly. In Telangana, a total of 1497 nominations have been filed so far after 643 nominations filed yesterday alone to contest the Assembly

elections. The deadline for filing nominations will come to an end tomorrow. Out of the total nominations, Congress candidates filed 165 where as BJP candidates filed 142. TRS candidates filed 156 nominations while CPIM filed 36, TDP filed 32, MIM-8, and others and independents filed 870 nominations. Meanwhile, the Telangana Jana Samiti declared 4 names under the Praja Kutami (People's Alliance) from Malkajgiri, Medak,

Dubbaka and Siddipet constituencies. The TJS is fielding woman candidate, Bhavani Reddi from Siddipet where the acting Irrigation Minister Harish Rao is in contest. The TJS is yet to declare names from 4 constituencies whereas all major parties including Congress, BJP, TRS and TDP are yet to declare the candidates names from a couple of seats. The electioneering is picking up momentum across the state.
