

EC to audit electoral rolls in poll-bound states

Imphal Sept. 23,

The Election Commission of India (ECI) has decided to conduct a regulatory audit of poll-related activities such as those of electoral rolls in Madhya Pradesh, Chhattisgarh, Rajasthan and Mizoram.

Elections in these four states

are due this year-end. The EC in a letter to the Chief Electoral Officers of these states said, the detailed regulatory audit of election-related activities such as electoral rolls, polling stations and storage of electronic voting machines (EVMs) will be carried out. It said, an audit of the systematic voters' education and electoral participation or

SVEEP activities, and training of Booth Level Officers (BLOs) among others would be also conducted.

It also asked the Chief Electoral Officers to direct officers concerned to provide any clarification or information, which the teams may require as part of the audit immediately on the same day.

She confided that the Commission has been working towards streamlining NGOs and individuals running hostels and homes for children. She shared that during the visits to hostels and homes, she came across majority of the shelters are run for profit. According to her one awkward observation most prevalent in many of homes relates to keeping boys and girls together in crowded-single rooms. However, on paper the segregations are supposedly recorded. She heartily shared a success story in Manipur, which according to her is historical. In Manipur for the first time a child-friendly police station has been opened. This unit envisages to look after incidences related with children below the age of 18 years. Acts committed by children need sensitive approach and dealings as

they might not even know that certain acts constitute crime and are illegal. She believes the police station will go a long way in catering to the needs of the children.

She also urged the people of Manipur not to involve children in social and political issues. The Commission is underway to propose to the Government of Manipur to ban using children in rallies, agitations and other modes of strikes. Finally, she urged NGOs based in Manipur to get Corporate Social Responsibility (CSR) assistance from companies.

Dr. Shukhdeba Sharma, Member, Selection Committee, Child Welfare Committee & Juvenile Justice Board, Manipur and Head & Assistant Professor, Department of Social Work, Indira Gandhi National Tribal University, Regional Campus Manipur proposed the vote of thanks.
