Detention of foreigners: SC directs Assam Chief Secy to appear before it on April 8

The Supreme Court today voiced unhappiness over the inaction in a case relating to detention of foreigners in Assam and directed the state Chief Secretary to appear before it on 8th of this month. A bench headed by Chief Justice of India Ranjan Gogoi termed the

affidavit filed by the Assam government as an "exercise in futility" and wanted to know as to how many persons, who have been declared foreigners by the tribunal, have amalgamated with the local population. The bench was hearing a plea on the condition of detention centres in Assam and the prolonged detention of foreigners in the state.

Assam Rifles Conducts Paramedic Training In Kamjong Cum Water Reservoir In Kamjong District

In remote areas especially near Indo Myanmar border, lack of medical facilities and staff often results in delay in patient care thereby endangering patient's life. To address such healthcare challenges, Kamjong Battalion of Assam Rifles under the aegis of 10 Sector Assam Rifles and IGAR(South) organised a Paramedic workshop at Nampisha village, Kamjong District to educate and train the local youth in Golden hour management and basic first aid. The aim of this initiative is to train at least four to six boys and girls in basic first aid in every village who can immediately stabilise the patient until the doctors arrive. Each Assam Rifles post will regularly conduct refresher workshops for selected persons under

the guidance of Medical Officers in future as well. The Workshop involved training on nuances of managing minor injuries, head injuries, spinal injuries, snake bites and dehydration to name a few. A total of 130 villagers attended the workshop. Shangshak Battalion under the aegis of HQ 10 Sector, IGAR (South) under civic action programme inaugurated water reservoir at K Asang Khullen on 31 March 2019. This much needed initiative taken by Assam Rifles will result in meeting critical water requirement of villagers during the dry season. Four militants killed, three Army jawans injured in Pulwama encounter

Four militants were killed while three Army jawans and a police personnel were injured in an encounter in Pulwama district of Jammu and Kashmir on Monday, police said. On a credible input about presence of militants in Lassipora area of south kashmir's Pulwama district, security forces

launched a cordon and search operation there this morning, a police spokesman said. He said during the searches, militants fired upon the search party of the forces. The fire was retaliated, leading to an encounter, the spokesman said. In the ensuing encounter, he said, four militants were killed and their bodies were retrieved from the site of the encounter.

The identities and affiliations of the slain militants are being ascertained, the spokesman said. He said in the initial exchange of firing, three Army jawans and one policeman sustained injuries. The injured were hospitalised and are stated to be stable, he added. The spokesman said it was a clean operation and no collateral damage took place during the encounter. Incriminating material, including arms and ammunition, was recovered from the site of the encounter, he said.

Last date to link PAN with Aadhaar extended till Sep 30

The government has extended the last date to link Permanent Account Number (PAN) with Aadhaar number by six month till 30th of September. Earlier, March 31st was the last date. In a statement, Central Board of Direct

Taxes (CBDT) said, the decision to extend the deadline was taken in view of the media reports that those PANs which are not linked with Aadhaar number by yesterday may be invalidated. The CBDT has also made it clear that it is mandatory to quote and link Aadhaar number from today in filing the Income Tax Return.

Rahul Gandhi refused to forge alliance with AAP for LS polls: Kejriwal

Delhi Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal Monday said that Congress President Rahul Gandhi has refused to forge an alliance with the AAP for the Lok Sabha polls in the national capital. Talking to reporters at the airport here, the AAP leader said he had met Gandhi recently and the Congress leader had refused to join hands with the AAP.

Asked about Congress' Delhi unit president Sheila Dikshit's remarks that Kejriwal never approached her for an alliance, the chief minister said, We have met Rahul Gandhi. Dikshit is not that important leader. Kejriwal has been urging the Congress to stitch an alliance in Delhi for the Lok Sabha polls to keep the BJP away from power. Leaders in the Delhi unit of the Congress were divided over the issue of alliance with Dikshit and her three working presidents opposing it, party sources had said. A top source in the party had recently said that chances of alliance were "slim" considering its long term repercussions in Delhi. "The biggest question is

how will Congress face the AAP in Assembly elections due in 2020 after the tie up. Also, the party does not gain much politically as it is being offered only 2-3 seats by Kejriwal," the source had said. Congress had drawn a blank in the 2014 parliamentary elections in Delhi. The talk of alliance was fuelled by the fact that the Congress and AAP had jointly polled more votes than the BJP that had walked away with all the seven seats in the national capital. Delhi has 7 Lok Sabha seats and it will go to polls on May 12.

Axelsen beats Srikanth to win second title; Intanon creates record Polii-Rahayu and Yilyu-Dongping successfully defend titles

Viktor Axelsen dashed Indian hopes with a 21-7, 22-20 win over Kidambi Srikanth at the Yonex-Sunrise India Open 2019, a part of the BWF World Tour Super 500 tournament, here on Sunday. In a rematch of the 2015 final, the Dane saved a couple of game points in the second game to get his second title after his 2017 win. In women's singles, Thailand's Ratchanok Intanon created history by becoming the first women's singles shuttler to win the title three times when she beat the third seed He Bingjiao 21-15, 21-14. With this, she also emulated the legendary Lee Chong Wei's record to become the second singles player to taste glory thrice at India's premier badminton event, with her earlier victories coming in 2013 and 2016. Ratchanok started slow against the seventh ranked Chinese, whom she had never beaten in four previous meetings. With Bingjiao cruising at 9-6, the Thai banked on her experience to turn the



tables on her rival. Using her speed and aggression, she drew level at 14-14 and then started targeting the corners to make life difficult for the Chinese. Bingjiao, who had accounted for PV Sindhu in the semi-finals, looked pretty subdued since then and struggled to keep up with the Thai's pace and accuracy. After taking the first game, the former world champion continued her momentum throughout the second game as unforced errors from Bingjiao's racket piled up. With Bingjiao hitting in haste, a calm and

poised Intanon sailed through the second game to go up to 14-9 before closing out the match in 46 minutes. "I learnt from the past when I lost to her and also from her match against Sindhu yesterday," said Intanon after the win. "People say I play really well here in India Open. Before I came to the main hall, I saw my record against her and it was 0-4 and I thought I need to break this record today. "Today I tried to play calmly and point-by-point and I played well," added the former World No. 1. World No. 4 Viktor

Axelsen, who reached the All England Open final this month, was too strong and too powerful for the home hope in the first game as Srikanth struggled to find his rhythm. The precision and firepower from Axelsen thoroughly overwhelmed the 2015 champion, allowing the Dane to build a huge 10-point advantage at 17-7 before pocketing the first game. Amid vociferous cheers from the crowd, the Indian finally settled in a very tight second game. By attacking from the front court and using his body smashes to perfection, the

World No. 7 made the score equal at 12-12. With the two deadlocked in the second game, the Indian even carved out a couple of game points to go up to 20-18. However, a dropshot from the Indian went wide after that and the second seeded Axelsen made no mistake in saving the other to get his first match point which he duly converted after 36 minutes of play. "I think I gave him too many chances in the first set to attack and tried avoiding that in the second. I did fairly well at the 20th point, maybe if there would have been a decider, I would have had much better chances," said

Srikanth after the match. In women's doubles and mixed doubles, the top seeded pairs of Greysia Polii-Apriyani Rahayu and Wang Yilyu-Huang Dongping successfully defended their titles. While Polii-Rahayu emerged 21-11, 25-23 winners over third seeds Chow Mei Kuan and Lee Meng Yean, Yilyu and Dongping prevailed over fifth seeds Praveen Jordan and Melati Daeva Oktavianti 21-13, 21-11. In men's doubles, Lee Yang and Wang Chi-Lin triumphed over Ricky Karandasuwardi and Angga Pratama 21-14, 21-14 for their first title at this marquee event.
