## Assam Rifles Seizes Contraband Worth 2.532 Crores

In continuation to its remarkable run of seizures and apprehensions, Tengnoupal Battalion of 26 Sector Assam Rifles under the aegis of HQ IGAR (South) once again apprehended a drug smuggler carrying Brown Sugar and WY tablets worth Rs 2.532 crores at Khudengthabi Check Post. On 02 Apr 2019 at around 1930 hours based on specific input received from reliable sources a combined team of troops of Khudengthabi Post and a

team of Moreh CDO and Moreh Police Station stopped a Silver colour Hyundai i20 Manga car bearing registration No MN06LA 5954 travelling from Moreh to Imphal for checking. The individual was detained on confirmation of the carriage of contraband. The detailed search of the vehicle resulted in the seizure of 32 Bricks wrapped in an off white paper containing pouches with tablets, 64,000 pieces suspected to be WY tablets and 25 packets of orange coloured powder suspected to be Brown Sugar, approx weight 306 grams were found hidden

inside the fabricated compartment under the doors of the vehicle. The contraband items were being smuggled by Mr Chirom Momocha Singh, aged 24 years, S/o Chirom Deben Singh, R/o Koirengei Bazar, Imphal East District. The approximate cost of WY tablets and Brown Sugar is Rs 2.532 crores. The Battalion is resolute to prevent smuggling of Narcotics and contraband items through the area of responsibility and subsequently to prevent youth of country from digressing on the path of drug abuse.

## Training On Gps Tracking For Sector Officers Of Kangpokpi

Kangpokpi, April 4,

A training programme on Tracking and Management of Vehicle Device (GPS device) for Sector Officers/Sector Magistrates of Kangpokpi District was convened yesterday at the Conference Hall of the Deputy Commissioner, Kangpokpi District. The training session was chaired by District Election Officer/DC, Kangpokpi Smt. Lalithambigai K. IAS and was attended by 23 Sector Officers of the district. Specialised trainers from Globiz Solutions Pvt. Ltd Imphal imparted hands-on training on the use of the GPS device. Globiz trainer Boynao stated that the GPS device should be kept on and every movement will be reported automatically to the control room opened at the DC Complex and the Chief Electoral Officer, Manipur. Later, a meeting of the DC with the Sector Officers was also convened at the same venue to review the works done by them for the ensuing Lok Sabha Elections 2019. During the meeting, DC Lalithambigai K

inquired all the Sector Officers about their concerned polling stations and the feasibility of the transport and coverage. The DC strictly advised all the SOs to take the VVPAT machines seriously as they are used for the first time in the district. She also told the SOs not to mix up the machines allotted to an assembly constituency with that of another. She further informed that the first hour of voting is very important hence the SOs should visit the polling stations in person to check whether the mock poll process is complete instead of taking report over phone. Addressing the problem about far flung polling stations which take about 4-5 hours while reaching, Lalithambigai stated that a dedicated SO per polling station will be assigned to such places for proper conduct in poll day. Meanwhile, the Commissioning of EVM/VVPAT had started on Tuesday at 9.00 am where the Strong room was opened in presence of the representatives of political parties and continued till 1.00 am

midnight. The Commissioning will complete on 3<sup>rd</sup> April, 2019. Besides, appointment orders and Election Duty Certificate (EDC) forms were issued for polling personnel at the DC Office today. Training for polling personnel will begin on 4<sup>th</sup> April, 2019 at Multipurpose Hall of DC for Saitu AC, Security Barrack for Saikul AC and 1<sup>st</sup> floor DC Complex for Kangpokpi.
