The risk factor for both ovarian and breast cancer doubles in females if a femal has been diagnosed with breast cancer within the age

bracket of 40 years. The risk for developing cancer also increases if women under the age of 60 years have triple negative breast cancer, which are a type of breast cancer that estrogen receptors progesterone receptors and human epidermal growth factor receptor 2." Said Dr Sameer Kaul, President, bcpbf-The Concrete Foundation Cancer Foundation.

According to the recent data provided by Globacan 2018, India, there is a 3% rise in the number of new patients diagnosed with cancer, and the

mortality rate was registered at 30% in 2018. Of the total
