MU in funding crisis as leadership is institutionally uncertain

IT News Imphal, Aug 20,

Manipur University is landing in dire straight once more as the Union Ministry of Human Resource and Development (MHRD) still is yet to appoint a regular Vice Chancellor after removal of Prof. AP Pandev

On the Direction of the Manipur High Court, former Chief Secretary of the state Jarnail Singh had been appointed as Administrator of the University to act in the capacity of Vice Chancellor for time being and has been continuing till today. For reason best known to the authority UGC had stop releasing find and the releasing fund and the University is left with no choice but to take loan from State Bank of India.

As per source, a sum of rupees one crore (Rs. 1 Crore) was borrowed from the State Bank of India and the amount

transferred to the University bank account at Bank of Baroda has been sanction for utilization

Administrator on August 8. The sum of rupees one crore is being borrowed on the ground that the amount will be reimbursed after UGC releases fund for the University.

Source further said that Jarnail Singh, the Administrator acting as VC by the directives of the Manipur High Court has failed to bring the Manipur as the UGC does not want to invest when the tenure of his stay as VC is already numbered.

On the other hand, the sanction amount for utilization was carried out without getting any approval from any University Authority, the source added saying that University may face another deep financial crisis as the money for development of MU is feared spent during his stay.

State Observes Sadbhavana Diwas; Thoubal police will be befittingly rewarded: CM

As in other parts of the country, the State today observed Sadbhavana Diwas, the birth anniversary of former Prime Minister Rajiv Gandhi. The State level function was held at 1st MR Banquet Hall with Chief Minister N. Biren Singh and Deputy Chief Minister Y. Joykumar Singh as the chief guest and functional president respectively

Speaking at the occasion, N. Biren Singh expressed his Government's strong commitment to carry on their campaign against drugs. Observing that drugs and heroin have the potential of destroying the whole generation, the Chief Minister

for putting in concerted efforts to root out drug menace for the future of the State.

N. Biren Singh also announced that the police team of Thoubal District, led by its SP Dr. S. Ibomcha, who recently busted a drug factory at Lilong and seized around 185 kg of heroin worth around Rs. 166 crore in the international market, would be rewarded befittingly as done in earlier cases. Stating that Imphal-Moreh highway is known to be a major route for drug trafficking, the Chief Minister also instructed DGP L.M. Khaute, who was present at the function, to lav an intelligence network in and around Moreh under a committed officer so that drug peddling from the border town

to other parts of the State is prevented effectively. During his speech, the Chief

Minister also expressed serious concern over increasing rate of casualty in road accidents. In this regard, he directed the officials concerned to issue an order making helmets mandatory for two-wheeler drivers at the earliest. On the other hand, he also asked the police to launch a drive to remove 'tints' from the window glasses of four-wheelers. He said that criminals can elude from police eyes if they travel in the vehicles having tinted

glasses. The Chief Minister also instructed the officials concerned to speed up developmental works and implementation of welfare schemes. Informing that there

The Meeteis in Tripura has been jealously following and conserving the cultures of the meeteis despite living in another state by wearing the traditional attire during rituals

and festivals.

Most womenfolk wore Rani Phi, Wangkhei Phi, Moirang Phi and other traditional attires on auspicious occasions bought at high cost from the Nepalis.
"The economy of the Meeteis

living in Tripura can be strengthened if expert weavers from Manipur teach the Meeteis of Tripura or if the

Manipur government initiate a free training program at Manipur or Tripura for making such dresses" suggested Nongthombam Kusum Singha who is the General Secretary of Chhechhuria federation Chhechhuria weaving training Centre Agartala speaking to Imphal Times. Highlighting the centre, she stressed that the centre was funded by the World Bank under the Ministry of DoNER and NERLP and added that it was established in the year 2014 by the Meeteis and the Bengalis

especially the women were

residing there. Speaking to Imphal Times she further said that poor people of the area

made self-employed through livestock farming and giving training on weaving thus generating their

economy Assam came and taught the women at the centre in clothes with patterns and designs in it, she added. Kusum further said that around 9 Meetei women were

there at the centre learning weaving on the 9 looms The Meeteis in Tripura have known how to weave simple

clothes of the Meetei like Khudei and Phaneks and such clothes were also widely used by the Meeteis residing in Tripura, Kusum stressed. She continued that costlier and intricately designed clothes worn by the Meeteis like Wangkhei Phi, Rani Phi, Phige, Moirang Phi were beyond the skill of the weavers there and added that the Meeteis there longed to

learn making such clothes She added that the Meetei women living in Tripura generate their income mainly from weaving agricultural activities

Considering the plight of the Considering the plight of the Meeteis living in Tripura Kusum urged the government and all the Civil Society Organisations and also Organisations like SALAI and individuals who love the Meeteis to help in giving training to the Meetei women in weaving and preserving traditional dresses and costumes like Wangkhei Phi, Rani Phi, Phige, Moirang Phi and help in strengthening their
