

India-Pakistan Kartarpur corridor talks today; pilgrims' safety, connectivity on agenda



Agency New Delhi July 14,

The second round of talks between India and Pakistan to finalise modalities of the Kartarpur corridor for Sikh pilgrims began Sunday at the Attari-Wagah border on the Pakistani side a day after Islamabad dropped pro-Khalistan leader Gopal Singh Chawla from its team of negotiators. Major issues such as

connectivity at Zero Point and the number of pilgrims to be allowed through the Kartarpur corridor will be discussed at the meeting, government sources said. India is also expected to flag its concerns over the security aspect. India had earlier flagged the presence of Gopal Singh Chawla, a leading Khalistani separatist in a committee appointed by Islamabad for talks on the Kartarpur project.

Pakistan eventually dropped Chawla ahead of Sunday's talks. The two sides are set to discuss matters related to the modalities of the corridor and who can use it and its facilities. Documents required by pilgrims and the number of people to be allowed would be on the agenda of the meeting, sources said. Indian officials are also expected to discuss the issue of connectivity at the Zero

Point. New Delhi has hopes that issues like connectivity at the Zero point and visit of large number of pilgrims on the special occasions will be discussed thoroughly. The project will allow easy access to Sikh pilgrims from India to Gurdwara Darbar Sahib in Kartarpur in Pakistan, the final resting place of Guru Nanak.

Kartarpur is located in Pakistan's Narowal district, about four km from Dera Baba Nanak in Punjab's Gurdaspur district. As part of connectivity, work on a four-lane highway on the Indian side is in full swing while Pakistan is constructing a two-lane highway. India is targeting to complete the four-lane highway by September, officials said.

Construction work at the site of passenger terminal complex at Dera Baba Nanak in India is progressing fast ahead of its planned completion by October 31 before the commemoration of 550th birth anniversary of Guru Nanak in November, officials said. In November 2018, Pakistan agreed to set up the border-crossing linking Gurdwara Darbar Sahib in Kartarpur to Dera Baba Nanak.

India's Chandrayaan-2 to go into space early morning tomorrow

India launches the country's most complex and prestigious ever mission, Chandrayaan-2, in a highly elliptical transfer orbit, from where it will be taken gradually to the moon by the scientists of Indian Space Research Organization ISRO through remote means.

launch pad of the Satish Dhawan Space Centre, Sriharikota, carrying the spacecraft. The 640-ton rocket will initially place Chandrayaan-2 in a highly elliptical transfer orbit, from where it will be taken gradually to the moon by the scientists of Indian Space Research Organization ISRO through remote means.

On the 54th day of the launch, the lander Vikram is expected to come out of the orbiter of Chandrayaan-2 and set its foot on the moon by soft landing at the lunar South Pole. Later, the six-wheeled rover Pragyan will be unleashed from the lander to move around the landing site and explore the terrain and collect valuable information. All the information collected by the rover and the lander will be initially transmitted to the orbiter, which will send it back to the earth. The orbiter will have a mission life of one year and will be encircling the moon on a circular orbit of 100 kilometer distance. The lander and the rover will collect data for a lunar day, which is about fourteen days on earth.

He and four other MLAs have however moved the Supreme Court against Assembly Speaker not accepting their resignation letters. A similar attempt was on to persuade MLAs Ramalinga Reddy,

Munirathna and R Roshan Baig apart from Dr. Sudhakar. Ramalinga Reddy has now said that he will attend the Assembly session on Monday and also meet the Speaker regarding his resignation. Meanwhile, two independent MLAs, who recently withdrew support to the Congress-JD(S) coalition, have written to the Assembly Speaker requesting him to allot them seats on the Opposition side in the House.

In separate letters to the Speaker, Mulbagal Independent MLA, H. Nagesh and Ranebennur Independent MLA, R. Shankar stated that they had withdrawn support to the ruling coalition and requested him to make seating arrangements for them on the Opposition side in the Assembly. The monsoon session of the Karnataka Assembly began on July 12 and is scheduled to end on July 26.
