

Deputy CM Nagaland Y. Patton calls on Union DoNER Minister Dr Jitendra Singh

New Delhi, June 2,

The Deputy Chief Minister of Nagaland, Y. Patton today called on Union Minister of State (Independent Charge) Development of North Eastern Region (DoNER), MoS, PMO, Personnel, Public Grievances & Pensions, Atomic Energy and Space, Dr Jitendra Singh and discussed various State related development projects with him. During the meeting, Patton conveyed his thanks to the Government led by Prime Minister Narendra Modi for having made the central

funding assistance to 100% under North East Special Infrastructure Development Scheme (NESIDS), instead of earlier 90:10 ratio under NLCPR. He said that Nagaland being far flung and developing state, will get immensely benefited from this decision. Patton also took up with Dr Jitendra Singh the issue of central assistance to the tune of Rs. 13.52 crore to the State of Nagaland for rebuilding totally washed away/damaged infrastructure in the 2017 floods. He said, a decision to this effect had already been taken and conveyed by the Ministry of DoNER to State

Government of Nagaland last year and it was only the release of funds which was pending. He further brought to the notice of DoNER Minister a communique received from the Ministry of DoNER which had asked the State government that suitable projects falling under the category of totally damaged/washed away, within the ceiling, may be identified for rebuilding and proposing the same for sanction. Patton said that Nagaland was on the path of development and was confident that under the leadership of Prime Minister it will usher in a new area of development.

CM inspects irrigation facilities, Paddy fields

Chief Minister N. Biren Singh yesterday visited different localities of Imphal West District to inspect the irrigation facilities under Minor Irrigation Department and paddy fields on the backdrop of the prevailing drought-like situation due to scanty rainfall. He was accompanied by State Planning Board Deputy Chairman and Lamshang AC M.L.A.S. Rajen, Secretary (Minor Irrigation/Water Resources) Smt. Jachintha Lazarus, Minor Irrigation Chief Engineer H. Brojen and other officials. The Chief Minister visited areas like Maklang Makha Leikai, Maklang Dam, Taothong Maning Leikai, Lambal Dam, Lamdeng, Khamran and

Khonghampat. Speaking to media persons, the Chief Minister said that the Government would provide water pump sets to the farmers of the localities, where water sources like rivers, streams and ponds are there within a few days. He also said that hybrid seeds, which can be harvested in short duration, would be made available to farmers. The Government would declare Manipur as a drought-hit State if the State does not receive enough rainfall, he added. Responding to query on fertilizer availability, the Chief Minister said that the State Government has enough stock of fertilizers.

Bangladesh: Left Alliance call hartal July 7

The Left Democratic Alliance (LDA) has called for a half-day strike on July 7 in protest against gas tariff hike. The decision was taken at the coalition meeting. Today, the leaders of the Left Democratic Alliance held a meeting at 11am on Monday. After the meeting, Comrade Shah Alam, Secretary General of Communist Party of Bangladesh (CPB), said that the government has decided to increase the gas price,

which is irrational. The strike will be observed from 6AM to 2PM on July 7. According to the new tariff, households using a single burner will pay Tk 925 instead of Tk 750 a month. Those using a double burner will pay Tk 975 in place of Tk 800. The energy regulator yesterday raised tariff for all users, saying the move would help the government bear the expenses of importing liquefied natural gas. With this, gas tariff for households has more than doubled in the last decade.

There are six Public Libraries under administrative control of Ministry of Culture namely National Library, Kolkata, Central Reference Library, Kolkata, Central Secretariat Library, New Delhi, Delhi Public Library, Delhi, Khuda Baksh Oriental Public

Library, Patna and Rampur Raza Library, Rampur. Data regarding state-wise number of public libraries or number of libraries proposed to be set up in various parts of the country is not maintained by Ministry of Culture as Public Libraries function under the administrative control of respective State/UT Library

Authorities being State Subject. National Mission on Libraries has a scheme for providing financial assistance for upgradation of infrastructure of one State Central Library and one District Library in each State/UT as NML Model Library. Public Libraries function under the administrative

control of the respective State/UT library authority. This Ministry has not received any official communication from any of the State/UT library authority in this regard. This information was given by the Minister of State (I/c) of Culture and Tourism, Prahalad Singh Patel in a written reply in the Lok Sabha yesterday.

At least 27 people killed as heavy rain continues to batter Mumbai

In Maharashtra, at least 27 people lost life since last night in rain-related incidents. In Mumbai, 18 people died in the wall collapse incident in suburban Malad while 4 of the 75 injured remain critical. The incident reportedly happened at 2 in the morning today in Pimpripada in Malad East area after a retaining wall collapsed on few hutments due to heavy rain. Officials added that few people may be trapped under the debris of the wall collapse. Search and rescue operations by NDRF and other agencies are

underway. In another incident in the city which happened around, 1.30 am today, at least three people were killed and one injured after the wall of National Urdu School, fell on the nearby hutments. In one more rain-related incident, a portion of road caved-in at Sangharsh Nagar in Chandivali. The municipal corporation has asked residents staying in the nearby buildings to evacuate the houses and move to a safer place. A team of BMC officials and security forces have rushed to the spot. In Pune, six labourers were killed and three injured after

a wall collapsed in Ambegaon area late last night. Three persons killed in a wall collapse in Kalyan in Thane district early morning today. The Navy has deployed various teams to provide relief to rain hit and stranded people in Kurla area of Mumbai in Maharashtra. The Navy informed this through twitter. In Kranti Nagar in suburban Kurla, 1000 people were evacuated with the help of NDRF, fire brigade, Naval teams as well as local volunteers, to prevent any untoward incident due to overflowing Mithi river.

CM visits six minor siblings of Barak tragedy

Chief Minister N. Biren Singh visited Sang Ga Muon Inn Orphanage at Churachandpur district headquarters on Monday and interacted with the six surviving minor siblings of Kaimai village, who have lost both their parents as well as their eldest sister after they drowned in Barak river. The minor children are now under the care of the orphanage run by Kuki Women Union (KWU),

Churachandpur. Talking to KWU members, the Chief Minister said that the Government would extend every possible help and support to the minor siblings. He said that the State Government would deposit Rs. 2 lakhs each in the name of these six children as fixed deposit in a bank. He also said that the Government would also provide them free education up to Class XII. N. Biren also instructed the officials concerned to provide possible aid to the orphanage.

India is rapidly losing its women to the deadly disease of cancer. Ovarian and cervical cancer are the most common Gynecological Cancers of women. Ovarian cancer remains the most lethal gynecological malignancy. Only marginal improvement has happened in its survival. Cervical cancer is the second most common cancer in women after

breast cancer. All cancer in women require early diagnosis to avoid complication, long treatment and increased cost of treatment.

Ovarian Cancer
Cancer of ovaries is the fifth most frequently occurring fatal cancer in women after lung, breast, colon and pancreas. 75% of patients are diagnosed in advanced stage (III or IV). It is suggested that every woman should have a periodic pelvic examination, pelvic ultrasound and Ca 125 levels to diagnose ovarian cancer. Major risk factors of this cancer includes- increasing age, infertility, family history of ovarian cancer, personal history of breast cancer, increased BMI > 30, early menarche and late menopause, using talcum on perineum, galactose consumption, etc.

Watch out for these symptoms of Ovarian Cancer

- Abdominal discomfort
- Indigestion
- Bloating
- Pain in abdomen
- Changes in bladder / bowel function, decreased appetite and other mild digestive disturbances which may be present for several months before

Cervix Cancer

Cervical cancer is a cancer arising from the cervix. It is due to the abnormal growth of cells that have the ability to invade or spread to other parts of the body. Early on, typically no symptoms are seen. Later symptoms may include abnormal vaginal bleeding, pelvic pain or pain during sexual intercourse. Risk Factors include - first sexual intercourse at an early age (< 16 yrs), multiple sexual partners, lower socio-economic status, Human Papilloma Virus (HPV) infection, sexually transmitted diseases, smoking etc.

Symptoms

- Abnormal vaginal bleeding
- Menorrhagia (menstrual periods with abnormally heavy or prolonged bleeding)
- Post-coital (sexual intercourse) bleeding
- Inter-menstrual bleeding, postmenopausal bleeding; malodorous vaginal discharge and weight loss.
- Advanced stage may present with obstructive flow of urine, leg oedema (a condition characterized by an excess of watery fluid collecting in the cavities or tissues of the body), chronic boring

pelvic pain, backache, bladder and rectal symptoms.

- Any suspicious lesion of the cervix should be biopsied.

Screening

- Routine screening of the adult female population with pap smears.
- All women who are 3 yrs after the onset of vaginal intercourse, or no later than 21 yrs should undergo an annual Pap test and pelvic examination. Prophylactic HPV vaccination represents a potential means of reducing the burden of cervical cancer and its precursor lesions.
- Status of gynecology cancer care in India.**
 - Large population with poor access to health care.
 - Educational programmes needs to be conducted in schools to increase awareness on the risk factors and symptoms for early detection of these cancers.
 - Increase in accessibility of screening tools like Pap smear, trained personnel.
 - Use of existing health care givers to its efficient utilization.
