RBI ban likely to be lifted soon: Chief Minister

DIPR Imphal June 20

Chief Minister N. Biren Singh has said that the Reserve Bank for India (RBI) is likely to lift the ban imposed on the financial transactions of the State Government due to overdraft within a few days. He was speaking to media persons on the sidelines of the joint Meeyamgi Numitand Hill Leaders' Day held at the Durbar Hall of Chief Minister's

Secretariat today.
The Chief Minister said that during his recent visit to New Delhi, he had apprised Prime Minister Narendra Modi and Union Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman of the current financial position of the State. N. Biren further informed that he requested the Finance Minister to release open market borrowings to overcome the current

current situation. Subsequently, the Union Ministry of Finance issued permission directing the RBI to raise open market borrowings of the State up to Rs. 795 crores. For the time being, the State Government is borrowing Rs. 400 crores from the open market through RBI to neutralise the current overdraft, he said while adding that the State Government is also expecting to receive Rs. 305 crores as State share of Central Taxes in a day or so. In another positive development, the Chief Minister said, he could secure

He said various departments like Tourism, Art and Culture will be consulted for possible work which can be implemented in the area to make the place a tourist maintaining ecosystem

Rs. 27.37 crores for 16 projects under Flood Relief Works for 2017 damage due to floods in the State have also received approval, he added. The three projects under the North East Special Infrastructure Development Scheme (NESIDS) are upgradation of Moirang Sendra Road upto Sendra

Hillock, Moirang Sendra Road to Omba Hillock and Keina Bazaar to Thanga Keibul Road for promoting tourism amounting 21.65 crores, augmentation of Moreh Water Supply Scheme amounting 22.84 crores and provision of special ward in JNIMS amounting 14.57 crores.

The projects under Hill Area Development Programme (HADP) included (HADP) included construction of water supply schemes at Tamei, Nungba, Haochong etc., transit quarters/hostels for doctors, transit teachers and Government employees at Nungba, Noney Haochong and sub-divisional headquarters in Noney and Tamenglong District, development and promotion District, of eco-tourism centre at Zeliad lake and Tharon cave etc. The scheme also covers projects related to employment generation for the local public by taking up various food processing units for fruits, vegetables, tea, bamboo, spices etc. with forward and backward linkages leading to overall increase in income. Out of the total Rs. 90 crores approved under HADP, Rs. 24.22 crores, which is 26.91%, has been earmarked for projects related to welfare of women and children.

He said that a movement is the need of the hour for good politics to strive in the land and added that the economy of the land is not decided by economist but by the politics of the land.

Highlighting the reason behind the present financial crisis of the state Chinglen Maisnam said that the reason behind it was because of the Indian government derecognising Planning commission and omitting Special status of the state and the misappropriation, Financial indiscipline and

funds. He also stressed that if there is any financial crisis than the authority should look into the area of non planned revenue expenditures where the legislature can manage in whatever way they can.

He added that the financial crisis of the state is a prolonged one and the recent banned by RBI simply add more stress to the financial instability.

He also highlighted that the financial budget of Manipur is lower than Nagaland, Arunachal Pradesh and many other state.

Mutum Sonarjit Singh s/o MutumJugidro Singh &Mutum (Ongbi) Bedabati Devi of Khoijuma Ward No:2, Bishnupur District, cracked JEE Advance and qualified to study in Indian premier Technical Institutions IIT in his first attempt at 5446 all India rank.

Sonarjit Singh had his schooling from class survery to class V at one of the local School, then from Class VI to XII at JNV, Bishnupur. He passed his Class X exam from JNV Bishnupur with CGPA 9.8 and XII Science Exam from the same school with 87.6% Not like other students he did not had the chance to go for extra tuition as his family is in acute poverty. His father was a diploma in Electrical Engineering but did not get any chance to be et

For the first time in Manipur, Lutembacher Syndrome treated at SKY Hospital

Lutembacher Syndrome is a very are disease entity in which a large hole in the heart called Atrial Septal Defect (ASD) present from birth and Rheumatic Mitral Stenosis (blocked mitral valve of the heart) which develops after birth are present in the same heart. The condition was first described in 1916 by

Lutembacher.

For the first time in Manipur, such complex heart condition was successfully operated at SKY Hospitalon 19th May, 2019.

Mr. T. Yuithing, 52 years old resident of Kashung Village, Ukhrul District having the rare heart problem had been

suffering from breathlessness, cough, chest pain, palpitation etc for many years. At last the accurate diagnosis was made for him at his first visit to SKY Hospital on 6/3/2019. His cath study revealed that his Pulmonary Arterial (PA) pressure was severely high at 78 mmHg with high PVRI of 5/c 6 not operable) putting him at high risk category of open heart surgery for two operations – mitral valve replacement (MVR) and closure of the large ASD. However, without surgery he was not going to survive. SKY Heart Team performed the double operation on him. The operation started at 7:00 pm and finished at 11:50 pm. Not unexpectedly he had to be on life support including

ventilator, pacemaker for the first 48 hours post-operatively. Subsequent post-operative recovery was smooth though slow. Another major achievement of this operation is the reversion of his Atrial Fibrillation (irregular palpitation). He started eating, drinking, mobilizing gradually and was discharged home. Dr. L Shyamkishore expresses his happiness and satisfaction on the success of such high risk operation for Mr. T. Yuithing and appeals to the people of state to be aware of the sophisticated equipments, infrastructure and highly experienced specialists available at SKY Hospital to treat various high risk and complex heart diseases.
