

Chief Minister N. Biren inaugurates police station in Indo-Myanmar village Behiang

Imphal, June 24,

Chief Minister N. Biren Singh today inaugurated Behiang Police station in the interior part of Manipur under Singhat Sub Division at Indo-Myanmar Border. This is perhaps the first police station in the village.

The newly inaugurated police station has 2 barracks with a capacity of at least 40 personnel's each. The strength of Behiang police station is 50 personnel only. T. Liankhansang is the officer in charge of the station.

Speaking on the occasion Chief Minister N. Biren said the police should not only look after the law and order of the place but also help the people of the village in every way they can. He added that they should also help the people of the village in education and many more.

The Chief Minister appealed the police to interact with the people by listening to their grievances of the people besides maintaining the law and order situation of the area. Biren further said that a government cannot be run by sitting only in Imphal. He said that their government likes to deliver actions not mere lip service.

Highlighting the reason behind the construction of Behiang police station N. Biren said that the police station was built up to make Behiang a Border trade centre.

He said that he urged the transport ministry to make a highway passing through Behiang which will be alternate route to Myanmar. He also said that the police station was constructed and completed within six, seven months with the tremendous support and coordination of the people of Behiang.

Biren also said that the government primarily focus on education. He added that around 24 crore was earmark in education.

He also assured to make a ring road round the border area of Manipur which would cost around 800 crores.

He concluded that with the opening of the police station proper checking of illegal immigrants and also other illegal activities like drug trafficking is a must.

V. Hangkhallan Minister of Agriculture, Veterinary and animal Husbandry said that the people of the Behiang village wanted to be a place 2nd international Border trade next to Moreh.

Education minister Th Radheshyam said that the main objective of the present government was reaching the unreachable. "Inauguration of the police station in the border area of the state is a part of the objective held by the government", he added.

He also said that police were the first line of action of the government. He appealed the people to work as one team



between the public and police which is more important in such interior part of the state. He also assured that the government will try to recruit teachers from the respective district to decrease the proxy teachers.

minister Th. Shyamkumar assured to open a forest office which will mainly deal with the plantation of plants and trees. He further assured that a horticulture Department will also be open and try to plant various plants which will increase the economy of the

people.

The inaugural function was attended by V. Hangkhallan Minister of Agriculture, Veterinary and animal Husbandry, Karam Shyam Minister of Revenue and CAF&PD, Th. Shyamkumar Minister of Forest &

Environment and MAHUD, Losii Dikho Minister of PHED and Printing and stationary, Th Radheshyam Minister of Education, Labour & Employment, Ginsuanhau Zou MLA of Singhat AC, J. Suresh Babu Chief Secretary Government of Manipur and DGP LM Khaute as Dias members. As a part of the inaugural function Chief Minister along with various ministers planted trees inside the station compound.

A software named Ye Smart Hospital Management System, Behiang was also launched which is first of its kind in the entire north east where it enable coordination between the patients and doctors. A memorandum was also submitted to the chief Minister by the people of Behiang.

WBCC appeals to seize machineries use for illegal excavation

Wildlife and Biodiversity Conservation Committee (WBCC) Manipur while condemning the intervention by MLA of Khangabok Assembly Constituency to the effort to protect the environment of the state by staffs of Forest department today appeal government authority to seize the machineries – an excavator (JCB) and a truck which was reported to have been taken away from the custody of the Forest department staffs.

Soon after Imphal Times reported about the intervention of MLA Okram Surjakumar of Khangabok Assembly constituency to the action of the Forest department staffs, the MLA had clarified that in a hurriedly convened press meet that he never use force and snatch those machineries from the Forest Staff. He however stated that as the machineries were hired one and use for public purpose he only requested to leave them alone. The earth soil being collected was to dump at river embankment to protect the

people from flood.

The statement by the WBCC expressed strong seriousness to the act of the MLA saying that such illegal things happen at a time when MLAs, Ministers and many organization are planting trees to face the climate change that we the people are facing. The organization appealed to seize the machineries taken away by the MLA at the earliest possible time.

Reacting to the clarification by the MLA, WBCC said that the way the MLA clarified shows that the MLA, Zilla Parishad and Pradhan have no respect to the ruling of the Manipur High Court. However the WBCC expressed gratitude to the MLA for their service of filling the river embankment but appealed them to take the earth soil from some place where forest areas are not destroyed.

3 died; 4 seriously injured as truck falls in a gorge

At least 3 (Three) persons died, another 4 (four) seriously injured after a truck they were travelling fell at a gorge in Imphal-Jiribam road at around 6.30 am today.

The tragic accident happened near Biyang village under New Keithelmanbi police station, around 4 km away from Keithelmanbi along NH-37 towards Jiribam.

Report reaching here said that the accident occurred the truck fell into the gorge while

trying to overtake a vehicle before reaching to Kotlien. All those person who died and injured in the road accident are labour. They were on their way to a stone Quarry site near Kotlien. Police team which rush to the site tried to rescue them injured.

Bodies of those died in the accident were retrieved by the police team and taken to morgue likely at RIMS. And those injured had been rush to the Hospital for medical treatment. Police had registered a case in connection with the case.
