## Unknown epidemic kills around 18 cattle in Wangoo

At least 18 cattle are reported died, and some showed symptom of unknown disease which has been spreading in various villages of Wangoo area at which portion of it comes under Kumbi Assembly Constituency of Bishnupur district while the remaining at Sugnu Assembly constituency.

"Since the last few days unknown disease that has been spreading in the village has killed at least 18 cattle while many are fear attacked", a villager said. The cattle were found dead at Haotak, Wangoo Sabl, Ithai, Wangoo Ahallup, Chuthek Leikai and Napat.



Villagers drew the attention of the state veterinary department to help the villagers in saving their cattle. Around morning today a cattle was found struggling for life at the roadside at Wangoo. The owner of the cattle said that he had medicated his cattle but do not have any idea on how his cattle suffer such

disease. Almost all the symptom which killed the 18 cattle looks alike. And the cattle which had been found at the road side too also have the similar symptom, a villager said. Till now no authority of the veterinary had visited the village to take stock of the situation.

## Director RIMS converts the institution into a Contract Market, huge amount of bill released during Model Code of Conduct - KCP-MC

Armed group Kangleipak Communist Party Military Affairs said that huge amount of contract work bills had been released by the Director of Regional Institute of Medical Sciences (RIMS) to a specific farm called "Marjing" during election code of conduct. The statement signed by Comrade Lanchemba Meitei, Secretary, Information and Publicity, Military Affairs also blames the Director of RIMS for having interest in contract work instead of focusing for improvement of the health care service. The statement said that the

trend of converting RIMS into a market is found out by the outfit while carrying out investigation on what went wrong to the RIMS and JNIMS, after number of patient were found dead while undergoing treatment at both the hospital. The outfit's statement also said that they have all proof on how the Director of RIMS is converting the Health care service provider into a market for contractors. It also said that the Director RIMS, have no interest to the improvement of the health care service in the hospital as he remained busy with contract work business. "The Director has appointed

his own men in the Engineering cell and awarded contract works to his brother in law s and relatives", the statement said. Besides, huge amount of donation are being given to Religious goons and terrorists like the RSS and ABVP, it added saying that the outfit now have all evidence. The silence from the staffs and professors of the RIMS is because of the close nexus with the Director with some of the former leaders of the CSOs, as they fear severe consequences. The KCP MC warns the director of serious consequences if not leave the post by taking voluntary retirement.

## All arrangements in place for 6th phase of LS polls tomorrow

All arrangements are in place for tomorrow's polling under the sixth phase of Lok Sabha elections. Fifty-nine constituencies, spread over seven states, will go to the polls in this phase. Voting will take place for 14 seats in Uttar Pradesh; all 10 in Haryana; eight each in West Bengal, Bihar and Madhya Pradesh; all seven seats in Delhi and four in Jharkhand. Prominent candidates include

Union Ministers - Radha Mohan Singh, Harsh Vardhan, Maneka Gandhi, Narendra Singh Tomar, Krishan Pal Gujjar and Rao Inderjit Singh, Delhi BJP President Manoj Tiwari and party leaders Gautam Gambhir and Pragya Singh Thakur. Congress leaders Sheila Dikshit, Jyotiraditya Scindia, Digvijaya Singh and Bhupinder Singh Hooda, boxer Vijender Singh, and Samajwadi Party President Akhilesh Yadav are also among those whose fate will be decided in this phase.

In Uttar Pradesh, polling parties along with EVMs and other election-related material are being sent amidst tight security. Inter-state and inter-district borders have been sealed to ensure peaceful polling. In Delhi, a total of 164 candidates including 16 women and 43 independents, are in the fray in this election. In Madhya Pradesh, voting will take place for Bhopal, Morena, Bhind, Gwalior, Guna, Sagar, Vidisha and Rajgarh Lok Sabha seats tomorrow.

## Chandel District Teachers have Not Received Salaries for 2 Months
