

# Water storage level of 91 major reservoirs of the country goes down by one percent

The water storage available in 91 major reservoirs of the country for the week ending on May 09, 2019 was 38.734 BCM, which is 24% of total storage capacity of these reservoirs. This percentage was at 25 for the week ending on May 02, 2019. The level of water storage in the week ending on May 09, 2019 was 116% of the storage of corresponding period of last year and 105% of storage of average of last ten years.

The total storage capacity of these 91 reservoirs is 161.993 BCM which is about 63% of the total storage capacity of 257.812 BCM which is estimated to have been created in the country. 37 Reservoirs out of these 91 have hydropower benefit with installed capacity of more than 60 MW.

### Region Wise Storage Status- NORTHERN REGION

The northern region includes States of Himachal Pradesh, Punjab and Rajasthan. There are six reservoirs under CWC monitoring having total live storage capacity of 18.01 BCM. The total live storage available in these reservoirs is 8.80 BCM which is 49% of total live storage capacity of these reservoirs. The storage during corresponding period of last year was 18% and average storage of last ten years during corresponding period was 26% of live storage capacity of these reservoirs. Thus, storage during current year is better than the corresponding period of last year and is also better than the average storage of last ten years during the corresponding period.

### EASTERN REGION

The Eastern region includes States of Jharkhand, Odisha,



West Bengal and Tripura. There are 15 reservoirs under CWC monitoring having total live storage capacity of 18.83 BCM. The total live storage available in these reservoirs is 5.87 BCM which is 31% of total live storage capacity of these reservoirs. The storage during corresponding period of last year was 33% and average storage of last ten years during corresponding period was 28% of live storage capacity of these reservoirs. Thus, storage during current year is less than the corresponding period of last year but is better than the average storage of last ten years during the corresponding period.

### WESTERN REGION

The Western region includes States of Gujarat and Maharashtra. There are 27 reservoirs under CWC monitoring having total live storage capacity of 31.26 BCM. The total live storage available in these reservoirs is 4.74 BCM which is 15% of total live storage capacity of these reservoirs. The storage during corresponding period of last year was 21% and average

storage of last ten years during corresponding period was 24% of live storage capacity of these reservoirs. Thus, storage during current year is less than the storage of last year and is also less than the average storage of last ten years during the corresponding period.

**SOUTHERN REGION**  
The Southern region includes States of Andhra Pradesh, Telangana, AP&TG (Two combined projects in both states), Karnataka, Kerala and Tamil Nadu. There are 31 reservoirs under CWC monitoring having total live storage capacity of 51.59 BCM. The total live storage available in these reservoirs is 7.38 BCM which is 14% of total live storage capacity of these reservoirs. The storage during corresponding period of last year was 13% and average storage of last ten years during corresponding period was 16% of live storage capacity of these reservoirs. Thus, storage during current year is better than the corresponding period of last year but is less than the average storage of last ten years during the corresponding period. States having better storage than last year for corresponding period are Himachal Pradesh, Punjab, Gujarat, Uttarakhand, Madhya Pradesh, Karnataka and Tamil Nadu. States having equal storage than last year for corresponding period are Odisha, Uttar Pradesh and AP&TG (Two combined projects in both states) Andhra Pradesh and Telangana. States having lesser storage than last year for corresponding period are Rajasthan, Jharkhand, West Bengal, Tripura, Maharashtra, Chhattisgarh, Andhra Pradesh, and Kerala.

### CENTRAL REGION

The Central region includes States of Uttar Pradesh, Uttarakhand, Madhya Pradesh and Chhattisgarh. There are 12 reservoirs under CWC monitoring having total live storage capacity of 42.30 BCM. The total live storage available in these reservoirs is 11.95 BCM which is 28% of total live storage capacity of these reservoirs. The storage during corresponding period of last year was 26% and average storage of last ten years during corresponding period was 25% of live storage capacity of these reservoirs. Thus, storage during current year is better than the storage of last year and is also better than the average storage of last ten years during the corresponding period.

# 4th phase of Lok Sabha polling in Maharashtra to be held tomorrow

The fourth phase of polling in Maharashtra will be held at the remaining 17 Lok Sabha constituencies on Monday. Altogether 3.11 crore voters at 17 constituencies will decide the fate of 323 candidates in Mumbai metropolitan region and parts of northern and western Maharashtra. AIR correspondent reports, the prominent candidates who are contesting the election in this phase are BJP leader Poonam Mahajan from

Mumbai North-Central parliamentary constituency. She will take on Priya Dutt of the Congress. Shiv Sena's, Arvind Sawant from Mumbai South has been pitted against Congress' Milind Deora. The other candidates who are in fray are BJP leader and Union minister of state for Defence, Dr Subhash Bhamre from Dhule, Dr. Heena Gavit from Nandurbar, Bollywood actor Urmila Matondkar and NCP leader Ajit Pawar's son Parth Pawar among others. Meanwhile, in view of the recent serial blasts in Sri

Lanka, elaborate security arrangements have been made in Mumbai and places where voting will be held. According to a statement issued by Mumbai Police, over 40,000 security personnel have been deployed in the metropolis for the smooth conduct of the polls. Anti-terror measures have also been put in place with personnel from Quick Response Teams, Assault Teams and Anti-Terrorism Cell being deployed in Mumbai.

# Electioneering picks up steam for last phase of Lok Sabha elections
