Around 70 per cent polling recorded in 17th Lok Sabha polls

Voting to elect 17th Lok Sabha has concluded successfully. Overall around 70 per cent polling was recorded in seven phases that were held to elect the lower house of Parliament. Briefing media in New Delhi last evening, Deputy Election Commissioner Umesh Sinha said, polling was by and large peaceful barring some incidents of violence.
He said this year's general

elections were more peaceful as compared to the 2014

edition. Mr Singh said, people, including women and senior citizens, came out in large numbers to exercise their franchise.

With the completion of the polling, the fate of 8,049 candidates, in fray for 542 Lok Sabha seats, has been sealed. In Gujarat, the fate of 371 candidates will be decided this time. Of these, 27 candidates are women, while one is from the third gender. The ruling BJP and opposition Congress contested all 26 seats in the state but the representation of

The 3-day medical camp at Pallel was for the residents of Pallel and surrounding villages of AimolNungourok, Kuraopokpi, Tuisimi, Meipou, Komlathabi, Beaulahram, Teraphai. A complete checkup of every individual was carried out. Blood tests and urine tests

including Hemoglobin Estimation (HB), Total Leukocyte Count (TLC), Differential Leukocyte(DLC) Total Eosinophilic count (TEC), Total Red Blood Cell Count, Platelet count, Coomb's Test – Direct and Indirect, Blood Sugar, Blood Urea, Serum Creatinine (CRE), Triglyceride (TG), Dengue and Malaria (Rapid Test), Rheumatoid Factor (RA), Hepatitis-B and Hepatitis C virus Rapid Test, Urine complete, Urine culture and screening of the life style diseases were carried out by Regimental Medical Organization (RMO) of Chandel Battalion assisted by Free Diagnostic Initiative of National Health Mission.

The Pallel Company Operating Base provided free medical

treatment and medicines to a total of 239 males, 109 females and 73 children. The medical camp at Sehlon also received an overwhelming response from local population where in medical treatment was provided to 110 villagers.
