As Myanmar troop reinforce and Indian Army alerted, NSCN-IM cadres move inside forest area at Indo-Myanmar area

Large number of NSCN-IM cadres that were reportedly driven out by the Myanmar troops from forest area between Hengkot and Ngachan villages under Lesi township area of Saigang Division, Myanmar, towards the Khayang area of Indian side (near Indo-Myanmar Border Pillar No. 123) were reported to have been moved towards the forest area in-between Chamu and Khayang area in Indian Territory. The large number of NSCN-IM cadres (around 300 in numbers) which were camping at two different location at forest area in-between Hengkot and

Ngachan villages which falls under the jurisdiction of Lesi township of Naga Autonomous Region, Sagaing Division, Myanmar near Indo-Myanmar border pillar number 124 and 125, reportedly left their camp and moved towards Indian territory before a large number of Myanmar troop reached Ngachan Village on November 4. Source from inside Myanmar said that more Myanmar army has been reinforced at the forest area between Hengkot and Ngachan villages in Myanmar early today morning.

On November 5 evening, sources from the Indian army said that there are no report about setting up of camp by NSCN-IM at Khayang village near border pillar no. 123 in

Indian territory and that there were also no report of any armed militants trespassing towards Indian side through Border Pillar No. 124 and 125 as the Indian security forces were keeping strict vigils. However, local source from the border area said that the last one day saw movement of Assam Rifles troops who were stationed as Chetric Khullen area towards Khayang and Chamu Village. There were no report of any gun fight as of now, the source added. It added that following the entry of Assam Rifles troops those reported to have been taking shelter Khayang village had moved towards the forest area in-between Khayang and Chamu villages. It further added that some of the cadres that cross through

Border Pillar 125 had moved towards Huishu village. The Indian troops are reportedly alerted in the area. On November 5 afternoon, Imphal Times reported about the entry of the large number of NSCN-IM cadres that were driven out from the Myanmar territory. The camp is reported to have been run under the command of a Retired Lt. Gen. of the NSCN-IM identified as Hangshi Ramsom and one Brigadier of the NSCN-IM Ngingingkhui. Some of the top leaders of the NSCN-IM including Col. Mahongam and Col. Yurho. Whereabouts of the leaders is not revealed by the source with Imphal Times.

5 shops gutted in Lalpani bazaar fire; locals express dissatisfaction on the late arrival of fire tender

At least 5 shops and all the goods inside them have been gutted in a devastating fire that broke out last night at Lalpani bazaar of Jiribam District which falls 6km from the zero point of Jiribam towards the southern site. According to report culled from the site of the fire, it was broken out at around 10 p.m of last night and it was suspected that the fire may be ignited

from the tea stall. Tea stall, Hardware store, clothes stores and grocery shop were among the 5 shops that have been gutted. Speaking with the media person, the Lalpani Bazaar Committee Secretary Md. Jamal Hussain said the fire was broke out at around 10pm. Immediately they reported to the Fire service department of Jiribam but due to delayed of fire tender arrival in the spot it was not able to save the shops which is very

unfortunate. He also appealed to the concern authority to take up rapid action when such unnatural devastating fire broke out in future so that it might save the properties of people. Later, to combat the fire along with three fire's tender, it's took 3 hours to put out the fire and prevent it from further spreading. Though the exact loss in the fire has not yet been worked out, the loss is estimated to be lakhs of rupees.

Nara Singh, National Executive Member of CPI on Wednesday evening has resolved to urge the government for an immediate assembly session to take a fresh resolution on the Indo Naga Peace talk. The meeting was attended by CPI (M) leaders Kshetrimayum Santa (Secretary), Sarat Salam and Thounaojam Sharat, CPI leaders L. Sotin (Secretary), Kh. Surchand Thokchom Joykumar and RK Amusana, AIFB Secretary Khomdrum Gyaneshwar and RSP Secretariat Member Kangjam Manoranjan. The meeting discussed the latest situation in the state of Manipur particularly the situation after the October 31 dateline on the Naga Peace

Talk between the Government of India (GOI) and Naga Representatives at New Delhi. After a threadbare discussion on the issue the meeting adopted the following Demands: 1) Immediately convene Manipur Legislative Assembly to discuss and adopt a fresh resolution in the interest of Manipur and its people. 2) Send the resolution of the Manipur Legislative Assembly to the both Houses of Parliament which will be commenced from November

18, 2019. 3) Invite immediately the stakeholders of Manipur, Assam and Arunachal Pradesh by the government including the state governments, political parties and CSOs to discuss for the finalisation to the Indo- Naga Peace Talk. The meeting expressed dissatisfaction of the casualness on the part Central and State governments on the ongoing process on Indo - Naga Peace Talk and warned that the time may be exhausted to tackle the issue.
