

State GDP growth reaches 8%; an increase of half from 2016-17- CM

Amid criticism from sections of people regarding the financial crisis in the state of Manipur, Chief Minister N. Biren Singh today said that the financial condition of the state increases half more than that of the 2016-17 when the BJP led government came to the power.

"GSTP of Manipur in 2016-17 was 3.77%, that was when the BJP led government replaced the Congress government. In 2017-18, we manage to increase the GSTP and this time, i.e., 2018-19 the GSTP reaches 8%", Chief Minister N. Biren Singh said while felicitating 5 (five) councillors of the Yairipok Municipal Council at the temporary head office of BJP Manipur Pradesh at Chanchipur today.

The five councillors are Longjam Kamala Devi (ward no. 9), Konjengbam Ito Singh (ward no. 8), Guruaribam Ingocha Sharma (ward no. 7), Md. Abdul Khalique (Ward No. 6) and Md. Dilip (Ward No. 5). They were elected as congress councillor but joined the BJP today. With the joining of the 5 Councillors, BJP now is the majority in the



Yairipok Municipal Council as there are only 4 councillors left in the congress side. Vice President of BJP Manipur Pradesh, Salam Joy, General Secretary Seityabrata, Dy. Speaker of Manipur Legislative Robindro and ex-minister Nimaichand Luwang, who is also a senior member of the BJP joined the Chief Minister as dignitaries on the dais while felicitating the councillors.

Chief Minister N. Biren Singh said that it is the peoples' trust to the party that it enable to sent MP to Lok Sabha in the lok Sabha election this time.

The development that the BJP led government in the state brought in just 2 years and three months that people started trusting the government.

"In this short span the state revenue which was just 497 crore at the time we come to power now cross over 1000 crores", aproud N. biren Singh said.

He said that it is the support from the people and the government's success in maintaining the law and order situation that make possible in the rise of the GSTP as well as the state revenue.

"As peace has been restored in the state, as bandh and blockades are history we are going forward", N Biren Singh said.

Appreciating the quality of Prime Minister Narendra Modi for his integrity and commitment for the people of the country, N. Biren Singh said that it is the Prime Minister Modi that inspire him.

"We may not have constructed big building but we are doing everything for the people and the recognition is also a clear example", Biren added.

Under NFSA we get only 2 Kg instead of 5 Kg per head and many do not received ration Card - Lairenjam Makha Leikai people

Residents of Lairenjam Makha Leikai of Naoriya Pakhanglakpa Assembly Constituency have filed a complaint to the deputy commissioner of Imphal West District stating that they have not received their ration cards despite the fact that they are eligible for it and have approached the Fair Price Shop multiple times. Given this, they have failed to avail various entitlements which they must get under the National Food Security Act, 2013.

The complaint also points out that since the last three years

people from Lairenjam Makha Leikai have received only (2kg) two kilograms of rice per head per month despite National Food Security Act 2013 guarantee five kilograms of rice per head per month. Till 2016 the residents were receiving five kilograms per month but it was reduced to two kilogram in the last three years.

Fifteen residents who signed the complaint to the Deputy Commissioner also stated that when they went to the Fair Price Shop, it was revealed to them that ration cards cannot be issued because all the household cannot be registered. It added that the rice also is not provided from

all the households by the authority and the food grains are distributed amongst all the people equally irrespective of the fact that people have ration cards or not.

Under National Food Security Act 2013, ration card holders are entitled five kilograms of rice per month per person and thirty five kilograms per month per family for those with AAY card. The residents are now demanding their due rights, ration card and the amount of rice by National Food Security Act, 2013. If the government fails to provide the rice, they are demanding Food Security Allowance as per the food security act.
