

## Manipur University in dire straits (Part -3)

### Violating Rule 150 & 155 of the GFR, MU procured over 17 lakhs worth equipments

*Imphal Times special team* while carrying out investigation to what ails in Manipur University, finds the administrative block as a den of corrupt officials from top to bottom, who don't have any respect for the law of the land as well as who considered the temple of higher education a gold mine. More findings by our special team will be made public. In this third publication, Imphal Times is exposing how the authority of the Manipur University Administration unit purchase computer equipments worth

over Rs. 17 lakhs through direct purchase without invitation of tender notification at any of the newspaper. This kind of procurement is a violation of Rule 150 & 155 of the General Finance Rules 2017, Ministry of Finance, Department of Expenditure. According to the findings of the Imphal Times Special Investigation team eight (8) electronic equipments worth Rs. 17,01,224/- (seventeen Lakh one thousand two hundred twenty-four) were directly purchased from a single firm in between May 5, 2016, to August 9, 2016. The firm as per the finding is identified as BB Enterprises, Imphal East. On May 30, 2016,

the Manipur University Authority purchase three number of Ricoh Digital Full color Multifunctional Printer Model No. Aficio MP 2001L from the said firm at the cost of Rs. 5,21,325/- (Five Lakhs twentyone thousand three hundred twenty five). When calculated each printer cost a sum of Rs. 1,73,775/- *Team Imphal Times* than enquired the rate of the printer at the local market here in Imphal as well as outside the state particularly in New Delhi, Kolkatta and Bengaluru. According to the information the market price of the said printer that you purchase at Rs. 1,73,775/- cost less than Rs.5000/- (Fifty Five thousand).

On July 04, 2016, another two numbers of 2 Ton AC 5 star were purchased from the said firm at the cost of Rs. 2,51,788/- (Two lakhs fifty one thousand seven hundred and eighty-eight) Another . When enquired about the market price of the said AC, the maximum price does not exceed Rs. 60,000/- (Sixty Thousand). On July 21, 2016, one Ricoh Digital Full Color Multifunctional Printer model No.MPC 2011 SP from the same firm BB Enterprises at the cost of Rs. 3,53,630/- (Three Lakhs Fifty three thousand six hundred and thirty). When enquired about the market price, the printer cost less than Rs. 2.5 lakhs.

On August 6, 2016, another Ricoh Digital Full color Multifunctional Printer Model No. Aficio MP 2001L was purchased from the said firm at the cost of Rs. 2,20,851/- (Two lakhs twenty thousand eight hundred and fifty one). This same printer when supplied by the same firm BB Enterprises, Imphal East, the price was Rs. 1,73,775/- . This means that the price of the Ricoh Digital Full color Multifunctional Printer Model No. Aficio MP 2001L was increase by Rs. 47,096 in 4 months. According to Rule 150 and 155 of the General Finance Rules 2017, Ministry of Finance, Department of Expenditure, Government of India.

## Aung San Suu Kyi assures public safety in Tamu

State Counsellor Aung San Suu Kyi said that the state would not let any organization which harms public safety and security go scot free. She was replying to a question raised by a person at a meeting with local people in Tamu near Indo-Myanmar border on January 23. State Counsellor said, "Not only Meitei armed group, any organization which harms public safety and security will not be let go scot free. We shall do our best. Currently we are reforming our Police Force to become people friendly and make all police personnel work closely with people in maintaining law and order for the public safety and security." Se Htin from Tamu Youth Network presented the

security situation in Tamu saying that people had anxiety and fear as Meitei armed group was living in Tamu. "Meitei armed group slapped a youth at gunpoint on December 27 and also lobbed a hand grenade into the compound of a MP from this constituency. Even if they dared lob hand grenade into the compound of a MP, " This armed group hurled a hand grenade into the compound of House of Nationalities MP Maung Maung Lat of NLD party from Tamu constituency, Saging Region in December 2019. The State Counsellor said in her reply that Myanmar Police Force was understaffed having only about half of sanctioned strength so the state was trying hard to fulfil its mission of providing public security.

## MNS to organize pro-CAA rally, vows to drive out Pakistani/Bangladeshi infiltrators

Maharashtra Navnirman Sena (MNS) chief Raj Thackeray on Thursday said that his party will fully support the Citizenship Amendment Act (CAA)/NRC and will also support the central government in "kicking out the Bangladeshi and Pakistani infiltrators from the country. Addressing a state level convention organised at Goregaon in North Mumbai, Thackeray said that a huge morchha will be organised at Azad Maidan in South Mumbai on 9 February, 2020 in support of CAA/NRC/NPR.

On the issue of illegal immigrants Raj Thackeray said that he would meet Chief Minister Uddhav Thackeray and Home Minister Amit Shah. Raj Thackeray said, "There are many areas in Mumbai where the police cannot enter and I have news that some suspicious activities go on in certain areas." If given permission, the Maharashtra Police would need 48 hours to flush out illegal immigrants, he added. "It is necessary to give reply to the protest marches that are being taken out in the country," Thackeray said, adding that the "talk of the National Register of Citizens"

has seen the Muslim community take out rallies "all of a sudden". "How many in those rallies are from India? And why should we support those Muslims who are supporting outsiders?" Thackeray said. He suggested that the government should stop Samjhauta Express before starting National Register of Citizens (NRC). Further Raj Thackeray added that the 'certified Muslims are India's own'. Giving examples of Javed Akhtar, APJ Abdul Kalam and Zaheer Khan Raj Thackeray said, "These people cannot be asked to leave as such people are our own but those illegal Muslim

immigrants from Bangladesh and Pakistan need to be flushed out." In yet another statement which could create controversy, Raj Thackeray said, "The loudspeakers from the mosques should be removed. The Hindus during aarti (prayers) limit the area of worship but the "Muslims too should restrict their area of worship by not playing the loudspeakers". He asserted that if 'Hindutva is attacked he will come out with full force to defend it'. The 'sons of the soil' and 'Hindutva' will be the agenda of MNS and the saffron was always in his heart and the

colour was in his DNA. The MNS chief's statements attract significance against the background of his criticism of the Narendra Modi-led central government in the run-up to the Lok Sabha polls. Earlier in the day, Thackeray had also unveiled his party's new flag, which is saffron in colour. The flag bears, at its centre, a 'rajmudra' (royal seal used during the times of warrior king Chhatrapati Shivaji), at the party's plenary meeting in Mumbai. The party's earlier flag had saffron, blue and green colours. Besides all this Raj Thackeray came down hard on the Uddhav Thackeray (his cousin

brother) government. Commenting on his cousin Uddhav Thackeray Raj said, "He doesn't side with those who change colours to form government." Speculation was rife that the MNS might announce an ideological shift with reports suggesting that the BHP abandoned by its former ally, Shiv Sena, might enter into an alliance with MNS. In the meanwhile MNS's "new look" is viewed as a new sympathiser of BJP in Maharashtra where the Uddhav Thackeray-led Maha Vikas Aghadi has vowed not to implement the CAA and NRC in the state.
