## Union Minister of state Dr. RK Ranjan deliberates on 'MODI@20 "Dreams Meet Delivery'

Imphal, August 21:

Union Minister of state for External Affairs, Dr. RK Ranjan today deliberated the book MODI@20 "Dreams Meet Delivery" while inaugurating the Abhiyan at Moreh College here in Manipur.

The book Modi@20: Dreams meet Delivery was launched on May 11, 2022 at Vigyan Bhawan in New Delhi by Vice President M. Venkaiah Naidu. The book was published by Rupa Publications. It is a collection of twenty-one chapters written by twenty-two domain dignitaries from Home Minister Amit Shah to the National Security Advisor Ajit Doval and Sudha Murty among others.

Dr. Ranjan said that the book is about the twenty years political journey of Prime Minister Narendra Modi ji, first as the three times chief minister of Gujarat and later as two times Prime Minister of India. He served our country both at the state level as well as national level.

He further said that Dr. Ranjan said 'Modi@20: Dreams meet Delivery' is a



book based on the 20 years journey of Prime Minister Sh. Narendra Modi as the head of the government from becoming the Chief Minister of Gujarat in 2001 to being elected as the Prime Minister of India in 2014 and re-elected in 2019. ## Process to elect new Congress president gets underway, party sticks to Sept. 20 schedule; Rahul remains 'disinterested'

New Delhi, August 21:

The process for the election of Congress president got underway on Sunday, with the party's election authority saying it would stick to the schedule of electing a new chief by September 20.

Chairman of the party's Central Election Authority Madhusudan Mistry told PTI that it was up to the Congress Working Committee (CWC) to approve the final date for the election of the Congress chief, which could be any day between August 21 to September 20.

The CWC had decided that elections for block committees and one member each of the Pradesh Congress Committee will be held from April 16 to May 31, 2022; district committee chiefs and executive will be elected between June 1 and July 20, PCC chiefs and AICC members between July 21 and August 20, 2022 and AICC president between August 21 and September 20.

'We will stick to the schedule. We have already forwarded the election schedule to the party leadership and are awaiting a nod from the CWC which will fix the final dates for the Congress president's election,' Mistry told PTI.

Asked if organisational elections at the level of Block, District and Pradesh Congress Committees have concluded, he said the process has been duly completed.

However, Mistry said the Election Authority is in the process of finalising the AICC delegates who will vote in the crucial election for the top party post.

"The exact date will be finalised by the Working Committee," he said, adding that a meeting of the party's top decision-making body will be held soon.

Sonia Gandhi and the party have been saying that the Congress would have its new president by September 20.

It is, meanwhile, learnt that the G-23 is keeping a close watch at the election process and its transparency.

The grouping comprising prominent veterans including former Leader of Opposition in Rajya Sabha Ghulam Nabi Azad and his deputy Anand Sharma, besides Bhupinder Singh Hooda and Manish Tewari, has been insisting on genuine elections right from the block up to the CWC level.

Even as Mistry insisted that the election authority would stick to the poll schedule, the party appeared in the dark on potential candidates for the key race, with former chief Rahul Gandhi continuing to display his unwillingness to contest.

Attempts to reach senior leaders to gauge the mood of the party as the internal elections rolled went in vain with most leaders saying they were unaware of the plan.

As of today, there is no clarity on whether Rahul Gandhi will agree to run for the Congress president's post, with large sections of the party noting that he seemed "disinterested".

He studied till class IX at Regular English School, Kwakeithel Heinou Khongnemi, and later shifted to Kha Imphal High School where he completed his class X. Later he completed Pharmacists course at Bihar and started supporting his family.

Since his childhood Major Sanju was sports admirer and has taken part in many sports events. He is as Blue

Belt in Karate and won many medals in the events of his category in both National and State championship. He had taken up many welfare programme of his locality by becoming an Executive member of Naharol Yaipha Lamjing Kol, Haobam Marak from Leikai.

The essence of his patriotism and the frustration of how Manipur was occupied by India, Major Sanju started connecting the leaders of the PREPAK and started working of the outfit as an over ground worker in 1994.

## 2 suspected terrorists linked to Al Qaeda held in Assam; Had given support to Jihadis from B'desh

Guwahati, August 21:

Assam police on Saturday arrested two suspected terrorists linked to the Al-Qaeda Indian Subcontinent (AQIS) and Ansarullah Bangla Team (ABT) terror groups in the Goalpara district.

After being questioned by police for several hours, the arrested individuals were identified as Abdus Subhan, Imam of Tinkunia Shantipur Mosque under Mormoi police station, and Jalaluddin Sheikh,

Imam of Tilapara Natun Mosque under Matia police station in Goalpara.

According to VV Rakesh Reddy, Superintendent of Police (SP) of Goalpara district, both the individuals were arrested after being grilled for hours.

"We have gotten input in July this year from arrested Abbas Ali who is also linked with Jihadi elements. During the interrogation, we found that they were directly connected with Barpeta and Morigaon modules of AQIS/

ABT in Assam," the SP told.

"During the house searches of the accused persons, a number of incriminating material related to the Al-Qaeda, Jihadi elements, posters, books among other documents were seized along with the mobile phones, SIM cards and ID cards," he added.

The top Assam cop went on to say that the accused had also provided logistical support to the Jihadi terrorists who had arrived from Bangladesh.

## Nitish Kumar may be the new Mascot of Opposition to fight Modi in 2024 polls

### Bihar Chief Minister is drawing up plans to Unite Anti-BJP parties

Patna, August 20:

Here's something about Nitish and the number 7, Circular Road. As Chief Minister, he has been at 7, Circular Road, while using 1, Anna Marg, the official residence as his office. Now, with CM severing his five-year-old old alliance with the BJP and walking over to the Mahagathabandhan camp, many point that to a famous Delhi address— 7, Kalyan Marg (Racecourse Road), the official residence of Prime Minister—could be in his mind. After all, as he left NDA, Nitish Kumar, sent out dare, couched as prophesy, to the current occupant of 7, Lok Kalyan Marg:

"the one who came to power in 2014, would he also return in 2024 to Lok Kalyan".

Though there has been much talk about Nitish's growing discomfort with an "overbearing" BJP, the stark message to have emerged out of Nitish's U-turn is his rekindled national ambition. Though he hasn't spoken openly about his PM hopes and continues to talk about "serving" Bihar, soon after taking oath as CM for the record eighth times. Nitish has urged all opposition parties to start preparing for the 2024 Lok Sabha elections. JD(U) sources hint he may soon start touring other states to explore the chances of a broader national coalition to

take on BJP in the 2024 elections.

JD(U) national spokesperson K C Tyagi said, "we have been getting very positive response (about Nitish Kumar walking out of NDA). Just the thought of Nitish Kumar playing an important role in national politics looks exciting. It is too early to say, but Nitish Kumar has recharged the opposition".

Saying Mahagathabandhan, an alliance of seven parties that has the JD(U), RJD and Congress, besides other parties could "offer a template for a national opposition against the BJP", another top JD(U) leader said, "Bihar has been the factory of political experiments

and coalition. The BJP is now up against a tough opposition in Bihar. Who knows, there might be a strong opposition at the national level too".

JD(U) sources point out that Nitish has nothing left to prove in state politics. He is credited with turning around Bihar's fortunes after its long years of decay and for building a formidable social coalition built around women and extremely backward classes among OBCs. He is also state's longest serving CM, having broken the record of 16 years held by Dr. Srikrishna Singh, Bihar's first CM. As a close Nitish aide says now only posts of Deputy PM and PM are left to be achieved.

But those sceptical of a larger national role for Nitish or the possibility of him becoming the Opposition's joint face against Modi point to his 'paltanum' image, the consummate politician who has swung between camps with the ease of a trapeze artiste.

Nitish, who joined hands with the BJP in 1995, first quit the NDA in 2013, in run up to Lok Sabha elections, when it became clear that Narendra Modi would be the prime ministerial candidate. Though he did openly pitch himself for the post, he was evidently uneasy about Modi's growing profile. When he finally parted ways with the BJP in 2013, it was on the ground

that NDA should have a leader with a "clean and secular image".

Then in the run up to 2015 polls, Nitish did the unthinkable by joining hands with his old socialist fellow travellers and later foe, Lalu Prasad of RJD. In the elections that year, held two years after Nitish quit NDA, the coalition got 178 with the BJP reduced to 53 seats. Nitish had found his sweet revenge against Modi.

Barely two years later, in 2017, he snapped ties with the RJD citing his no corruption plank as the CBI booked RJD leader and now his Deputy CM, Tejaswi Yadav, in the IRCTC case.

# Kalyan Singh: The pillar of Ram Mandir movement

The country witnessed two major movements in the early Nineties, one the Mandal and other the Kamandal (i.e. Ram Mandir) Movement. Overall, the Mandal Movement was led by the OBC leadership of socialist background, while the Mandir movement was led by the Upper caste leadership of Jan Sangh & RSS background. The nineties also saw the emergence of some powerful backward leaders in the BJP like Kalyan Singh, Vinay Katiyar, Om Prakash Singh & others, who helped it to gain power at the centre in the long run. In strengthening the roots of BJP among depressed sections of the society and expanding its mass base, these leaders offer their best.

Born on 5<sup>th</sup> January 1932 in a backward Lodhi family, Kalyan Singh played significant role in the power politics of Uttar Pradesh. In his early life, he worked as a Swayamsevak of RSS. He contested for the first time in 1967 from Atrali constituency for the Uttar Pradesh Vidhan Sabha on Bharatiya

Jan Sangh ticket. He contested ten times from the same constituency and won nine times, except in 1980. He was jailed for 21 months during the Emergency in 1975. In 1977 he was included in the State cabinet as the Health Minister. He has been BJP state general secretary in 1980 and president in 1984 and 1987. In 1989 he became the leader of the BJP in the UP Vidhan Sabha.

Articulate & politically suave, Kalyan Singh was the chief architect of the Ayodhya movement. He was the prominent leader of the BJP, formulating and executing the strategies for the Party's rise in UP, the most populous & central power controlling state. In 1991, when the BJP got an absolute majority under his leadership in the UP Vidhan Sabha election, he was sworn in as the 16<sup>th</sup> Chief Minister on 24<sup>th</sup> June 1991. After the demolition of the disputed Ram Mandir-Babri structure in Ayodhya on 6<sup>th</sup> December 1992, he resigned from Chief Minister post owing moral responsibility and President Rule was imposed by the President Shankar Dayal Sharma.

The short tenure of Kalyan Singh is remembered for strict & good governance in the State and reforms in various sectors. He gave impetus to the development works with social justice. His government chalk out Masterplan for the development of the historical & spiritual place of Ayodhya and acquired 2.27 Acre of land surrounding the disputed structure for the construction of the Ram Chabutra.

Although he had given affidavit in Supreme Court that he would not allow damage to the structure, but he refused to order fire on the crowd when the Karsevaks turned aggressive and demolished it. Along with other stalwarts he was also accused of conspiring over the incident, which he vehemently denied. He clarified that the incident was an outpouring of the sentiments of Crores of people, whose aspirations has been forcibly subdued for hundreds of years. Despite all security arrangement, the structure came down. Had firing been ordered, thousands of people would have been killed. His sacrifice of the Chief Ministership did not go in vain; as in case of no demolition probably the courts would have ordered Status Quo.

He again became the Chief Minister of UP on 21<sup>st</sup> September 1997 according to the 6-month rotational power-sharing formula between the BJP and the BSP. The BSP withdrew support to the government, but with the support of a faction of Congress Legislatures, he continued as CM. On 21<sup>st</sup> February 1998, Naresh Agrawal withdrew support to the government. The Governor Romesh Bhandari dismissed the government and invited Jagdambika Pal to form the Government; but the Allahabad High Court did not allow the formation of such type of government. Ultimately Naresh Agrawal had to return back to the BJP. Kalyan Singh proved his majority and form the government again. On having tussle with

Party stalwart Atalji he had to resign on 12<sup>th</sup> November 1999 and ultimately he left BJP in December 1999.

He formed the political outfit "Rashtriya Kranti Dal"; but in 2004, on the request of Vajpayee he came back into BJP and became an MP from the Bulandshahar Lok Sabha constituency. He again got upset with the BJP and became member of Lok Sabha from Etawah constituency in 2009 as an independent candidate. He joined SP in 2009, but return back to BJP in 2013.

He served as the 21<sup>st</sup> Governor of Rajasthan from 4<sup>th</sup> September 2014 to 8<sup>th</sup> September 2019 and was given the additional charge of Governor of HP from 28<sup>th</sup> January 2015 to 12<sup>th</sup> August 2015. When Supreme Court judgement came in 2019 to the pave the way for Ram Janma Bhoomi Mandir, he did not hesitate to express his pleasure. He said that his dream has been fulfilled & he wanted to live till the Mandir is constructed. In November 2020, a special CBI court had acquitted all 32 accused in disputed structure demolition case.

Kalyan Singh was the perfect blend of Mandal as well as Kamandal and was termed as "Hindu Hriday Samrat" by the Party cadres. After a prolonged illness he said goodbye to his struggling life on 21<sup>st</sup> August 2021, but left behind glorious remembrance of nationalism and governance. His demise has created vacuum in UP politics, which could not be filled soon.


It's a piece of cake if you know

# Child should always be taught discipline without tears

One would find that in the present day in schools the children are oriented in a defined way of learning where the teacher imparted a systematized way of education through which children acquire some general and professional skills etc. But the home learning has tended to orient itself to goals which are of fundamental importance to a community where in social change the children marks the crux of its further development in their life. Normally our schools are closed for summer vacation when the children are not de-

manded to take part in economic activities. It is necessary that the schools timings have to be adjusted to the needs of the community, depending on the locality etc. It is also found that majority of parents particularly in the rural areas send their children to school till they are grown up and capable of taking up economically gainful activities and the percentage of dropouts is significantly much higher among girls than for the boys.

The Supreme Court has held that the right to education is a fundamental right under Article 21 of the Constitution and that the state is obliged to provide education to children at the primary level. Good education is not only desirable in itself but is also essential for the empowerment of our people. Education should be viewed as a basic human right leading to empowerment and awareness. The politicization of education poses a serious threat to society. It is necessary for the authorities to investigate whether reservation has genuinely helped the backward sections of society. The gov-

ernment should address this problem on an urgent basis and take a holistic approach to it. Granting everyone the right to education is not enough in itself. It is the duty of the State to ensure proper implementation of this law in every section of the society. The 25 per cent reservation for poor kids is a terrible insult to the majority of India's children. It is like the 'two-tumbler' system that prevails in many villages. The government should take effective steps to provide sound education to students from the backward classes rather than just creating quotas. What is more important is to ensure that proper facilities are provided in schools and the best teachers recruited to teach children in their formative years. Right to education will remain a dream unless sincere efforts are made to create the necessary infrastructure.

Today one would clearly find that the child is by no means a helpless victim of parents and teachers who are active agents of change in their life. The conflict between the child and the

adult is not confined to home. Today the child insists on doing something whose consequences the teacher or parents in his mature wisdom thinks will be unpleasant where the parents prevent their child to do so but it must be remembered that sometimes-unpleasant consequences also remove the illusion which the child may have nurtured about his ability whose outcome is defiance. It is also found that parents and teachers praise the child sky high for every achievement but over praise makes the child an addict like an alcoholic and he never wants to do anything if praise does not comes and he is not ready to listen critics of his performance. As the child grows up, he should be allowed to become independent and should be allowed to make mistakes so that he can learn from them. There are many parents who are too sensitive about what people will think of their children. A child should never be bribed to do what he is asked to do but he should always be taught discipline without tears.

# 'Tell me where you want me to come': Manish Sisodia after CBI issues look out notice

New Delhi, August 21:

The Central Bureau of Investigation (CBI) on Sunday issued a look out circular against Delhi Deputy Chief Minister Manish Sisodia and 13 others in connection with the alleged corruption in the implementation of the Delhi Excise Policy.

All the 14 people, including Manish Sisodia were named in the FIR filed by the CBI in the case.

A look out circular prevents an individual from leaving the country and the person can be detained if they are found violating the said condition.

Manish Sisodia reacted to the notice and hit out at Prime Minister Modi saying, "What is this drama?"

Sisodia further said, "It's unfortunate that the prime minister keeps thinking about whom the CBI should issue a 'Look Out Circular' today. Today, the country is looking for a leader who can give solutions to inflation and unemployment. The public will give a 'look out notice' to them in 2024."



BJP leader Kapil Mishra hit out at Sisodia's tweet directed at PM Modi and said, "Is the education minister of Delhi so illiterate and stupid that he does not understand the meaning of look out notice?"

The CBI's FIR in the case states that Manish Sisodia and other public servants accused in the case took decisions pertaining to the excise policy 2021-22 without the approval of competent authority with "an intention to extend undue

favours to the licensees post tender".

According to the FIR, at least two payments in crores were allegedly made to "close associates" of Sisodia by Sameer Mahendru, the owner of Indospirit, one of the liquor traders involved in irregularities in the framing and implementation of the excise policy.

The CBI on Saturday summoned some of the accused in the case for a detailed interro-

gation. According to sources, few among those summoned by the central agency are perceived as close aides of Manish Sisodia.

Meanwhile, Sisodia held a press conference on Saturday, a day after the CBI conducted a raid on his house and hit out at the BJP and Modi government for targeting him. He denied the charges against him and said he was being targeted for holding a position in Arvind Kejriwal's cabinet.

# India logs 11,539 new Covid-19 cases, active cases below one-lakh mark

New Delhi, August 21:

India on Sunday reported 11,539 new Covid-19 infections in the past 24 hours, taking the country's active caseload to 99,879, according to the Union Health Ministry data. Yesterday, the country had 1,01,166 active cases.

A total of 12,783 people have recovered from the coronavirus infection in the last 24 hours, taking the total number of recoveries to 4,37,12,218 in the country. The recovery rate remains consistent at 98.59%.

In India, the daily positivity rate is 3.75%, while the weekly positivity rate stands at 3.88%. More than 88.24 crore tests have been conducted to detect coronavirus infection in the country since the onset of the global pandemic.

Under the nationwide vaccination drive, more than 209.67 crore Covid-19 vaccine doses have been administered to the eligible beneficiaries so far, including

26,58,755 doses administered in the last 24 hours.

So far, the central government has provided more than 200.02 crores (2,00,28,66,975) vaccine doses to States/ Union Territories, out of which, over 7.04 crore (7,04,44,690) unutilized doses are still available with them, the ministry added.

Meanwhile, Delhi on Saturday reported 1,109 new Covid-19 cases and 9 deaths. The city's Covid positivity rate was at 11.23 %. Saturday's addition brought the total active case count to 5,559.

More than two and a half years into the coronavirus pandemic, researchers have achieved a breakthrough in combating the deadly virus that keeps mutating and evading the immunity response humans develop owing to the available vaccines.

What started with coronavirus, has further delved into Delta variant, Omicron Variant, and their respective sub-variants, thereby causing an alarming

ebb and flow of new covid-19 cases throughout the globe.

At such a time, researchers have claimed that they have discovered a vulnerability, a 'weak spot', across all variants that could help in developing a more targeted antibody treatment. They found an antibody fragment VH Ab6. This fragment is known to be effective against the Alpha, Beta, Gamma, Delta, Kappa, Epsilon, and Omicron variants.

To understand the fragment- The VH Ab6 is known to neutralize SARS-CoV-2 by attaching to the epitope on the spike protein and blocking the virus from entering human cells, according to a statement published by the University of British Columbia.

An expert has mentioned that this key vulnerability can now be exploited by drug manufacturers, and as the site is relatively mutation-free, the resulting treatments could be effective against existing—and even future—variants.

# Assam to suspend internet today to curb cheating in recruitment exams

Guwahati, August 21:

As the Assam government is all set to hold the recruitment exam to fill 30,000 government posts in various departments which is by far the largest recruitment drive in the state, mobile internet services will remain suspended around the examination centres during the exam hours to avert any untoward incident.

Around 14 lakh candidates will appear for the examinations.

The internet services won't be available within a 100 meters radius of the examination centre.

tion centre.

The first phase of the examination for filling Grade-III and Grade-IV posts is to be held today, followed by August 28 and September 11.

Besides, section 144 of CrPc is being promulgated in some places where the examinations are to be held besides tight security arrangements have been made in every examination centre.

Earlier this week, Assam Chief Minister Himanta Biswa Sarma held a virtual meeting with deputy commissioners and other stakeholders to ensure the smooth conduct of the exams.

He told the DCs that there should be no complacency, which could compromise the sanctity of the examination.

He also asked the DCs and SPs to be ready with their men and materials to thwart unscrupulous elements from disrupting the examination process.

There will be one nodal officer in each of the 25 districts where examinations are going to be held and government gazetted officers will also be put into action for each examination centre as observers to ensure that the SOPs are properly and satisfactorily executed.

# Nagaland: Naga Students Federation for wearing traditional attire in educational institutions once a week

The Naga Students Federation (NSF) has resolved to appeal to all the educational institutions under the Naga homeland to allow students from Class V onwards to wear Naga traditional attire once a week in order to protect the Naga cultural identity.

"It is not an imposition but an appeal to the institutions," NSF president K Tep said at a press conference held after the student body conducted the third federal assembly of its 2021-2023 tenure here on Saturday.

Tep said the NSF assembly discussed various issues confronting the Naga people, particularly the student community.

He lamented that the Nagaland government has failed to make operational the Nagaland Staff Selection Board (NSSB) three years after officially notifying its constitution.

Tep explained that the NSF has demanded the setting up of the NSSB to ensure meritocracy and fairness in the employment process and do away with backdoor appointments.

He said they will resort to democratic forms of protests until and unless the NSSB is not made fully functional.

The NSF has also resolved to appeal to the government of India to deliver justice to the families of those killed in a botched ambush by army personnel in Mon district of the state on December 4, 2021.

Tep said the NSF will continue to fight till the families of the victims get justice.

Deliberating the Armed Forces Special Powers Act (AFSPA) in force in the Naga homeland, the student body resolved not to extend cooperation to the Indian armed forces.

Tep said no individual or group across the Naga homeland will accept any humanitarian

aid from the Indian armed forces nor will they be invited to any event organised in the Naga homeland. He added that no individual or group will partake in any official event of the Indian armed forces.

He said the black flag will be hoisted across the Naga homeland as a mark of protest against the AFSPA.

Replying to a question on the launch of the second phase of agitation against the Citizenship Amendment Act (CAA) by the North East Students Organisation (NESO) on August 18, Tep said the NSF has not received any intimation from the NESO in this regard.

the 2024 Lok Sabha election. "People in many states do not know Kejriwal and his party. It would be very good for the BJP if Kejriwal is the Opposition's face for the 2024 election as most people have not even heard his name," he told reporters in Guwahati on Saturday.

Reacting to the allegations of the AAP that the Centre is trying to destroy the health service model initiated by the Kejriwal-led Delhi government, the Assam Chief Minister remarked that Delhi's 'mohalla clinic

ics' cannot be a model for health service.

"People may visit Assam to see how we are promoting the medical colleges and providing health services to each and every area of all the districts in the state," Saram said.

The AAP on Saturday reportedly said that "misusing the power of the central government", the BJP has been trying to stop Arvind Kejriwal because work and performances in the education and health sector of Delhi government is being discussed abroad as well.

"The BJP government at the Centre is concerned about Arvind Kejriwal because they foresee him as the main challenger to Modi in the upcoming general election," Sisodia said in Delhi.

He also claimed that in the 2024 election, the main electoral battle would be between the AAP and the BJP.

The CBI had carried out searches at Sisodia's home and many other locations on Friday over the allegations of corruption in Delhi's liquor policy.

## Process to elect new Congress....

Whether that will change will perhaps determine the exact schedule for the Congress president's election, considering the majority of party leaders want Rahul Gandhi to don the mantle, even as he continues to evade the responsibility.

In May 2019, Sonia Gandhi had agreed to become interim president of the party after Rahul Gandhi resigned following the Congress loss in general elections.

Even at that time, an exten-

sive CWC consultation had favoured Rahul Gandhi to continue and urged him to do so. After he declined the party's highest decision-making body requested Sonia Gandhi to step in.

For several months after May 2019, there was complete silence within the Congress circles on the election of a full-time party chief until late July 2020 when G-23 leaders in a letter to Sonia Gandhi sought urgent elections across all levels of the party, to revive its

sagging electoral fortunes. Subsequently on October 16, 2021, the CWC approved a tentative schedule for the internal elections, culminating in the poll for the highest position in the party - that of the Congress president.

Meanwhile, there appears to be no formal discussion in the Congress on a non-Gandhi to succeed Sonia Gandhi, with some leaders saying that the incumbent chief might well stay on the post if this situation of fluidity continues.

## Major Sanju's demise has left....

In 1995 Major Sanju was arrested by Manipur Police Commando and detained him for 14 months under NSA.

After his release, he again contacted with the PREPAK leaders and he was arrested and detained 8 months in judicial custody in December 1996. Again in November 1997 he was arrested and detained for 5 months at Imphal Central Jail. He was tried to arrest twice after released but managed to free after getting bail.

The statement added that, unable to tolerate the harassment meted out to him he left his home and in July 2003 he underwent Basic Military Training of the Red Army. He was friendly with the Red Army of PREPAK during his training and maintain discipline of the Party.

Major Sanju was assigned as Publicity Officer of PREPAK to the department of Publicity and Propaganda. He took responsibility in bridging communication between the media

and the party and later he also became a member of the Polit Bureau (PB).

Besides, Major Sanju also took additional charge of becoming the Financial Affairs' Committee (FAC), Publicity Committee and Home Committee of CorCom, the PREPAK statement said and added that the PREPAK and its Red Army share the pain and sorrow of the family members of Major Sanju and pray to rest in peace for the departed soul.

## Ex-Union minister Anand Sharma resigns as chairman of Steering Committee of Himachal Congress

In a major setback to Congress ahead of the Assembly elections in Himachal Pradesh, former Union minister Anand Sharma on Sunday tendered his resignation as the chairman of Steering Committee of the party's state unit. He, however, will continue to participate in election campaigns for the party candidates.

In a letter to Congress chief Sonia Gandhi, he reportedly said that his self-respect is "non-negotiable" and he has resigned from the post.

Sharma, who is considered among the tallest leaders of Himachal Pradesh, has reportedly told the Congress president in his letter that his self-respect has been hurt as he has not been consulted or invited for any of the meetings of the party.

His resignation comes soon after another leader of the G23 grouping Ghulam Nabi Azad resigned as chairman of the campaign committee in Jammu and Kashmir a few days ago.

The former union minister and deputy leader of the Congress in Rajya Sabha, Anand Sharma, was appointed as chairman of the Steering Committee in Himachal Pradesh on April 26.

Both Azad and Sharma are prominent leaders of the G23

grouping which has been critical of the decisions of the party leadership.

The grouping comprising prominent veterans including Bhupinder Singh Hooda and Manish Tewari has been insisting on genuine elections right from the block up to the CWC level.

Sharma, who first contested Assembly elections in 1982 and was given a Rajya Sabha ticket by then prime minister Indira Gandhi in 1984, has been a Rajya Sabha member ever since and has occupied several key positions in the party.

Nitish's last stint in the Mahagathbandhan camp was anything but smooth. Only five months into the arrangement, the stress had started showing with the JD(U) accusing the RJD of interference. Nitish was no longer the last word in the matter of

governance, as he had been in the NDA. While the BJP had no strong state leader to match Nitish's charisma, here in the Mahagathbandhan, he had shared space and spotlight with Lalu and family. The RJD leader's constant reference to Nitish as chotte bhai (younger brother) is also believed to have rankled Nitish.

All that, JD(U) sources insist, is behind them now. Nitish and Tejswi have reportedly worked out a working arrangement. Tejswi has already been granted Z-plus security, a perk Nitish's deputies in the BJP — Sushil Kumar Modi, Tarkishore Prasad and Renu Devi — never enjoyed. (IPA Service)

A cross from the left found Nikum right in front of ATKMB goalie and he made no mistake to give RUFC a famous victory.
