

## Mob sets ablaze police station after cop allegedly shot dead a woman in Kakching

### JAC formed, sit-in-protest staged, warns intense agitation if fails to punish the culprits

Imphal, Dec 24:

A lady died yesterday evening at around 10 pm after she was hit by a bullet fired by one police personnel in front of a shop at Pallel Mamang Leikai in Chandel District. Following the death an angry mob set ablaze the old police station located at Pallel. At least 3 police personnel were injured in the mob attacked.

The Police fire several tear

gas shells to disperse the mob. The angry mobs are demanding to hand over the policeman involved in the crime to them.

According to report, the deceased lady came to buy beetle nuts from the shop. At the time the police man identified as Kongkham Birjit, an employee of the Manipur Police Wireless Services (MPWS) had an heated argument with the lady owner of the shop and fired a shot from his pistol. The bullet hit the lady identified as

Maming Moirangthem Jeemi Devi (36), wife of M. Kiran of Pallel Mamang Leikai. She was immediately rushed to Jeevan Hospital at Kakching. The accused Kongkham Birjit, who is attached to the Pallel Police station, managed to escape from the scene.

The residents in and around the Pallel Bazaar stormed to the Pallel police station at night and demanded to hand over the "killer" to them.

Following the failure to ful-

fill the demand, the irate mob set the abandoned Pallel police station on fire and caused injuries to 3 policemen.

Around Rs. 50,000/- worth cloths for sale which was kept at the old police station were reportedly burnt and a car park near the building was also damaged.

Three fire tenders rushed from the Kakching district were pressed into service to control the fire but the fire destroyed 60 per cent of the old police station.

The cause of the crime is under investigation, the sources added.

Meanwhile, A Joint Action Committee Against the Murder of Jeemi has been formed on Saturday.

A memorandum has also been submitted to the Chief Minister demanding to terminate the service of Birjit immediately, to provide ex-gratia of Rs 20 lakhs to the next of kin of the victim, and to give a suitable govt job to the next of the kin of the victim.

## CM inspects preparation for G-20 event at Sangai Ethnic Park

Chief Minister N. Biren Singh today visited the Sangai Ethnic Park at Moirang Khunou and inspected the development works taken up there prior to the G20 event which will be held in the State from 16th to 18th February, 2023. He also later visited the INA Memorial Complex being developed at Moirang.

Briefing the media at the INA Memorial Complex, N. Biren Singh informed about the likely visit of the Union Home Minister Amit to the State in January next year. As such the State Government had requested the Union Home Minister to hoist the 165 feet high Indian National Flag, which is

being installed inside the INA Memorial Complex. He continued that a Memorial site for those 185 brave soldiers who joined the then Indian National Army, to liberate India from the British, would also be developed. The Memorial site would also be inaugurated by the Union Home Minister during his visit, he added.

Mentioning his visit to the Sangai Ethnic Park, the Chief Minister further informed that a session of G20 Summit 2023 would also be held in the State. As such, representatives of participating countries will also visit different places of the State, including Loktak Lake, Sangai Ethnic Park and others, during their visit to the State for the session, he added. He also informed that the Grand

Finale of Femina Miss India would be held at the Sangai Ethnic Park in the first week of April, 2023. He continued that he had visited the park to see the progress of the development and to ensure its completion before the G20 session.

N. Biren reiterated Union Home Minister Amit Shah's appreciation of the State Government's War on Drugs Campaign and the alternative crop plantation initiatives taken up by the Government. He mentioned that the State Government had been providing awareness to different villages at hill areas regarding the ill effects of poppy plantations and the alternative livelihood measures taken up by the Government.
