

All arrangements for dispersal of polling parties made

Holding Public Meetings prohibited during silence period - Rajesh Agrawal



III News Imphal, Feb 24:

With the General Election to the Manipur Legislative Assembly 2022 nearing its poll date, all arrangements for dispersal of polling parties have been made. Webcasting/ videography will be done in all Polling Stations. A statement by Rajesh

A statement by Rajesh Agrawal, Chief Electoral Officer, Manipur said that adequate CAPF will also be deployed in all polling stations. ASHA and Anganwadi workers are engaged while two volunteers will also be engaged in each polling station for assisting voters. Voter Assistance Booth will be set up in all polling stations. Provision for Pick up/Drop facilities for PwD and aged electors are made available with wheelchair facility being provided.

To ensure safe voting for electors, all polling stations will be sanitised one day before poll. Earmarking of circles, token system will be in place to avoid crowding in polling stations and adequate sanitiser, mask, glove, face shield, PPE kit etc. will be provided to polling parties.

During the Silence period which starts from 48 hours prior to close of poll, presence of political functionaries from outside the Constituency will be restricted Election matters shall not to be telecasted/broadcasted in radio, TV or similar apparatus, while pre-certifica-tion by State/District MCMC is mandatory for publication of political advertisement in newspaper during the period. Public Meeting, procession etc will also be prohibited. On poll day, candidates shall not canvass within 200 metres of polling station. Candidates shall also not enter polling booth with security. No one will be allowed to carry mobile phones inside the polling booth except for the Pr siding Officer and Polling Of-

As per Section - 126 of the Repre ntation of People Act 1951, holding public meeting is prohibited during period of forty-eight hours ending with hour fixed for conclusion of poll. No person shall convene, hold or attend, join or address any public meeting or procession in connection with an election. No person shall also display to the public any election matter by means of cinematograph, television or other similar apparatus. No person shallpropagate any election matter to the public by holding, or by arranging the holding of, any musical concert or any theatrical perfor-mance or any other entertainment or amusement with a view

 in the oralization with a view to attracting the members of the public thereto, in any polling t area. Further, any person who contravenes the above provisions shall be punishable with imprisonment for a term which may extend to two years, or with

Regarding Identity Proof for ting, ECI has discontinued Photo Voter Slip as an identity proof with effect from 8thFebruary, 2019. Photo Voter Slip is no longer a Standalone Identity Proof. For identification at Polling Station, voter shall present her/his EPIC or any dentification documents approved by the Commission, which include Aadhaar Card, MNREGA Job Card, Passbooks with photograph issued by Bank/PostOffice, Health Insurance Smart Card issued under the scheme of Ministry of Labour, Driving License, PAN Card, Smart Card issued by RGI under NPR, Indian Passport, Pension document with photograph, Service Identity Cards with photograph issued to employees by Central/State Govt./ PSUs/Public Limited Companies and Official identity cards issued to MPs/MLAs/MLCs along with the Voter Information

Sips. For making the upcoming elections inclusive, accessible and participative, provision of Postal Ballots (PB) had been made available. Postal Ballots for service electors have been issued to all 21944 electors electronically and 147 have been received till data. 19263 voters on election duty have applied for postal ballottil date and 1512 issued out of which 1454 received. Further, 5928 postal ballots have been issued to Absentee voters out of which 5608 postal ballots received till date.

Pre-Poll violence Man shot at leg for supporting BJP workers; spewed communal venom

Earlier pre-poll violence occurred in the state never reflected communal politics in the poll-bound state of Manipur, however, for the first time, a member of a family belonging to a minority community in Keirao Assembly constituency was allegedly shot at thigh by a supporter of NPP candidate belonging to the minority community for supporting BJP candidate belonging to another community at the same assembly constituency. The supporters of the NPP candidate also allegedly thrashed the sister of the injured victim using a brick.

Sahauddin who was shot at thigh was undergoing treatment at Raj Medicity Hospital.

The incident happened at around 8.30 pm yesterday at Kiyamgei Taphok Makha in Keirao Assembly constituency. Family members told Imphal Times that Sahauddin was hit by the bullet while trying to protect one of his brothers i dentified as Kh.

ers identified as Kh. Masiruddin, after one Rakiuddin, son of late Tomba along with large number of his friends stopped their vehicle and shot at them. According to family members of Sahauddin, Rakiuddin the person who shot Sahauddin is t serving in the Commando Unit of Thoubal Police. The incident happened when i Sahauddin along with his , three younger brothers were returning after they failed to find their ailing aunty, Sophia wife of Mosiruddin said.

wife of Mosiruddin said. "The vehicle was also dismantled by around 100 people who are supporters of NPP candidate Md. A Public Interest Litigation (PIL) has been filed in the High Court of Manipur, challenging the declaration of Disturbed Area under the AFSPA in Manipur. Sanoujam Shyamcharan Singh, 61, filed the netition under Article 226.

the petition under Article 226, seeking to withdraw the 'disturbed area' status from the entire state. The petition seeks to

The petition seeks to quash a notification issued by the Special Secretary (Home), Government of Manipur, on December 8, 2021. The notification declared "Disturbed Area" in the entire area of the State of Manipur, excluding the Imphal Municipal Area under the provisions of the Armed Forces (Special Powers) Act, 1958.

The matter is moved today before a division bench comprising of Chief Justice and Justice MV Muralidaran. p In the course of the protceeding, after hearing the sub-

ceeding, after hearing the submission of the counsel for the Petitioner, Mr. Meihoubam Rakesh, the Court issued a notice of motion which was made returnable on March 31, 2022. Accordingly, Ld. Advoc ate General, Manipur, Mr. N. Kumarjit Singh, Sr. Advocate, accepted notice on behalf of the Respondents.

In the wake of the Oting massacre in Nagaland,

Manipur Chief Minister N Biren Singh claimed that the State Cabinet had asked the Centre to remove the 'Disturbed Area' tag from Manipur. However, the status was extended for another year despite their repeated assurance to the public that their government will continuously push the Center to remove the status.

On December 8, a state Home department's notification stated the Governor of Manipur has given "ex-post facto approval to declare the entire State of Manipur excluding the Imphal Municipal Area as "Disturbed Area" for 1(one) year with retrospective effect from December 1, 2021." contd. on page 4

It can carry 170 kg of weight, which means two persons can comfortably travel on this bicycle. This e-cycle is going to be very useful for common people in rural areas. As soon as the Dhruv Vidyut Electric Conversion Kit is installed, the bicycle starts flying. Industrialist Anand Mahindra has shown interest in this e-bicycle kit.

Mahindra has great interest in *jugaad* and inventions useful for the com-mon people. Sharing the video of this bicycle on his Twitter, Mahindra wrote that the device is resistant to both fire and muddy conditions and is quite lightweight also. He wrote in his tweet that it is not that this is the world's first device, but it has a compact design and is capable of running the cycle on rough roads. Thirdly, with the help of this kit, the cyclist can also charge his mobile phone. Mahindra has expressed his willingness to invest money in this venture. What he liked the most about this kit was that it can make the life of the common people of India comfortable and efficient. This will prove to be a boon for the hardworking people of the country. Raghavendra Singh's and Thakur's words, and the actions of the Hindu-supremacist outfits in Karnataka, offer a preview of what the BJP's version of "Uniform Civil Code" will be. "Uniformity" will mean the erasure of plurality, not gender justice, in

plural and culturallyspecific civil codes. When the Constitution adopted the goal of the 'Uniform Civil Code', the vord 'uniform' in the Indian mind may have been innocent of the taint of Hindu-supremacy. But since the 1990s, 'uniform civil code' no longer just means a civil code that is 'commonly' accepted by and accessible to all citi-zens. The Rashtriya Swayamsevak Sangh [RSS] and BJP campaigns have ensured that 'uniform' now spells a violent erasure of the 'particular' and 'specific' cultures of minorities, especially Muslims. Muslims will have to be subject to the codes of "Hindu Samaj" since Hindu-ness will no longer be treated as a specific faith, but instead as the nation itself.

The issue was never the hijab's compatibility with school uniforms, or its association with patriarchal pre-scriptions of modesty – after all, Sikh turbans are worn with uniforms even in the police and armed forces, and the dupatta, pallu, ghoonghat, and sindoor, all have equally patriarchal associations. The reason for targeting the hijab was always to humiliate, harass, and isolate Muslims and, eventually, force them to assimilate to Hindu-ness -"wear tilak", in other words.

It is already happening in Karnataka. In colleges where 'Saraswati Puja' (a ritual worship of the Hindu goddess of learning) has just been officially celebrated by the administration, Muslim students and teachers are being forced to strip off their headscarves or burga (the loose outer garment) before they enter the campuses. Hindus can wear bindis, and pottu and tilak; Sikh men can wear turbans: Hindus, Christians, Sikhs alike can wear religious lockets, bracelets or threads: wearing symbols of their faith in the same spaces where Muslims can-not wear hijabs.

There is a criminal law analogy in the BJP spin on the Uniform Civil Code. Prime Minister Narendra Modi insists that it is an affront to Hindus to sug gest that any Hindu could ever be a terrorist: he is implying that draconian terror laws like the Unlawful Activities (Prevention) Act [UAPA] or the sedition laws are not meant to apply to Hindus. When Hindus conspire to instigate or organise the massacre of Muslims as Thakur is accused of doing they can not only evade being charged under such laws: they can even claim the mantle of patriotism. Instead, UAPA or the sedition law are now almost exclusively applied to Muslims who are a religious minority, or to Left activists or intellectuals who are seen as an ideological enemy of the 'Hindu nation'

Just like terrorism is not terrorism when done for the Hindu-supremacist cause, desertion of your wife is not a crime when a Hindu man does it. It is a punishable crime onlywhen a Muslim man deserts his wife, by resorting to "instant triple talaq" – which is a le-gally untenable form of divorce. The BJP's campaign for the 'Uniform Civil Code', like its campaign against the hijab, quite explicitly states that Muslims as a community embody separat-ism, patriarchy, violence against women, and medieval social regression, while Hindus, by definition, are 'safe'

benignly 'protective', and progressive The hijab is today being stigmatised as a visible embodiment of the Indian Muslim's wilful separatism. Similar practices like covering the head with a pallu or even covering the face with the ghoonghat, or the wearing of Hindu symbols like the kalava thread or the kada bracelet are "Indian culture' - not to be compared with the alien' and 'regressive' hijab or burqa. Members of the Hindu Janjagran Samiti [HJS] can be seen these days on TV, defending the prohibition on wearing a hijab inside schools or colleges. The HJS website, and that of its sister organisation the Sanatan Sanstha, have posts full of pseudo-science explaining why covering one's head with the pallu of one's sari is beneficial for Hindu women, while wearing clothes like skirts or jeans or T-shirts is harmful! But these gents can publicly campaign against the Muslim headscarf as something intolerable. Remember, the young women in Udupi are not demanding that other women wear a hijab they are merely wanting to study in peace while wearing their hijabs.

It would be a mistake to see this attack on the hijab as merely an election ploy, even though the BJP is also deploying it as such. It is part of the larger project of gradually putting in place and acclimatising Indians to a legal and governmental infrastructure suited to a Hindu-supremacist India. And every element of that infrastruc-ture the BJP introduces, is in keeping with the RSS's vision of a Hindu Nation. The campaign to erase the hijab is in keeping with the kind of forced asrelationships." The capacity to manage ourselves plays a vital role in living one' life and managing one's re-sponsibilities. This capacitates you to deal with your reactions and maintain relationships (with yourself and others). Self-awareness enables you to perceive your personality, motivations, responses to situations, behaviours, emotions, habits, and thoughts." The first thing you have to know is yourself. similation RSS founding father Golwalkar wrote of in his book 'We or Our Nationhood Defined': "The foreign races in Hindusthan must either adopt the Hindu culture and language. must learn to respect and hold in reverence Hindu religion, must entertain no idea but those of the glorification of the Hindu race and culture, i.e., of the Hindu nation and must lose their sepa

rate existence to merge in the Hindu race, or may stay in the country, wholly subordinated to the Hindu Nation claiming nothing, deserving no privileges, far less any preferential treatment not even citizen's rights." Deen Dayal Upadhyay, another RSS

leader whose bigotry is veiled by mumbo-jumbo about "integral humanism", said much the same as Golwalkar. In an article titled Akhand Bharat (Undi-vided India) from 1953, Upadhyay wrote of the need to find a solution for what he called the 'separatist and anti-na-tional attitude of the Muslim community.' He asked if the Indian National Congress party, that government much of India, want that "Muslims should be driven out of India"? If not, he said, Muslims "will have to be assimilated into the national life of this country"; in other words, Muslims must be "made Indian." In the next breath, Upadhyay made it clear what this process of "making Muslims Indian" would require: "we must also change the 30-year old policy of Hindu Muslim unity, which Congress adopted on a wrong basis ... Following the defeat in the 1974 election, Wahengbam Angou Singh came back stronger and won three subsequent elections in 1980, 1984 and 1990 defeating Manipur People's Party candidate Akoijam Ibobi in the 1980 and 1984 elections and AK Langam of MPP in 1990. In the 1980 election, Angou contested as the INC(U) candidate and as INC's candidate in 1984 and 1990. In the 1995 Assembly elec-

tions, Independent candidate AK Langam defeated the sitting MLA Angou to represent the constituency in the State Assembly.

For two consecutive terms, Naoriya Pakhanglakpa sent a woman representative to the Manipur Legislative Assembly, electing Wahengbam Leima Devi in the 2000 and 2002 Assembly elections. In the 2000 Assembly Elections, Leima de feated Akoijam Ibobi of the Samata Party and RK Anand of the Democratic Revolutionary People's Party in the 2002 electio

In the next Assembly election, 2007, RK Anand, contesting on a MPP ticket, defeated Keisham Rojenkumar Singh of the Rashtriya Janata Dal to represent 21-Naoriya Pakhanglakpa in the State Assembly. Anand retained the seat winning the 10th Manipur Assembly Elections, 2012 with INC ticket. He defeated Keisham Rojenkumar Singh of the All India Trinamool Congress again. In the 11th Manipur Legis-

lative Assembly Elections, 2017 Soibam Subhashchandra Singh defeated sitting MLA RK Anand to represent the con-

The number of Absentee voters marked in Electoral Roll for AVSC, AVPD, AVCO are 387,173 and 0 respectively with the total figure coming to around 560 voters.

All stakeholder including absentee voters for postal ballot, candidates and agents are requested to ensure the following guidelines of ECI for categories of electors in order to have a transparent and accountable election in addition to maintaining secrecy of voting and ensuring 100% voting by all absentee voters of the district, as per a notice issued by DEO, Jiribam.

Recently a BJP leader against the backdrop of incident of burning down some Hindu temple in Bangladesh commented India could have annexed Bangladesh in 1971, when India had defeated Pakistan and still if India has the intention it could annex Bangladesh anvtime. There is no reason for not to considering such fact and rethink wisely when there is offer of peace-talks with India.
