Proscribe group the People's Revolutionary Party of Kangleipak (Progressive) observed its 12th progressive day to mark its foundation day at its central Head Quarter General Head Quarter and other Units of the armed group. A statement by media

coordinator of PREPAk (Pro), Lanchenba, said that a two minutes silent was observed by the cadres of the armed group showing honours to the departed souls who had sacrifice for the cause of revolutionary movement as well as those fallen in trap of the enemies. On the occasion the message of the Chairman of the revolutionary group which elaborated , on the impact of the Indian, rule was read out.

Fourteen cadres of the United Tribal Liberation Army (UTLA) (James), including its chairman Tonthang Singsit, laid down their arms and ammunition before the Chief Minister of Manipur, N. Biren Singh today at a Homecoming Ceremony held at the Banquet Hall of 1st Battalion, Manipur Rifles, Imphal.

The surrendered weapons include two KH-33 rifles, one AK rifle one A1 rifle one A2 rifle, three single barrel rifles and three small arms along with one Chinese hand grenade, 18 gelatin sticks, 18 detonators, and assorted ammunition.

Speaking as the Chief Guest of the function, N. Biren Singh stated that violence will not bring any solution and urged all youth who had taken up arms to return to the national mainstream. He also recalled Union

Home Minister Amit Shah's words, in his recent visit to the State, that not a single bullet would be fired on those militants who want to return to their normal lives and join the national mainstream and no FIR would be lodged against them unless they are



involved in a heinous crime Stating that there will be development only when there is peace, the Chief Minister said that in the last five years, the State had witnessed a rapid growth in development in various fields due to improvement in law and order. Manipur would be able to cone with other States only when there is inclusive development irrespective of geographical differences, he added.

He also highlighted that under the revised scheme for Surrender cum Rehabilitation of Militants in the North East State, 2018 of the Union Ministry of Home Affairs, rehabilitation benefits to be

given to the surrendered cadres include a one-time financial grant of Rs. 4 lakhs to each surrendered, which is to be kept in their respective bank accounts as a fixed deposit for a period of three years; monthly stipends of Rs 6000/- per person and incentives for surrendered weapons. Surrendered cadres will stay in a rehabilitation camp for a period of three years where they would be given various vocational training.

Regarding this, the Chief Minister stated that a Screening Committee is working out the identification and rehabilitation of cadres, with ADG/IG Special Branch as Chairman and comprising

various security agencies like Army, Assam Rifles, Central Paramilitary Forces, SIB, State Police, State Administration, etc. Expressing happiness over the steps taken up by the Committee, N. Biren Singh also stated that since 2005, 681 militants were approved for rehabilitation and out of these, 638 persons completed rehabilitation and returned to 638 their normal lives. As of now, 43 persons are undergoing rehabilitation and vocational

The life sentence of Yasin Malik is a turning moment in Indian Political and judicial history. Here is a man who has blood of innocent Kashmiris and several persons on his hands, including 7 Air Force officers. This is a man who till 2014 called the shots in Kashmir and even shook hands with the former Prime Minister.

Malik had been patronized by the left-liberals, the 'progressives'. They kept on shielding him to the last. He was invited to media conferences, seminars as Speaker or Guest of Honour. Any question to him from the audience was rebuffed.

Why should world need to ensure required 'humanitarian assistance' for the Rohingya refugees?

While the Covid-19 epidemic, Myanmar's military coup in February, the Afghan refugee crisis, and now the Ukraine situation have all cast a pall over Bangladesh's Rohingya minority, the community remains in limbo. The funding for the Rohingya is running out, Bangladesh is being made to bear the Burden of the Rohingyas alone. The amount of international aid for the 1.1 million Rohingyas who have taken refuge in Bangladesh has been greatly reduced. If this situation continues, the international organizations are fearing that a terrible catastrophe will come down in the future.

will come down in the future. According to UNHCR, only 13% of the \$881 million annual response plan for the Rohingya has been funded as of this month (May 2022)

According to the source, 921 million USD was expected in the outgoing year, but 635 million USD was received, which is only 69 percent of the demand in 2019. The amount of international aid was further reduced in the next year. That year(2020) the demand has been reported to be 877 million dollars, but required fund was not ensured than that of demanded fund. The international community has been warned that the situation could worsen if demand is not met.

The cost of supporting the Rohingyas is expected to be \$1.21 billion per year, and the cost may rise as their number grows, inflation rises, and international financing declines. The refugees are providing cheap labor and are active in small enterprises in Cox's Bazar, which is driving wages down and reducing job prospects for locals. They also said that the cost of living has gone up for locals.

According to the report, housing the Rohingya for the first five years without repatriation would cost more than \$7 billion. Foreign money for the Rohingyas appears to be dwindling, according to analysts, as only 38% of the \$920 million budget for that year wascommitted. (2021) "Bangladesh's economy is modest. Despite this, it provided refuge to the Rohingyas. The question is how much longer. Only \$366 million of the

Only \$300 million of the anticipated \$1 billion humanitarian assistance fund for the Rohingyas have been disbursed as of July 2021. The payout has dropped to 34%, down from 72 to 75% of the total required flux in the first htree years of the Rohingya influx in 2017. This drop in international donations begs the question, "Has the world forgotten about the Rohingyas? "We can bear the strain."

Funding for Rohingyas from the international community is decreasing day by day. Afghan refugee crisis and now Ukraine crisis has worsened the situation. But international community must remember that Rohingyas are also refugees and they are in Bangladesh yet. This problem is also an international dumanitarian problem as Afghan and Ukraine crisis.

Any long-term solution must take the local and national context into account. However, until then, the flow of humanitarian aid must be ensured since they must meet their fundamental necessities. Any long-term solution must take

While focusing on the "catastrophic disaster" in Ukraine, the UN High Commissioner for Refugees, Filippo Grandi, recently stated even during a visit to Bangladesh that they must not forget about other challenging situations around the world, such as the Rohingya crisis, which require attention and resources.

The Inter-Sector Coordination Group (ISCG), a coordinating body of international organizations, is working for the Rohingya in Cox's Bazar. According to their data, international aid to the Rohingya was rapidly declining. Promised funds are not available. In 2019, only 69 percent of the demand was met. As a result, the Rohingyas who have taken refuge in Bangladesh have had to cut back on many

planned expenses. Many projects taken to improve the living standards of the locals could not be implemented. 635 million was received last year,

635 million was received last year, which was about Tk 540 crore in Bangladeshi currency. The lion's share of this money was spent on food for the Rohngya. They were able to meet 75 per cent of the demand for food, 66 per cent for education, 36 per cent for health and only 35 per cent for nutrition. We are concerned as human

We are concerned as human beings about the declining international aid to the Rohingya. Thus, if the promised funds are reduced every year, there will be a catastrophe in the future. This could lead to clashes between the Rohingyas and the locals. Bangladesh has already warned the international community about this. The Rohingyas who have taken refuge in Bangladesh will be repatriated as soon as possible.

Long-term uncertainty about repatriation may encourage Rohingya refugees to engage in criminal activity. They (Rohingyas) are becoming disgruntled as a result of the prolonged ambiguity surrounding their repatriation, which poses a risk because it tempts many of them to engage in criminal activities.

When Rohingyas discover that there is little support for them, they immediately will devise a plan to make money through human trafficking, prostitution, illegal drug dealing (Yaba), confrontations between host communities and refugees, extortion and theft are all possibilities. The entire region might be thrown off balance. It is true that region may face further destabilization. 'Necessity knows no law,' that is true.

Although international organizations are concerned about the funding of the Rohingya, they have no concern for the locals. Although 25 per cent of the Rohingya fund has been promised for the locals, very little has been spent on them. Last year, LPG was provided as an alternative fuel for 165,000 Rohingya families. Only five thousand local families have been given that facility. Despite the massive environmental catastrophe caused by the Rohingya, there is no international assistance to compensate for this loss. According to the Center for

According to the Center for Policy Dialogue (CPD), a Bangladeshi think tank, Bangladesh must spend roughly \$1.21 billion ach year on Rohingya refugees, a figure that will rise as the population grows, inflation rises, and foreign aid declines. According to the CPD, if repatriation begins, it will take 12 years if 300 Rohingyas are returned daily, assuming current population growth remains unchanged. The CPD estimates that it will cost \$7 billion to house and support Rohingya refugees for the first five years without repatriation. A country like Bangladesh, which relies significantly on external debt to finance its budget deficit, will be unable to afford such a massive outlay.

According to the Cox's Bazar Forest Department, six and a half thousand acres of forest have been occupied for the Rohingyas. The damage to the environment and biodiversity is unimaginable. The nature of the land has changed by cutting down the hills. Divisional Forest Officer

Divisional Forest Officer Humayun Kabir said that trees are being cut down every day to collect firewood for Rohingyas. The green nature of the area is lost. More than 1 million Rohingyas have been living in the area and all activities have been affected. Agricultural land is being destroyed. If it continues like this, this area will be unsuitable for human habitation at some point.

Rohingyas were taking relief materials in the camp. On the other hand, going out of the camp is taking away the labor of the locals. Many Rohingyas are scattered in different places. They are engaged in various professions. If they are not repatriated quickly, the situation will be dire. The locals were unemployed because of the Rohingyas. Although the damage in the area is terrible, there is no international. Some organizations are crying out for the host community with nominal help.

Why is the US getting closer to Bangladesh?

The US is getting closer with Bangladesh day by day. The US wants more engagement with Bangladesh now in the region. Although the two countries' diplomatic ties began on April 4, 1972, when the United States' current focus on Bangladesh reminds us that it desires a strategic partnership with Bangladesh.Both countries have had cordial relations for the past 50 years, strengthening collaboration in areas such as development, climate change, counter-terrorism, democracy, and human rights.

Over the last decade, cooperation in trade, investment, and security, particularly in counter-terrorism strengthened. After 2016, this collaboration grew even further. Bangladeshi items have a large market in the United States. The trade balance between the two countries favors Bangladesh, and the United States is the largest single market for garments produced in Bangladesh. By 2019, bilateral commerce had reached USD 9 billion, with US exports to Bangladesh totaling USD 2.3 billion, up 12 percent from 2018. Meanwhile, Bangladesh exported USD 6.7 billion to the United States, up 9.5% from 2018. The US has made a significant contribution to the vaccine. Bangladesh is the third-largest recipient of US aid in South Asia. The US praised Bangladesh for providing sanctuary to Rohingya refugees, noting that it had not only met its obligation but also continued to provide support and collaboration. The implementation of sanctions by the US has fallen numerous times in the context of such a relationship.

The year 2021 was a trying one for relations between the US and Bangladesh. On December 10, 2021, the United States sanctioned Bangladesh's Rapid Action Battalion (RAB) and numerous current and former officers for a long history of human rights violations, including extrajudicial killings. Bangladesh was not invited to the virtual Summit for Democracy that same month by the Biden administention.

tration. In 2022, the United States produced a report on the situation of human rights in 198 countries. Bangladesh's state department has accused the country of human rights violations.

The US decision to apply sanctions on Bangladesh, which include ideals like democracy and human rights, is considered as a strategic move by the Biden administration in shifting geopolitical objectives and US foreign policy. For different causes, there are ongoing discussions, criticisms, and analyses of US-Bangladesh ties.

Bangladesh held the 8th US-Bangladesh Partnership Dialogue on March 20 2022 after a oneyear hiatus due to the Corona pandemic. The US undersecretary for political affairs, Victoria Nuland, t he third highest ranking person in the US State Depart ment, visited Dhaka on March 19 and participated in the dialogue as the US delegate. The Bangladesh team, on the other hand, was led by Foreign Secretary Masud Bin Momen. Those two delegates came together primarily to strengthen the US Bangladesh 50 y ears bilateral connection and establish a "robust relationship." It is surprising that the United Staes is more interested about Bangladesh and has included it in its strategic calculations today. Though, in the past, the US did not do so, instead classifying Bangladesh as an underdeveloped country similar to Niger and calculating Bangladesh on hu-

manitarian grounds. However, the dialogue took place in two stages at the same location: first, US Under Secretary for Political Affairs Victoria Nuland met with Foreign Secretary MasudMomen; Bangladesh raised US sanctions against Bangladesh's elite force Rapid Action Battalion (RAB), calling them "unjustified," and the US sought Bangladesh's support in the Russia-Ukraine conflict. The primary debate of the dialogue was then commenced in the second stage in order to close the gaps in bilateral ties.

Joe Biden, the US President, stated earlier this year that he believes the Dhaka-Washington relationship will endure for the next 50 years and beyond.

"Our defense cooperation is stronger than ever, 'the US president wrote to Bangladeshi Pirme Minister Sheikh Hasina, adding that the Bangladesh Coast Guard and Navy are vital allies in ensuring a free and open Indo-Pacific region, as well as contributing to the regional fight against human and illicit drug trafficking. On the heels of Russia's inva-

On the heels of Russia's invasion of Ukraine, US Under Sceretary for Political Affairs Victoria Nuland, the third-ranking official at the State Department, said the US wanted to work together with Bangladesh on global security.

"Bangladesh and the US will work together to protect democracy and human rights at a time when Russia is invading Ukraine in the changed world situation and international law and human rights are under threat," Victoria Nuland said at the start of the eighth Partnership Dialogue, which began in 2022 to discuss all aspects of bilateral relations.

Sixth Anniversary of the Ammunition Fire Mishap at CAD Pulgaon Observed

The sixth anniversary of the accidental fire at the Indian Army's Central Ammunition Depot (CAD) located at Pulgaon in Wardha district of Vidarbha region of vidarbha region of Maharashtra, in which 19 people were killed in May 2016, was observed by the CAD administration on Tuesday.

The massive explosions and fire that broke out at shed number 193, which stored 19,325 defective anti-tank mines, led to the deaths of 19 people, in the wee hours of May 31, 2016. The deceased included officers, Defence Security Corps (DSC) jawans, and some contract work ers. An equal number of jawans were injured in the mishap.

In a function organized at Military station on Tuesday, a homage was paid to the nine-teen Bravehearts who made the supreme sacrifice for the nation. On the occasion the next of kin were honoured and provided with financial assistance.

This third passenger train service between New Jalpaiguri (India) - Dhaka (Bangladesh)-Mitali Express which was virtually inaugurated by both the Prime Ministers on 27th March, 2021, was flagged-off virtually by Shri Ashwini Vaishnaw, Minister of Railways of India and Md. Nurul Íslam Sujan, Railway

Minister of Bangladesh, from Rail Bhavan, New Delhi today (i.e. 1st June, 2022). Earlier, this train could not be started due Covid Pandemic restrictions.

Speaking on this occasion, Shri Ashwini Vaishnaw said that Mitali Express, will be yet another milestone in increasing this friendship, in strengthening this bond, in improving this relationship. Dhaka at 21:50 hours on Monday & Thursday and reach New Jalpaiguri at 07:15 hours) and cover a distance of 595 kms from New Jalpaiguri to Dhaka (out of which 61 Kms is Indian portion). Indian Railways LHB coach (like used in Maitree Express) and Bandhan Express) will be used comprising 4 First AC, 4 AC Chair Car and 2 Power cars. There will have three classes -AC First (Cabin) Sleeper, AC First (Cabin) seat and AC Chair car, and the fare will be USD 44, USD 33 and USD 22 respectively. The additional new

Newly appointed US Am-bassador to Dhaka Peter Haas praised Bangladesh's contri-bution in promoting peace and prosperity in the Indo-Pacific region recently, saying the US wishes to work with Bangladesh to achieve their common goals

"Bangladesh and the US have opposing but remarkably similar views for the Indo-Pacific area. "We can - and do collaborate to enhance areas where our visions intersect,' he remarked.

Bangladesh and the United States can "move faster to-gether" in expanding trade and investment connections according to US Ambassador to Bangladesh Peter Haas at an event titled 'US-Bangladesh Business Forum: Building on 50 Years of Friendship' held in Dhaka on May 08, hosted by HSBC Bangladesh, in partner-ship with the US-Bangladesh siness Council (USBBC). During Nuland's visit to

Dhaka, she signed a draft de-fense cooperation agreement, which represents that endeavor. However, Washington may continue to view Dhaka as a regional security partner. The United States now seeks to establish a strategic engagement and relationship with Bangladesh.

The United States' recent increasing attention on democracy and human rights in Bangladesh raises the ques-tion of why the US is taking this action now. There are sev-eral options. One possibility is that United States has a larger role for the country in its Indo-Pacific strategy. Bangladesh favors regional

peace. Bangladesh still believes in the Non-Aligned

Movement's "importance" (NAM). The United States must recognize that Bangladesh is allied with the United States Bangladesh believes the

US sanctions are motivated by geopolitics, while the US claims the Rapid Action Battalion is harming the rule of law, human rights, fundamental freedoms, and economic prosperity of the Bangladeshi people. Finally, the US sanc-tions against Bangladesh are nothing more than a South Asian geopolitical plan. Because of China's overwhelm-ing domination in South Asia, the US will have no friendly states (without India) in the region. Of certainly, Bangladesh will be able to overcome this

diplomatic dilemma and obstacle Bangladesh Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina has asked the United States to consider Bangladesh as a prospective partner for increased trade and investment, claiming that the two nations' trade volume will double. The prime minister made the remarks during a meeting with the US-Bangladesh Business Council's inaugural executive business delegation in Dhaka on May 10 2022

While Bangladesh's top concerns are sanctions and in vestment, the United States wants to ensure its security in the region. The US must main tain its security in the Indo-Pacific area amid the current great power rivalry. In order to accomplish so, the United States plans to sign two defense agreements with Bangladesh: GSOMIA and ACSA. Through these ac-cords, the US hopes to strengthen military time h strengthen military ties by enhancing intelligence sharing and exchanging logistical and

technological support.

Bangladesh should pursue its policies and maintain its soft demands in order to en-hance its 'Mutual Understanding' with America and become a trustworthy ally of the United States. Because the United States is Bangladesh's single largest export market for readymade garments (RMG), accounting for 83 percent of to-tal exports. The United States was also Bangladesh's top source of Foreign Direct Investment (FDI) (\$3.5 billion in total investments as of 2019). Bangladesh should retain "strong connections" with the United States for two reasons: 1) investment and 2) the Rohingya Crisis. In the 8th US-Bangladesh Partnership Dialogue, we noticed that Bangladesh had followed the strategy. According to the most recent data, there are 213,372 Bangladeshis living in

the United States, contributing to the country's economy. Last but not least, through numerous scholarship and study programs, the United States has made important contributions Bangladesh's knowledge

spac Both countries have been showing signs of progress for some time, with Bangladesh establishing human rights cells and sending out human rights reports. At the same time, the US has reaffirmed its commitment to working with Bangladesh to improve the country's human rights situation.

Bangladeshi garments are primarily exported to the United States. Bangladesh supports the United States' Indo-Pacific strategy of freedom and openness. Bangladesh requires the United States for its develop-

ment. It's worth noting that Bangladesh aspires to be a South Asian economic miracle. Its financial success is now commendable. As a result, it is dependent on the United States and the European Union to maintain the current rate of rapid economic growth. Bangladesh is not a threat to the United States Bangladesh is a firm believer in international friendship Bangladesh may be one of the trusted allies with USA in the region.

Indian agriculture blooms beyond expectations

popular and visionary Prime Minister ShriNarendraModi, the nation is reaping a bountiful harvest of all-round efforts made by the Union Ministry of Agriculture and Farmers Welfare in the last eight years. Several innovative initiatives taken by the Ministry in the form of schemes and programmes, in order to ensure the commitment and accountability of the government, have resulted in ushering sweeping reforms in the direction and state of farmers and farming across the country. The livelihood standards of the farmers are improving and agriculturalfinances provided by the Centre are reaching them directly through bank accounts with complete transparency. The allocation of agriculture budget in the current financial year to about Rs 1.32 lakh crore is a reflection of the devotion of the central government towards the welfare of farmers. The budget allocation for agriculture has increased by almost 6 times in the last 8 years. The journey of development in the agriculture sector does not end here. Besides increased allocation, the record production of food grains and horticultural crops is also a proof of the budget allocation being spent in the right direction. According to the Third Advance Estimates for the year 2021-22, the production of food grains is

estimated at about 315 million tonnes, while the production of the horticulture sector is also estimated at 334 million tonnes, which is the highest

Indeed, it is no small matter that in the midst of the challenges of the Covid pandemic, India has supplied food grains to many needy countries and even during the Russia-Ukraine crisis, India has once again emerged as a major source of food grains supply to the world. Not only is the production of food grains showing a steady increase in the country at a record level, but the exports of agriculture produce is also rising continuously, which has reached almost Rs. 4 lakh crore.

Keeping in mind the better remuneration to farmers and their livelihood, the government has continuously increased the Minimum Support Price for Kharif, Rabi and other commercial crops. As a result the MSP of paddy rose to Rs. 1940 per quintal from Rs. 1310 per quintal in 2013-14.Similarly, in the year 2013-14, the MSP of wheat was Rs. 1400 per quintal, which is now rasied to Rs.2015 per quintal.

During the Rabi Marketing Season (RMS) 2021-22, 433.44 Season (KMS) 2021-22, 433.44 lakh MT of wheat was procured by the government at MSP, which is the highest ever. Punjab, Uttar Pradesh, Rajasthan Uttarakhand Gujarat, Himachal Pradesh and Jammu and Kashmir have seen the highest procurement of wheat so far. The success story does not close here,data also reveals that a sum of Rs 85.604.40 crore was credited to 49.19 lakh wheat producing farmers during the RMS directly into their bank accounts in a transparent manner.

Continuing its commitment towards the farmers, the government has credited around Rs 1.82 lakh crore to about 11.5 crore farmers directly into their bank accounts under the PradhanMantriKisanSammanYojana (Total Rs.6,000 per annum in three equal instalments). This

farming undergraduate and postgraduate teaching courses, and chemical-free natural farming is being supported by the ministry and ICAR. Keeping in view the contemporary nature of natural farming, ICAR has issued special guidelines to agricultural universities to include research and allied subjects related to natural farming. Natural farming has been able to increase the income of the farmers and is a symbol of the novel thinking of the Central Government

towards ensuring better living Besides various schemes the and programmes,

dedication of the union government towards the farmers is also reflected in the Rs. 1,00,000 crore allocated for the Agricultural Infrastructure Fund and the government is committed to provide basic facilities like Godowns, Custom Hiring Centres, Primary Processing Units, Sorting and Grading Units and Cold storage. Through these basic facilities, the Government Is committed to provide remunerative prices to farmers for their produce.

In this series, the government, under the AatmaNirbhar Bharat Abhiyan (Self-Reliant India Campaign) is also giving special promotion to the National Beekeeping and Honey Mission.
