Chief Minister N. Biren Singh today opened the 14th Manipur Polo International at Imphal Polo Ground locally Mapal known as Mapal Kangjeibung, which perhaps, is the oldest Polo ground in the world.

The inaugural function of the 14th Manipur Polo International was open in traditional Manipuri style with women in traditional attires presenting edibles in traditional baskets called Phiruk. Chief Minister N. Biren Singh along with other dignitaries including YAS Minister

Govindas Konthoujam, Transport Minister Khashim Vashum, Water Resources Minister Awangbou Newmai, MLA K. Robindro, MLA Thangjam Arunkumar and MLA Shanti all wore white Kokyet (a traditional head-gear) while opening the prestigious events.

Due to the post Covid -19 situation, some countries which used to attend earlier didn't attend. However, five international Polo teams including one from United Stated of America (USA), one team from United Kingdom (UK), India Team A, India Team B (Manipur Polo team) and the Indian Navy Polo team

are taking part this time. Interestingly, audiences

both from aboard and from the state witnessing the inaugu-ral function of the international event organized in connection with the Sangai Tourism festival (this time) were enthralled by authentic per-formers of the Rhythms of Manipur. The Polo Ground (Kangjeibung) was spread with the authentic tune of the 40 lady drummers. And the eye of the audience were all caught in the beautiful traditional dance performances while playing the drums (Langdre) at the same time.

Chief Minister N. Biren Singh, who is also the Chief

Patron of the organizing com-mittee in his speech said that the international polo events will surely help in the initiative taken up by the state gov-

ernment for preserving Pony. He said that , this time the state is organizing traditional pony related games - Sagol Kangjei, a traditional Polo game at the ground located inside the sacred Kangla ford and another Mukna Kangjei at Hapta Kangjeibung.

Women should be empowered to fight back due to end the evil of "Eve Teasing"

Eve-teasing is something that a woman has to contend with everyday. The laughing and passing lewd remarks of an eve teaser can leave a permanent psychological mark on a woman. Eve-teasers feel that they are doing nothing wrong- having some fun. Eve-teasing leads to restrictions on women's mobility. Eveteasing is a typical social crime. where the perpetrators and victims are ordinary people. Women on the other hand are made to feel vulner-

able and the weaker sex. Sexual ha rassment laws hardly contain any recognition of male victims and female perpetrators. Eve-teasing is a crude way of garnering female attention. One must admit that eve-teasing can most certainly be perpetuated easily by its continued glorification in movies. The immeasurable damage to a woman's self-esteem and the subsequent avoidance of public places by single women could hardly take us on the way to achieving gender equality. Innumerable movies show that eve-teasing eventually 'wins' a girl's attention. Changing this behaviour is easier said than done. Bad films with vulgar songs and stars in indecent dresses add grist to the eve-teasers' mill. Many Bollywood movies depict scenes of eve teasing, showing this behavior as a way to win a woman's heart. Others show this as a behavior for men indulge in some fun at a woman's expense of course. In India, every 51 minutes a woman is sexually harassed; every 21 minutes one woman is molested.

One should bear in mind that it is not only men responsible for this to some extent women are also responsible. Over 30% of the women surveyed said they would not go to a local doctor or health centre alone. Anecdotally, many doctors said that mothers wait too long to bring a sick child to a health centre; they wait until their husbands come home. Men are raised to believe that they are more powerful-physically and emotionally than women. They feel that they are doing nothing wrong- having some fun. Women on the other hand are made to feel vulnerable and the weaker sex

A little bit of courage by girls can set right all the things. We all today just say big things, women liberation, women empowerment, women equaljust say big things, women liberation, women empowerment, women equa-ity etc but everything said and done nothing. Eve teasers need to be whipped then and there. Until then, the problem will persist. It is the joint need to change ourselves. Redefine our moral Code of Conduct. Efforts to prevent and eliminate violence against women should have high priority by way of implementing various measures. Laws against ever cleasing and sexual harassment are necessary but not sufficient to address this chal-lenge. Women must realise that it is not "their fault" that such crimes occur. "Often we are made to feel ashamed, and therefore made to maintain silence when we do face abuse. Young women must be prepared to reclaim their lives from harassment and young men must be taught to take pride in a masculinity that stands in solidarity with women. Parents should treat their sons and daughters on equal footing - no privileges for boys. The change begins at homes where the parents must teach their sons to respect women. We must educate our sons. We must tell our daughters not to keep mum about these issues. They should be vociferous and definitely learn selfdefence. The best solution is that women themselves give a befitting reply to these eve-teasers. Sexual harassment is a serious issue that has long been ignored and treated with complacency. Every human being has the right to live with dignity and respect.

US resolution on '1971 **Bangladesh geocide**'

By: Mashrur Stoudge Bhulyan It is past time that the atrocities committed against Bangladesh by Paki-stan in 1971 get universal acknowledgment. While genocides from Armenia to Rwanda are read, analyzed, and debated around the world, the horrifying genocide in Bangladesh is regrettably seldom everdenounced or even brought up. A resolution urging the US President to recognize the atrocities com-mitted against ethnic Bengalis and Hindus by the armed forces of Pakistan

in 1971 as a genocide was initially introduced on October 15 by Congress-men Steve Chabot and Ro Khanna, both of Indian descent.

The US House of Representatives' resolution unequivocally demands that Pakistan apologize to Bangladesh for the atrocities. The horrifying genocide in Bangladesh was started in 1971 by the Paki-

stani army under the cover of Operation Searchlight. Numerous Bangladeshis were ruthlessly murdered, and tens of thousands of Bengalis also perished.

During the massacre, the Pakistani Army attacked academics, univer-sity students, teachers, and members of the Hindu community. The Pakistani military elite was certain that it could brutally put down the Bengali nationalist movement. But with India's assistance, East Pakistan managed to free itself.

The events that occurred in Bangladesh in 1971 should be classified as genocide under the 1948 UN Convention on the Convention and Punishment of the Crime of Genocide (CPPCG). There have been more than 50 years. The genocide committed by Pakistan in East Pakistan (Bangladesh) has not been acknowledged as such by Washington or the UN

For obvious reasons, the US has not focused on the genocide commit-ted in East Pakistan (Bangladesh) by the country's former ruler, West Pakistan. The US authorities were told by Archer Blood, the country's ambassador to India at the time, but because Pakistan was a Cold War ally, the US declined to comment.

Manipur Government: need to nurture public trust

By now it is fairly well-established that the present government of Manipur is fairly competent in propaganda functioning, and mani-festing display of activism but rather weak in policy framing. The Sangai Festival is as good as it is, but only in so far as it relates to the manifest display of presence of beauty and not beyond.

Recently, we have had two re-ports emanating from the characteristic display of the power of youths of Manipur. Some youths have recently proved again the inherent competence in traditional and non-traditional sports in events within and outside the State. Further there have been reports of surrendering by a few insurgents to the provincial govern-

Before we examine the implications of these two behaviourally different events, let me put in assertive terms that any government anywhere can serve the purpose of prosperity of the land and people only if it commands trust of the people. Let me also hasten to add that commanding trust of the people is not something which falls from the sky, but necessitates continuous cultivation and sus-tained support from the populace. While it would be countered by the government of the day, a social tragedy of Manipur today is that the public expectations for positive and significant outcomes from the interventions of the govern-ment are rather low. In other words, the primary objective of the government is cultivation of the trust of the public and sustain it in a robust way. Once it is achieved, the consequential outcomes of gov-ernment interventions would be forever evolving in a positive way This is missing. As stated above, the charac-

teristic behavioural implications of the two recent events are very different. The Sangai Festival would play a lovely role in enhancing the spirits of the people immediately after the recent harvest period. But beyond this we would be looking forward how the governance tries to evolve this as an Annual Event with long term policy components for Environment such that the positive implications keep enhancing over time. This would go in enhancing the Trust of the people on the government.

Given the socio-politico-eco-nomic scenario of Manipur over the last half a century or so, the implications of the recent event of some insurgents giving up arms and surrendering to the govern-ment are much more than any other event. Well, it is a different matter that there are already ridicules of the Surrender Ceremony from two organisations, the PREPAK and the KYKL;I would not like to comment on this.

The biggest challenge for any society is to harness the energy of the contemporary youth such that their own future is ensured but the peace of the society is established in a sustained way. There is no better option than this to forever guarantee the sustainability of peace and stable growth of the society. This is the best means to harness the Public Trust of the Government. But this again is something which does not emerge spontaneously; it requires a committed and structured approach.

This is exactly where we have a major problem with the displayed attitude of the government on the surrendered. Such occasions have been there in the past too, but have not yet had the desired impacts. The approach of the government to the problem of insurgency and the insurgents rather looked very casual. Of course, there was an appeal to take advantage of the government schemes and join the mainstream – wish the issue were as simple as this makes look like. Youths are the backbone and

the future of any society. Such events should have been taken as the opportunity to launch a Youth Policy. Besides, the youths join-ing Insurgency, there have been many critical issues relating to our sports girls and boys. Building the Public Trust of the government through a Youth Policy is the most sustainable and healthy approach.

The Rehabilitation and Resettlement of surrendered youths in a region with more than half-acentury of insurgency can never be a casual affair. To begin with, please see as to how things are done across the world. First of all, it is fundamental that a framework for psychological assessment and continuous psychological moni-toring for at least half a decade of the youths is fundamental. For this the government must have a team of Clinical Psychologists and Psy-chotherapists for undertaking the needful; it is something which can never be fulfilled by the government bureaucrats - security or otherwise

But now it cannot be that the team of Psychologists should be maintained for the phenomenon of surrender which happens only once in a while. But the imperative for youths to be forever given the care and guidance is paramount. This is where there is the NEED for a Youth Policy for Manipur. This youth policy should be nec-essarily multi-dimensional covering Education, Health, Employment, Sports and anything where the youths have interest, and the friendly intervention of the Psychologists. The present scenario is so depressing that the youths have started making themselves available for mobilisation and indulgence in activities instigated by a few political leaders – this cre-ates an atmosphere of pseudo satisfaction to the youths as being closed to the political powers of the day while their little expenses are borne by the political players. What we should be looking for is a world where there is decreasing scope for this and decline in frag-mentation of youths in the contemporary world. The present world of youths is captured by this phenomenon of "fragmentization" where everyone tries to be differ-ent without leaving the crowd. Further there has now emerged the stage of adolescence instead of the earlier transition from childhood to adulthood.

The Youth Policy would not be effective and fully meaningful un-less it is framed within a larger framework of Social Policy. The Social Policy would address gen-erational issues, while also taking care of economic, political, demo-graphic, ethnicity and historical issues that plaque the polity of Manipur. Given the current capa-bility and orientation of the government of Manipur, she cannot on her own frame such a policy. The provincial government should have the commitment to address the long-term issues of the State by hiring and constituting a Team of Experts for framing a Social Policy for Manipur. The present casual approach to long term is-sues and manifest strength in casual display of commitment in organising eye-catching events would not serve the need for evolving Public Trust; without Public Trust, the government can achieve little.

The bloodshed was just overlooked by President Nixon. Henry Kissinger, a former secretary of state, criticized the development as im-moral, but the US administration decided not to label the slaughter as genocidal.

The Republican lawmaker who introduced the resolution in Congress, Steve Chabot, tweeted, "The Bangladesh Genocide of 1971 must not be forgotten. and T @RepRoKhanna filed legislation to recognize that the widespread atrocities committed against Bengalis and Hindus in particular were in fact a genocide with assistance from my Hindu neighbors in Ohio's First District.

The remembrance of the millions that were killed must not be lost to time. By acknowledging the genocide, we may improve the histori-cal record, inform our fellow citizens, and send a message to future offenders that their actions will not be accepted or forgotten, Chabot continued.

"Proud to join @RepSteveChabot in introjoin ducing the first resolution com-memorating the 1971 Bengali Genocide," tweeted Khanna, a Democrat candidate for the US House from California's 17th congressional district. "Millions of ethnic Bengalis and Hindus were killed or displaced in one of the most forgotten

genocides of our time." According to the resolution submitted by the pair, the US-based NGOs Genocide Watch and Lemkin Institute for Genocide Prevention have urged that the atrocities committed by Pakistani forces be recognized as genocide on a worldwide scale.

Even now, the genocides and holocausts occurring elsewhere are fiercely denounced and chastised, mostly because the US and other major nations promptly recognized them and made them well-known. The country that makes the

largest contributions to UN peacekeeping missions and other international endeavors is still waiting for justice more

than 50 years later. The American congressmen have made a significant move that merits praise, but Dhaka needs to do

more to advance it It is crucial that both the US and UN acknowledge the atrocity. Bangladesh will demand an apology and compensation from Pakistan's obstinate military government once they have acknowledged it. Bangladesh should now draw attention from through-

out the world by pursuing justice. Islamabad has tried to improve relations with Dhaka in recent years, but neither side has offered an apology. Ac-cording to the military establishment in Rawalpindi, they can get away with having this mindset. Bangladesh battled for freedom and is still fight-ing for justice. Dhaka has un-

The apprehended ladies are being interrogated to gather fur ther details about the local and kingpins based in offshore coun-tries. Further investigation is underway. The raid was con-ducted under guidance of NCB's Mumbai Zonal Director Amit Ghawte.

The seizure of the consignment is considered as a notable achievement, since the local drug trafficking circuits are keen on supplying party drugs in the upcoming festive season in Mumbai, Goa and nearby areas, he officials said.

Indonesia earthquake: Toll

rises to 162, over 13,000 taken to evacuation centres

Agency Jakarta, Nov 22:

The toll in the 5.6-magnitude earthquake in Indonesia has risen to 162, the Associated Press reported on Tuesday, citing governor of the West Java

province Ridwan Kamil. Rescuers are still searching for the bodies

The epicentre of the earthquake was the Cianiur region in the country's West Java prov-ince and the tremors took place at a shallow depth of 10 kilometres, according to data from the United States Geological Survey. Kamil said that authorities

believe that the number of deaths and injuries may rise, as many persons remained trapped at various places, AFP reported. 'You can see it yourself, some got their heads, feet are sewn outdoors," he said. "Some got stressed and started crving. The governor said that over

13,000 persons whose homes suffered heavy damage were taken to evacuation centres.

The chief of Cianjur's local ninistration Herman administration Herman Suherman said that most of the fatalities were counted at one hospital. He added that most of the victims were killed in the ru-ins of collapsed buildings.

Suberman said that the Sayang hospital in West Java had no electricity after the earthquake, due to which doctors were unable to immediately operate on injured persons. In some places, emergency workers treated injured persons on stretchers and blankets outside hospitals.

Some of the injured persons were given oxygen masks and intravenous lines. The earthquake also caused

panic in the capital city of Jakarta, where some high-rise buildings swayed and residents rushed outside.

The United Kingdom's

Prime Minister, Rishi Sunak, said that he was shocked by the devastation in Indonesia.

"Just last week, I experienced first-hand the warmth, generosity and kindness of the Indonesian people," he said. "My thoughts are with them now."

The United States' Secretary of State Antony Blinken expressed the country's "heartfelt condolences to the affected communities during this difficult time"

In 2004, a 9.1-magnitude earthquake had hit the coast of Sumatra, triggering a tsunami that killed around 2.2 lakh people in the area. Around 1.7 lakhs died in Indonesia. In 2018, a 7.5-magnitude earthquake, followed by a tsunami, in Indonesia's Sulawesi island had left over 4,300 people dead or

missing. In 2021, a magnitude 6.2 earthquake killed more than 100 people and injured nearly 6,500 in West Sulawesi province.
