In the continuous probe regarding the misuse of funds in various State government departments, an Imphal Times special investigation has unmasked large-scale irregulari-ties, manipulation, and misappropriation of the fund while mplementing the Center's flagship program, "Saubhagya" to the tune of over Rs 200 crores in Manipur.

Team Imphal Times has been investigating the alleged irregularities in implementing PM Modi's ambitious schem SAUBHAGYA and the alleged misappropriation of funds by the MSPDCL (Manipur State Power Distribution Company Ltd.) using sources from vari-ous authorities and finally by seeking information under the Right to Information Act, 2005

As per our sources and the documents procured through the RTI Act 2005, it is learned that the work orders for implementing the schemes under SAUBHAGAYA have been awarded to 4 (four) firms for

the 9 districts of Manipur. An amount of Rs. 9,13,18,081 (Nine crores thirteen lakhs eighteen thousand

Generally ACSR Conductors are dispatched in Packed Drum with an average length of about 3 km. Receive of the exact quantity as in the estimation is very much doubt full length of conductor as summation of the length of the drums will never tally with the estimated figure. Likewise record receipt of A B Cable as in the estimation suggests table measurement. Thus in the absence of

documentary proof there is scope for manipulation in the supply for the above items.

Moreover the Measurement Books submitted does not follow CPWD manuals and no record of payment is reflected in the MBs. No in-surance policy for the materials on transit is attached in the transport challan and claim for insurance should have been out rightly rejected. The LOA does not have scope for supply consumer service materi-als. Hence claim for single phase service connection as per REC Specification cannot be verified.

Rajasthan CMAshok Gehlot has rightly said that It's a moment of pride that Mallikarjun Kharge became Congress President, he is an experienced leader. Congress will strengthen under his leadership, and our party is united across the country. Kharge's biggest opportunity came in 2014 when the Congress suffered a humiliating defeat and was reduced to just 44 members in the Lok Sabha. Kharge, who won from Gulbarga for the second time, was made leader of the Congress in the Lok Sabha.



Founded in 1885, the Congress led the country to freedom from British colonial rule. It has dominated India's post-independence politics, ruling the country for 54 of the past 70 years, either on its own or as the leader of coalition governments. In the process the party has failed to reform its organization or tackle issues related to its functioning and leadership that may have contributed to its decline and fall. In 1993 when Ajitsingh with his followers joined the party, it became a majority government under P.V. Narsimaha Rao. This single dominant party system has done some good to the country. It was due to this that political stability came in the country, which otherwise the nation would have lost. But at the same time the Congress-men took it for granted that India was for them to be governed and this created many problems as well.

The Congress's failure to project a suitable chief ministerial candidate in most of the elections must have harmed its prospects. The results in different states are a lesson for the Congress Party, it is on a steady decline in the country's political arena. The Congress is surely losing its power base across the country, and for good reason. The results are a lesson for the Congress Party; it is on a steady decline in the country's political arena. The Congress' revival pivots on its ability to address its crisis of credibility, encouraging State leaders, and functioning as a vigorous Opposition in Parliament. He was Leader of the Opposition in 1996-99 and 2008-09, and president of the state Congress from 2005-08, before he moved to national politics in 2009, when he entered the Lok Sabha for the first time. residential election was out. When was out, the dominant question crept into my mind was about the next possible move by Shashi Tharoor. But he, unlike his G-23 compatriots, decided to march in tune with the party high-command's dictums. And that was brilliant. The presidential election in the Con-gress party has been a moment that blessed all the insiders of the party to once again conveniently lean on to show their depth of servitude to the party dynasty. And Shashi Tharoor for definitive reasons would be an outsider even if he is inside the party and strictly be alienated among the leaders in the Congress for his audacity to remain intelligently independent when others, the loyalists are bliss-ful to think the way they are directed to think by the family high command. A well qualified, well read and well-known Tharoor has come out with a decent phraseol-ogy saying that 'the revival of the party has truly begun.' But the of-ficially unofficial presidential candidate of the Congress party will remain eclipsed and indignantly undermined, if he continued in his present party. The ripple of politi-cal movements the Congress has presently come up with has seriously made the party once again a well meaningful subject of political discourse even though it is out of power. Electing an octogenarian as its new president from outside the Gandhi family, the eligible votary in e party has indirectly endorsed its reluctance to give the grand old

party a chance to metamorphose into a fresh avatar under a younger and telligent Tharoor. Tharoor could not win the presidency but his candidature should be seen as an announcement of an open dissent that has been visible

and the effect of a quest that some of the insiders of the party cherished while plotting their rebellion. Tharoor may change his mind and prefer a decent exit from Congress before the general elections ap-proach as he claimed that the entire electoral endeavour for the presidential election was stage-managed and sheepishly rigged. Though his candidacy was a public display of democratic disagreement inside the party, the leadership of the party projected this as an act of amiability and freedom rather than anarchy and acrimony in its democratic structure The essential eligibility irrespective of his old age, Mr. Kharge was supported for was his family prox-

imity that the party family endorsed and staged the election drama for. Being powerful without any power in the party, Rahul Gandhi has consistently maintained his dominance in Congress. His longest walk in-tended to recapture the lost glory of the party has fundamentally added e complexity that the Congress establishment is. An intelligent manoeuvre to stay away from the po-tential pitfalls such as the future political debacles; he has once again managed to stay in limelight without any visible responsibility. The party with its behavioural ethos to stay under the protective shadow of a family has almost lost its eminence since 2014. The storm that had shattered its hopes and dreams must be giving nightmares to the Con-gress even today. The Modi factor, the winning strategy that the BJP is banking on, had been a profound hindrance for the Congress from

gaining influence. The Bharat Jodo Yatra by Rahul Gandhi and the coronation of Mallikarjun Kharge, a family loyal-ist as the President of the party,

gives the Congress a chance to set up a parallel party structure that the BJP enjoys. There, it is Narendra Modi the supreme leader and a party president probably taking his or-ders. This can also be seen as an overall experiment put in place well before the general elections 2024, in which, if consensus could be built to project a new Rahul Gandhi, to-tally reinvigorated after the yatra, emerging with a well knitted acceptance across party lines as a serious contender to Modi. The BJP must be counting this as a win-win situa-tion. The Tharoor factor being tion. The Tharoor factor being crumbled from becoming instrumental in the Congress party's constitu-tionally structural build-up, the new elected president does not seem to have the mettle to bring about an increased vigour among its cadre; the only personality who would at-tempt to flex his muscles to take on the Modi juggernaut is Rahul Gandhi alone. Walking through the entire stretch of the dryness of his political career, as a leader, the Rahul factor is all set

In case of his party's losing mandate in the upcoming state elec-tions, his reformer's image and saviour's prerogatives would crumble

Advocate Kapil Sibal, representing the petitioner, said

that action needed to be taken against those making hate speeches or engaging in hate crimes, according to PTI.

A bench comprising Jus-tices Ajay Rastogi and CT Ravikumar, however, remarked that the petition was vague and that cognisance could be taken of individual cases where first information reports were filed.

Sibal, however, said that the petition is precise as it had listed several incidents. He said that many petitions have been filed in court to stop such crimes, but they still take place.

The court tagged the mat-ter along with other petitions

on the same subject that were pending before another bench. Abdullah said in her plea

that the Muslim community was being targeted by the ruling party members, who have delivered hate speeches on many occasions.

"The spread of hate to-wards Muslims and other minorities gets accelerated and becomes all the more farreaching in its impact as a result of the support, directly or indirectly, extended to radical miscreants, who engage in acts of hate crimes, physical violence as well as communally charged speeches by the ruling political party," the

petition said

Abdullah cited examples of news channels progammes in which Muslims were demonised and examples of speeches calling for genocide and the economic and social boycott of the community. The plea said that no action is taken against individuals or organisations that engage in such hate speech. "In most cases, minimal

action of merely registering FIRs and that too under lesser offences, is the only thing that is done by the authori-ties which seems to be more of a formality than any genuine initiation of the criminal machinery," the petition said.
