Wolring Principal Anallon Christian Higher Secondary School Chandel as Guest of honour respectively. The Observance was attended by 100 students of class XI and XII alongwith teachers of the

Demand for separate State in Tribal belt of **Bengal revives again**

Trinamool Congress suspicious about BJP support to these groups By: Ashis Biswas

Ever since underground leader Jiban Singha of the banned Kamtapur Liberation Organisation (KLO) reiterated the call for a separate state, there have been signs of a resumption of activity on part of its activists in Assam and North Bengal. Northeast India media re-

ported the arrest of two KLO ac-tivists from Kokrajhar, Assam, some days ago. Allegedly they were trying to resume their extortion-related activities and had asked for money from a local busi-nessman who complained to the police. The reports did not make it clear whether the activists were collecting money on behalf of the proposed Kamtapur state as per the old KLO demand or functioning on their own. Despite reports of internal divisions and a shift on part of some of its cadres to other groups, the KLO has not yet ceased functioning totally, reduced as it has become

Sources said the choice of Kokrajhar town, a major commercial/administrative centre of the tribal Bodoland autonomous area, was significant. Presumably KLO operatives sought to exploit the traditional distrust between majority Assamiyas and minority Bodo tribes people in an ethnically sensitive region.

Whether in Assam or North Bengal, the general perception is that the KLO has ceased to be a serious secessionist organisation along with the ULFA in recent The covid-related death some time ago of its former leader Atul Roy had affected cadre mo-rale. However, a recently released video apparently by the KLO, showed KLO renewing call for an independent state. It went viral but did not evoke much re-

sponse from established political parties In it KLO strongly attacked West Bengal Chief Minister Mamata Banerjee who firmly op-posed all demands to partition West Bengal, whether by the Gorkhas or other ethnic groups. KLO reminded the Chief Minister of Coochbehar's 'independent' status even as India was being partitioned in 1947. It never formed part of West Bengal, he in-

sisted. However, security analysts did not ignore one part of KLO state-ment, wherein he claimed that his organisation had now settled its ideological differences with the greater Coochbehar Peoples As-sociation (GCPA). Now the movement for a greater separate Coochbehar state, to be carved out of existing districts in Central/ north Bengal and Southern Assam, would be resumed with the total support of the leading ethnic group of the region as a whole—the Rajbonshis.

While political leaders/parties Assam did not comment on KLO statement, they took the views expressed by veteran north Bengal-based leader Mr. Ananta Ray, more seriously. Speaking in-dependently of KLO chief re-cently, the GCPA leader whose mass following is known to be greater than others, re-endorsed the call for a separate Coochbehar state. He did not refer to the KLO.

However, observers said it could not have been a coincidence that the two non-mainstream political leaders would speak out stressing their similar tribal loyalties and demands at about the same time without prior coordination

Evidence of this came from Assam leaders and groups expressing their firm rejection for the statehood demand for Coochbehar state. In video re-leases and extensive messaging on the social media, they dismissed Mr Ray as a self-styled leader based in North Bengal, with the implication that he did not enjoy much support in Assam. Other sources however, found

Mr Ray's views and claims more intriguing. He said categorically that union Home Minister Mr Amit Shah was fully apprised of exist-ing ethnic/tribal sentiments in the sensitive Assam-North Bengal border regions and adjacent dis-tricts. Mr Shah, he claimed, had promised a sympathetic consider-ation of long pending Rajbonshi political demands seeking greater fairness and justice, as a marginalised community.

Assam-based politicians did not comment on this part of Mr Ray's observations. There was, however, a stronger reaction from West Bengal Trinamool Congress (TMC) leader Udayan Guha based in Coochbehar itself.

Strongly attacking KLO chief for his views, Guha, often de-scribed by his political opponents as a local 'Bahubali', said people like Singha did not have any support at all in North Bengal or elsewhere. If he or his followers tried to create trouble and unrest, the state Government and common people would decisively 'crush' them.

Singha retaliated pointing out that Guha was an 'outsider' in a Raibonshi-dominated area and only tribal permission had enabled him to settle in Coochbehar. Guha retorted that he had been living

in the district for four generations and did not need anyone's confirmatory certification.

Present indications suggest that the tensions and agitations of ethnicity-based politics and the familiar agitational approach adopted by most local groups to highlight their old grievances in the North Bengal -Assam region, were not over yet.

Again, whether in Assam or West Bengal, no political leader could speak with any certainty as to the role of the BJP-ruled Cen-tral Government in the present situation. While the BJP had earlier supported the formation of smaller, separate states on the ground of effective governance, it had never categorically approved of the demand for a separate Gorkhaland, raising a number of questions on the issue. Nor had the BJP at the national level given any indication that the creation of a separate state of Coochbehar carved out of Assam and West Bengal, was being consid-

ered seriously. However, the party has given its general approval to the idea of a separate North Bengal state within West Bengal at the state party level, annoying the ruling TMC no end.

As matters stand, the new Coochbehar state would include parts of Malda, Murshidabad, Dinajpur, Darjeeling and other ar-eas in West Bengal, along with parts of Goalpara, Dhubri, Bongaigaon, Bodoland, Chirang and other territories in Assam. At different times during earlier cen-turies, the independent kingdom of Coochbehar did rule over many of these and other territories, ac-cording to observers. (IPA Service)

Lt General Anil Chauhan appointed new Chief of Defence Staff

The Defence Ministry announced that Lt General Anil Chauhan (Retired) has been appointed as the next Chief of Defence Staff (CDS) and he will also function as Secretary to the Government of India in the Department of Military Affairs, on Wednesday. CDS

The mandate of the CDS, as the primary military advisor to the government, includes acting as a link among the armed forces, creating inte-grated theatre commands, and prioritizing capital acquisition for the modernization of forces It was created as a dual role since the CDS was also appointed as Secretary of the Department of Military Affairs. It was touted as one of the most significant reforms in the top echelons of the military. with Prime Minister Narendra Modi announcing the creation of the post during his Indepen-dence Day speech in 2019.

The post of CDS fell va-cant on December 08, 2021, after the sudden demise of General Bipin Rawat in a helicopter crash in Tamil Nadu on December 8, 2021. In the air crash, Rawat, his wife, and dozen oth-



ers were killed. India was left without a CDS since then. Appointed on December 31, 2019, Rawat was to have a three-year tenure until the end of this year. Lt Gen becomes the second CDS of the country.

Lt Gen Chauhan retired as the General Officer Command-ing in Chief (GOC-in-C) of Eastern Command in May 2021. In a career spanning over 40 years. Lt Gen he held several command, staff, and instru-mental appointments and had extensive experience in counter-insurgency operations in Jammu and Kashmir and North-East India Born on May 18, 1961 in

India records 4,272 Covid cases in a day; death toll rises to 5,28,611

India's Covid-19 case tally increased by 4,272 in a day to reach 4,45,83,360, while active cases have declined to 40,750 according to Union Health Ministry data updated on Thursday.

The death toll has reached 5,28,611 with 27 more deaths, including 16 fatalities recon-ciled by Kerala, the data updated at 8 am stated.

Active cases comprise 0.09 per cent of the total infections, while the national Covid-19 recovery rate has increased to 98.72 per cent, the health minder the nationwide Covid-19 istry said.

The daily positivity rate was recorded at 1.35 per cent while the weekly positivity rate was 1.51 per cent.

Active Covid cases declined by 229 in a day while the number of people who recuperated from the disease in-creased to 4,40,13,999. The case fatality rate was recorded at 1.19 per cent. According to the ministry,

Three arrested on charges of illegal sale of PACL's property in Karnataka

IT Correspondent Mumbai, Sept 29:

Three people including a lawyer, were arrested last week on charges of selling the at-tached property of the Pearls Agrotech Corporation Limited (PACL), based on fake docu-ments in southern Bengaluru in Karnataka state. The names of the arrested

were given as Manjunath, a lawyer, and real-estate agents Chandramohan and Prithvin. They have been booked under the Indian Penal Code section 420 (cheating) and the Prevention of Corruption 1988 by the Hebbagodi police and re-manded to police custody. The accused illegally sold

the 12 30-acre land parcel in "M Medahalli", located un Anekal taluka, in Bengaluru district, with fake documents. The gang involved in this clandestine deal included the arrested accused a sub-registrar, the brother of a police inspector, and others, official sources said.

As a sequel to the arrest of the three accused, the police searched the house of Praveen (the Police inspector's brother) at Basavanapura. The searches were also carried out at the residences and offices of other sus pects in Nagashettihalli and . Viiinapura.

In addition, separate teams headed by Deputy Superinten-dent of Police (Anekal subdivision) Lakshmi Narayan also searched six places belonging to the absconding suspects in the hope of finding documents

related to the illegal land sale. Over a dozen land parcels located at Bengaluru (Urban) North and Benhaluru, Devanhalli in Bengaluru (rural) belonging to PACL, have been

listed for the auction sale by the Justice R M Lodha Committee (set up by the SEBI as per the Supreme Court's direction on February 02, 2016) to sell and

recover duped investors' money. The Securities and Exchange Board of India (SEBI) had notified the public that a fake authority letter (Ref. No. JRMLC/PACL/3442/2022 dated June 16) in the name of R M Lodha Committee/SEBI, authorizing one Harvinder SEB, adult-rizing one Harvinder Singh Bhangoo (Voter ID No. TJU9584804) to sell the PACL properties in Karnataka is in circulation. The SEBI had clarified that the Committee has not authorized any individual/ entity to sell/ dispose of the proper-ties of PACL Ltd, cautioning

public at large. The Lodha Committee is entrusted with the task of selling PACL's 27,138 properties spread across India to refund the money to over 5 50 crore investors, duped through an illegal collective investment scheme by Nirmal Singh Bhangoo and 16 others. One of the accused Kanwalijt Toor died in custody in January this year. Under the scheme, the PACL offered the land at a cheaper rate to investors although the company did not possess even an inch.

Till now the committee has been able to refund Rs.831.78 crore to 18.43 lakh investors. The refundable amount which was in the region of Rs. 49,100 crores earlier, has now swelled up to Rs 60,000 crore with accumulated interest.

Despite a ban on the sale of properties (except through auction by the Lodha Committee) the reports of the properties be-ing sold clandestinely by the people connected with prime

accused Nirmal Singh Bhangoo continue to surface. One such property located at Juhu in North West Mumbai was sold to a third party early this year.

The boards declaring the attachment of the property are not displayed at the site and no public notice is given. Some of the other properties located in Maharashtra have also been sold clandestinely, Vishal Mhetre, Secretary of the Janhit Association said.

Kerala HC asks PFI to deposit Rs 5 crore for damaging public properties during its post-raid protest

Agency New Delhi, Sept 29:

The Kerala High Court on Thursday directed the nowbanned Popular Front of India (PFI) and its state general secretary Abdul Sathar to deposit over Rs five crore for the damages caused to public properties during its protest in the state last week. The PFI members held pro-

tests across Kerala on September 23, a day after nationwide searches were conducted against the outfit by multi-agency teams led by NIA and over 100 leaders and activists of the group were arrested.

The HC asked the PFI's Kerala general secretary to deposit Rs 5.20 crore towards

the damages estimated by the state as well as Kerala State Road Transport Corporation as arising from the destruction caused to public property fol-lowing the PFI protests across Kerala. The amount has to be de-

posited with the Additional Chief Secretary, Home Depart-

ment within two weeks. The court directed the state government to invoke the provisions of the Revenue Recovery Act if the amount is not deposited within two weeks and to take immediate steps to proceed against the assets of the PFI along with personal assets of its office bearers including the Secretary for the realisation of the deposit amount.

On September 22, the Na-tional Investigation Agency (NIA)-led multi-agency teams arrested 106 leaders and activists of the PFI in 15 states for allegedly supporting terror ac-tivities in the country. The NIA is investigating 19 cases in-volving the PFI.

Days after the raids, the Central government declared the Islamic group and its as-sociates or affiliates or fronts as an unlawful association for

five years. The Union Home Ministry, in a late Tuesday night notification, said that PFI and its associates and affiliates found to have been involved in serious offences, including "terrorism, its financing, targeted gruesome killings, dis-

regarding Constitutional set up of India, disturbing public order etc. prejudicial to India's integrity, security, sovereignty." The ministry said there had

been several instances of in-ternational linkages of PFI with global terrorist groups such as the Islamic State of Iraq and Syria (ISIS).

The PFI, the notification alleged, is encouraging and trying to enforce a terror-based regressive regime, continue to propagate anti-national sentiments and radicalising a particular section of society to create disaffection against the country, aggravating activities which are detrimental to the integrity, security and sover-eignty of the country.

Thus far, education has been about imparting knowl-edge in standalone subjects. NEP talks about integration of curriculum, for which just adding few chapters on the valour of brave Indian soldiers is not enough. Educators need to corelate these new chapters in History with other subjects such as Geography, Mathematics, Science and even English. Students should be made to under-stand that the additional chapters will not just be about new names they need to memorise but will act as a basis to understand various concepts across subjects.

Education needs to move beyond textbooks, which should be connected with reality. CBSE has recently adopted a competency-based curriculum, the aim of which is to help students connect their course with real life. Adding chapters on the lives of brave Indian soldiers

will increase students' interest in subjects such as History. However, educators should ask students to draw upon their understanding of the chapters and elaborate upon the strategies, events, possible alternatives, and results to enhance learning.

Will benefit students While changing the cur-riculum, educators must consider whether the change will benefit students' attitude, aptitude, and values. Adding chapters on brave Indian sol-diers ticks all these boxes. Rani Laxmibai's story has always been a much-loved chapter in History. Adding chapters on the lives of other Indian soldiers will also be well-received. This will impart

a more wholesome view on a

topic like the Armed Forces which has little clarity till date

Need to rewrite textbooks For any school, helping students attain academic ex-cellence is the ultimate objective. While adding chapters on brave Indian soldiers seems like a good idea, this would mean a lot of added work for educators as this material will have to be integrated in History textbooks without affecting the quality of academics. An example would be that we educate students on the two World Wars, but there is never any mention of the Indian contingents who were also a part of ese wars. It is time to instil pride in our History by rewrit-

ing textbooks.
